THE ROAD TO 500 HOME RUNS

Historical Perspective

■ Jim Thome is attempting to become the 23rd player in major-league history (third in 2007) to hit 500 home runs and the 10th left-handed batter ... some facts as Thome approaches the historic milestone:

■ Among the 16 eligible players with 500 home runs, 15 are in the Hall of Fame ... Mark McGwire, who was first-time eligible on the 2007 ballot, is the exception.

■ Thome is in line to become the 11th member of the 500 club with at least a .280 batting average and 1,400 walks ... Barry Bonds, Hank Aaron, Babe Ruth, Willie Mays, Frank Robinson, Mickey Mantle, Jimmie Foxx, Ted Williams, Mel Ott and Frank Thomas are the others in that elite group.

■ His ratio of one home run every 13.64 at-bats ranks fourth in major-league history, trailing only Mark McGwire (10.61), Babe Ruth (11.76) and Barry Bonds (12.93).

■ Thome's .563 career slugging percentage would rank seventh among 500-homer club members, behind only Babe Ruth (.690), Ted Williams (.634), Jimmie Foxx (.609), Barry Bonds (.607), Mark McGwire (.588) and Alex Rodriguez (.576).

■ 26.0 percent of Thome's career hits have been home runs, which would be the third-highest percentage among players the 500 club ... only Mark McGwire (35.9 percent) and Harmon Killebrew (27.5) would have a higher percentage of his hits as home runs ... the list:

■ Thome and Alex Rodriguez are the only players in major-league history to hit 40-plus home runs for three different teams ... Thome hit 40-plus three times with Cleveland, twice with Philadelphia and once with the White Sox.

■ Ranks first in Cleveland Indians history with 334 home runs ... his 52 home runs in 2002 are an Indians single-season record, while his 42 home runs with the White Sox in 2006 are a club record for left-handers.

■ The Peoria native is the all-time home run leader among Illinois natives ... Thome is followed by Gary Gaetti (360), Shawn Green (326), Greg Luzinski (307), Fred Lynn (306), Rickey Henderson (297) and Ted Kluszewski (279).

Home Run Breakdown

■ Has hit 30 or more home runs 12 times, 40 or more six times and 50 or more once (52 in 2002).

■ Has 36 career multihomer games, most recently on 4/18/07 vs. Texas in support of Mark Buehrle's no-hitter ... hit three home runs on 7/22/94 vs. the White Sox and 7/6/01 vs. St. Louis (both with Cleveland).

■ Hit 40-plus homers in each of his five full seasons from 2001-06, excluding 2005 when he was limited by injury to 59 games ... averaged 46.4 home runs in that five-year span, including a career-high 52 in 2002.

■ Has homered off 328 different pitchers, vs. 29 teams and at 37 ballparks ... the Phillies are the only team against whom he has not hit a home run.

■ Rick Reed (nine) is his most victimized pitchers, followed by Roger Clemens (eight), Eric Milton, Mike Mussina and Bobby Witt (six apiece).

■ Has hit his most home runs vs. Detroit (51) and his most at Jacobs Field (178) ... among parks that were not his home field, has homered most frequently at the Metrodome (24).

■ Has 404 home runs runs off right-handed pitchers and 86 off lefties.

■ Has hit 271 solo home runs, 151 two-run homers, 60 three-run shots and eight grand slams.

■ Has homered most often in June (109), on Tuesday and Wednesday (80 apiece), at first base (310), from the cleanup spot in the order (168), in the fourth inning (77) and on the first pitch (72).

■ Owns 17 career postseason home runs, including eight in the ALDS, six in the ALCS and three in the World Series.

■ Hit his first home run on 10/4/91 at Yankee Stadium (off Steve Farr), his 100th on 5/14/97 at Texas (Bobby Witt), his 200th on 4/15/00 vs. Texas (Mark Clark), his 300th on 6/5/02 at Minnesota (Eric Milton) and his 400th on 6/14/04 vs. Cincinnati (Jose Acevedo) ... a breakdown of Thome's milestone home runs.

■ Played 510 games between home run No. 1 and 100, 392 between 100 and 200, 361 between 200 and 300 and 301 between 300 and 400.

■ Is the all-time major-league leader with 53 home runs in interleague play.

■ Hit the longest home run of his career on 7/3/99 vs. Oakland at Jacobs Field, a 511-foot shot to center field off Don Wengert ... the home run stands as the longest in the 14-year history of Jacobs Field.

A Season For The Ages

■ Frank Thomas and Alex Rodriguez each hit his 500th home run earlier this season, and Thome (490) and Manny Ramirez (489) are approaching the milestone.

■ According to David Vincent of the Society For American Baseball Research, there have only been three seasons since 1967 in which two batters each have joined the 500 club: Mickey Mantle and Eddie Mathews in 1967, Harmon Killebrew and Frank Robinson in 1971 and Sammy Sosa and Rafael Palmeiro in 2003.

JIM THOME: AN ALL-STAR IN THE COMMUNITY

- In April 2007, Thome and his wife Andrea, along with the Paul and Jennifer Konerko, announced a new partnership with Children's Home + Aid ... the program, dubbed "Family Champions for Family Champions," focuses on promoting a positive perception of foster care and raising awareness about the needs of foster children ... on May 12, 2007, the Thome and Konerko families announced the start of a fundraising campaign ... to kick off the "Bring Me Home" campaign, Thome donated \$10,000 to Children's Home + Aid.
- Was chosen as *The Sporting News* "No. 1 Good Guy" in Major League Baseball in 2005 for his fundraising efforts in his native Peoria, Ill. ... also was the recipient of the 2005 Lou Gehrig Memorial Award, presented annually by the Phi Delta Theta fraternity to the Major League Baseball Player who best exemplifies the giving character of the Hall of Famer ... the award was first presented in 1955 and is permanently maintained at the Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown, N.Y.
- Was the 2002 recipient of the Roberto Clemente Award, presented annually to the Major League Baseball player who exemplifies Clemente's passion for the game, sportsmanship and community involvement ... with the honor, John Hancock Financial Services made a \$25,000 donation in his name to the Steve Palermo Chapter of the National Paralysis Foundation in Leawood, Kan. ... Thome's nephew, Brandon, is currently unable to walk after bruising his spinal cord in June 2001.
