METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets have lost two straight after their four-game winning streak...New York is 7-4 in its last 11 games...The Mets are 5-4 in their last nine road games and 15-30 overall on the road this year.

SERIES NOTES: After dropping the first two games of the series, the Mets will look to avoid being swept by the Cardinals for the first time since April 21-23, 2009 at St. Louis...New York is now 4-10-1 in road series.

DAY BASEBALL: New York is 22-8 (9-4 on the road) in day games this year...The Mets own the best winning percentage (.733) in the majors in day games...Daniel Murphy is fifth in the NL with a .341 batting average and eighth with .396 on-base percentage while Lucas Duda is 12th in the NL with a .394 on-base percentage during day games (minimum 75 plate appearances).

FIRST PLACE TEAMS: The Mets are 0-2 in their string of 10 straight games vs. first place clubs...After this series the Mets will travel to Washington for three games vs. the NL East-leading Nationals before hosting the NL West-leading Dodgers for four games.

NL CENTRAL: New York is 8-17 vs. the NL Central this year, including 1-11 vs. those clubs on the road...The Mets are 2-4 vs. St. Louis, 0-7 vs. the Cubs, 0-3 vs. Pittsburgh, 3-0 vs. Cincinnati and 3-3 vs. Milwaukee.

VS. ST. LOUIS: The Mets allowed a season-high 12 runs last night...The Mets have allowed nine runs or more five times this year (three times to the Cardinals).

RUNS: The Mets have scored three or fewer runs 52 times this year, the second-most in the majors, behind Seattle (53)...New York is 13-39 when scoring three runs or less...The 13 wins are tied for the seventh-most such wins.

HOME RUNS: New York has homered in six straight games dating back to the series finale in San Francisco on July 8...It's the longest streak with a home run since the club hit a home run in eight straight contests from August 18-27, 2014...The Mets have scored 17 of their last 19 runs on home runs (two of the four runs in this series, all 15 runs in their series vs. Arizona and the final two runs at San Francisco on July 8).

MORE HOME RUN NOTES: The Mets have hit 12 home runs over their last six games after not hitting a home run in a season-high nine straight games from June 28-July 7...In addition, New York has hit nine home runs in its last four games.

MICHAEL CUDDYER: Slugged a home run and collected three hits last night...Cuddyer had at least one hit in his last four starts and three multi-hit games in his last four starts...**Cuddyer is 8-17 (.471) with two home runs and two RBI in his last four starts.**

LUCAS DUDA: Has hit two home runs and driven in four and scored four times in his last five games...**Duda is tied with Bryce Harper for the most home runs in the NL off a lefthander by a lefthander.**

KEVIN PLAWECKI: Is hitting .286 (8-28) this month, with three multi-hit games, including a two-hit performance last night...Since June 3, Plawcki has reached base safely in 17 of 21 games...He is batting .302 (19-63) with five doubles, five RBI and a .352 on-base percentage during that span.

METS-CARDINALS NOTES: The Mets are 5-16 at St. Louis since 2009...The last time they won a series in St. Louis was in 2008 (2-1).

NIESE NOTES: Has tossed seven straight quality starts, the second-longest such stretch of his career and tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the majors...Niese had 10 straight quality starts from August 18, 2012-April 6, 2013...Since June 1, Niese has posted a 2.64 ERA (14 earned runs/47.2 innings) going 2-3...His 2.64 ERA is the 13th-lowest in the NL over that span (min. 45.0 innings)...Opponents have a flyball percentage of 24.9% against Niese, the 10th-lowest mark in the National League...Lefthanded batters have a flyball percentage of just 14.3% against him this season, the sixth-lowest mark among 127 qualified major league starters.

PITCHING NOTES: Since July 5, the Mets pitching staff has allowed 21 earned runs in 78.0 innings (2.42 ERA) with 21 walks and 73 strikeouts...During that stretch, the staff is hold opponents to a .206 batting average...**Overall, New York is fourth in the majors with a 3.29 team ERA.**

STARTERS: Mets starters rank seventh in the majors with a 3.49 ERA...They are fifth in the majors with 502 strikeouts and have issued the fourth fewest walks (125)...**The starters have a 2.08 ERA (28 ER/121.0 IP) in their last 18 games (since June 25).**

HELPING THEIR CAUSE: Mets pitchers lead the majors with 15 RBI...Atlanta is second with 11...New York pitchers also lead the majors with 32 hits and are tied with San Francisco and Cincinnati with seven extra-base hits.

THE PEN: The Mets are fifth in the majors with a 2.79 bullpen ERA.

JEURYS FAMILIA: Has allowed two earned runs in his last 24.0 innings (0.75 ERA) and four earned runs in his last 38.2 innings (0.93 ERA)...He is tied for fourth in the majors with 27 saves...**His 27 saves were the most in the first half in team history...**Francisco Rodriguez held the previous mark with 23...He ranks third in the NL and sixth in the majors among relievers with a 1.25 ERA (minimum 30 innings).

RUBEN TEJADA: Has hit in six straight games, going 8-24 (.333) with two RBI...Tejada is batting .333 (14-42) since July 3.

CURTIS GRANDERSON: Is 4-for-13 (.307) with one home run and one RBI over his last three games...He has five leadoff home runs tied for the most in the majors with Minnesota's Brian Dozier...He has nine career leadoff home runs, the second-most in team history, behind Jose Reyes (16).

GAME TIME CHANGE: ESPN has selected the Mets-Nationals for its stand alone national broadcast on August 2...The game originally scheduled to start at 1:10 p.m. at Citi Field will now begin at 8:08 p.m.

JACOB deGROM T-SHIRT: Every fan attending the Mets-Dodgers game on Friday, July 24 will take home a Jacob deGrom t-shirt on Free Shirt Friday.

LAST START: Picked up his second straight win in the Mets' 5-3 victory over Arizona on July 12 at Citi Field...Tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three runs, all earned, on five hits...Struck out three and walked none...Niese is 2-1 with a 1.66 ERA (four earned runs/21.2 innings pitched) in his last three starts.

HIGH QUALITY: Over his last seven starts, Niese is 3-4 with a 2.64 ERA (14 earned runs/37.2 innings pitched)...During this time, he has tossed seven straight quality starts, the second-longest such stretch of his career and tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the majors...Tossed a career-high 10 straight quality starts from August 12, 2012-April 6, 2013...Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in seven consecutive starts for the first time since doing so in 10 straight games from August 1-September 20, 2014...Prior to this current seven-game stretch, Niese went 0-4 with a 9.00 ERA (20 earned runs/20.0 innings) in his final four starts in May after he went 3-2 with a 1.95 ERA (eight earned runs/37.0 innings) in his first six starts of the year.

WINS: Has earned back-to-back wins for the first time since April 15-21...Last earned a win in three straight starts when he won four straight from September 14, 2012-April 1, 2013...Last won three straight decisions from September 20, 2014-April 21, 2015.

CONSISTENT: Niese has tossed 69 quality starts since 2012 (101 total starts), tied for the ninth-most in the National League...He has allowed three runs or less in 39 starts since the start of 2014, tied for the seventh-most such starts in the NL...Allowed three earned runs or less in 27 of his 30 starts in 2014, tied for the third-most such starts in the NL.

VS. ST. LOUIS: Allowed a career high-tying eight earned runs and a season-high 11 hits in his start against the Cardinals on May 19 at Citi Field...Has allowed eight earned runs on three other occasions, last on May 11, 2013 against Pittsburgh...Prior to Niese's last start against St. Louis, he tossed six straight quality starts against the Cardinals with the Mets winning five of those six games.

VS. LEFTIES: Lefties are 1-for-15 (.067) against Niese in his last three starts, after batting .421 (8-19) against him in his previous three outings...He has thrown 45 of his 57 pitches (78.9%) to lefties for strikes in his last four starts...He has walked one of the last 52 lefthanded hitters he has faced (1.9%)...Lefties have a "well-hit average" of .066 (6-91) against Niese this season, the seventh-best mark among 133 qualified starters...This season, lefties are batting .253 (23-91) off Niese...Lefties have never hit better off Niese than they did in 2010 when they batted .266 (33-124) against him (100 AB minimum)...Lefthanded hitters have a career batting average of .257 (223-866) against him.

ON THE ROAD: In nine games, all starts, is 2-5 with a 3.44 ERA (21 earned runs/55.0 innings)...Struck out 40 and walked 19...Has tossed four straight quality starts on the road, going 1-2 with a 2.67 ERA (eight earned runs/27.0 innings).

GROUND BALL/FLY BALL: Opponents have a flyball percentage of 24.9% against Niese, the 10th-lowest mark in the National League...Lefthanded batters have a flyball percentage of just 14.3% against him this season, the sixth-lowest mark among 127 qualified major league starters...Niese has a groundball percentage of 54.2%, which is good for the 12th-highest mark in the majors.

WITH TWO STRIKES: Hitters are batting .222 (38-171) against Niese with two strikes this year...Niese has allowed an on-base percentage of only .091 to hitters with two strikes over his last three starts.

STARTS: Making his 166th start with the Mets, the 11th-most in franchise history...Passed Tom Glavine after making his last start...Trails David Cone (169) for 10th all-time in franchise history...Has tossed 996.1 innings, the 12th-most in franchise history...Trails Glavine for 11th-most (1,005.1) in club history...Has made at least 24 starts each season since joining the Mets rotation in 2010...He has made 157 starts since 2010...No other Met has made more than 110 starts in that time.

UNEARNED RUNS: Has allowed multiple unearned runs in five starts this season, tied with Andrew Cashner for the most in the majors...Has surrendered multiple unearned runs in a major league-leading nine outings since the start of the 2014 season...Niese has allowed 11 total unearned runs this season.

NEXT GAME'S STARTER - #33 MATT HARVEY (8-6, 3.07) - RHP

LAST START: Picked up the win in the Mets' 4-2 victory over Arizona on July 11 at Citi Field...Tossed 7.0 innings and allowed two runs, earned, on five hits...Struck out nine and walked four...Snapped a two-decision losing streak.

RECENT SUCCESS: Is 2-2 with a 1.71 ERA (six earned runs/31.2 innings) in his last five starts dating to June 16.

VS. NATIONALS: In six career games, all starts, is 3-1 with a 0.68 ERA (three earned runs/40.0 innings)...Has tossed 19.0 consecutive scoreless innings against the Nationals dating to July 26 2013, and 23.0 straight innings against Washington without allowing an earned run dating to June 28, 2013...Harvey has not allowed an earned run in his two career starts at Nationals Park...He has struck out 47 and walked nine in his career against the Nationals...He has not allowed more than five hits in any of those starts...Washington batters have hit .184 against Harvey.

- Is hitting .143 (13-91) with 33 strikeouts over his last 25 games dating to June 17...His .143 average is third-lowest in MLB (min. 95 plate appearances) in that stretch...Batting .128 (6-47) with two home runs and five RBI in 13 games during July...Had eight RBI in 25 games in June.
