St. Louis Cardinals (77-71) at San Francisco Giants (79-69)

TODAY'S GAME: The Cardinals play their final regular season game against San Francisco today with the fourth game at AT&T Park...St. Louis is looking for a win for a split of the four games...first pitch is 3:05 CDT...St. Louis will play 10-games on the 11-day roadtrip with stops in SF (1-2), COL (3) and CHI (3)...the Cards own the top road record in Major League Baseball at 44-30, but are 33-41 at home.

LAST GAME: The Cardinals scored twice in the 9th for a come-from-behind 3-2 win...Brandon Moss hit his 27th home run of the year in the first inning...Mike Leake pitched 6.0 innings and allowed single runs in the 2nd and 5th for a quality start...in the 9th, Jedd Gyorko singled followed by a Molina walk to set up an RBI single by Randal Grichuk for the 2-2 tie...a sac fly by Kotlen Wong gave St. Louis the win.

COMING UP: The Cardinals fly to Colorado for three games against the Rockies at Coors Field, Mon-Wed...this trip is the team's 4th-straight 3-city trip and 5th of the season.

WILD CARDS: St. Louis entered the day in the 3rd NL Wild Card position, two games behind both San Francisco and the New York Mets.

MIKE MATHENY: Mike Matheny is in his 5th season as the Cardinals manager, having taken his teams to the postseason in each of his first four seasons, the only manager in MLB history to do so...Mike has managed 43 postseason games, and has 21 postseason wins since 2012, 3rd-most wins among current Major League managers...in 2012 Matheny became the 49th manager in St. Louis Cardinals history and in 2013 he took his team to the World Series in just his second season at the helm with a league-best 97-wins...in 2014, Mike guided the Cardinals to the N.L. Central title and their 4th-straight trip to the NLCS...he led an injury-riddled team in 2015 to 100 wins, the best in the majors, and the N.L. Central Division title for a 3rd-straight season...Matheny, 45, had a 13-year Major League career playing with MIL, TOR, STL and SF, winning four Rawlings Gold Gloves ('00, '03-'05), and retiring from the game in 2006 due to concussion symptoms...he holds the M.L. catching record for consecutive errorless games (252).

REDBIRD RUNDOWN: The 2015 N.L. Central Champion St. Louis Cardinals are in their 125th season of play in the National League...St. Louis began the day in second place in the N.L. Central, 17.0 games behind first-place Chicago and 3.0 games in front of Pittsburgh...the Cardinals are 15-15 in their last 30 games, 9-11 in last 20, 4-6 in their last 10 & 2-3 in their last five...St. Louis holds a +60 run-differential, 5th in the N.L.

BATTLE OF THE CHAMPS: Since the 2010 season when the Giants won their first of three championships over the last six seasons, the Cardinals (one championship, 2 World Series appearances) are 22-22 when facing San Francisco during the regular season and are 10-10 in games played at AT&T park.

EXTRA! EXTRA!: St. Louis ranks 3rd among Major League baseball teams with 507 extra base hits this season (Boston tops with 545), but have just three on this roadtrip - two doubles Thursday (Randal Grichuk & Johnny Peralta) and a solo home run by Brandon Moss last night...there have only been nine games this season in which the club did not record an extra base hit, and never more than two in a single month...the team had no extra base hits on 9/14 vs. CHI and 9/16 at SF already this month...St. Louis recorded 13 on 6/26 at Seattle, their most in a single game this season.

STONE BUDDHA: Seung Hwan Oh has struck out 97 batters, ranking T3rd among National League relievers (Barraclough MIA, 106)...the 97 strikeouts in a single-season by a Cardinals rookie reliever ranks 2nd all-time behind Trevor Rosenthal's 108 in 2013 and are the 3rd-most in franchise history by a reliever behind Mark Littell (120 in 1978) and Rosenthal.

#61 ALEX REYES • RHP • 6-3 • 175 • 22 yrs

TODAY'S GAME:

- ◆ Making his 3rd career Major League start (10th app.) today.
- ◆ Both wins this season have come against the Cubs (0.00 ERA, 7.1 IP).
- ◆ Earned win in relief in last outing (9/13 vs. CHI). Threw 4.1 scoreless IP, allowing 1 hit with 6 walks and 4 strikeouts (85 pitches/43 strikes).
- ◆ His six walks were a single-game season-high for Cardinals pitchers this season and marked the 4th instance a Cardinals pitcher threw 4.1 scoreless innings or more with six walks in relief since 1913 and the first since 5/24/1950 when Cloyd Boyer (7.2 IP, in relief of Max Lanier) pulled off the feat against the New York Giants at the Polo Grounds in a 2-0 Cardinals win. All Cardinals pitchers to pull off the feat threw 7.2 IP or more in relief. The last pitcher in MLB was former Cardinals reliever Arthur Rhodes with BAL (8/1/1995; 4.1 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 6 BB).
- ◆ Made a pair of starts this season vs. OAK (8/27) & at CIN (9/2). Is 0-0, 2.53 ERA (10.2 IP) with six walks and 11 strikeouts (.211 OPP AVG).
- ◆ In seven relief outings, is 2-1 with a 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP), one save, 10 walks, 23 strikeouts and .140 OPP AVG.
- ◆ Limiting opposing right-handers to a .131 average against (8-for-61).
- ◆ Rated as the Cardinals No. 1 prospect by *MLB.com* and the 8th overall in *MLB.com's* Top 100 Prospect Watch.

VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS:

- ◆ Makes his first career appearance against the Giants.

2016 SEASON & CAREER:

- ◆ Made his first career start vs. OAK on 8/27, tossing 4.1 innings (89 pitches) allowing one run on a pair of singles and four walks in a no decision the Cardinals lost 3-2.
- ◆ Began season with 14.0-inning scoreless streak to begin his career, snapped in the 5th inn. of start vs. OAK (8/27). The streak ranked as the 3rd-longest in franchise history for a rookie beginning his career behind Von McDaniel (19.0 IP, 1957) and Pat Perry (16.1 IP, 1985).
- ◆ Joined Michael Wacha (7.0 IP, 5/30/13 vs. KC) and Anthony Reyes (6.1 IP, 8/9/05 vs. MIL) among most recent Cardinals pitchers who allowed two hits or less during their first career start.
- ◆ Converted first Major League save at PHI on 8/19 in a 4-3 extra-inning win. Struck out one in a scoreless 11th inning.
- ◆ Earned first MLB win in Cardinals come-from-behind 8-4 win at CHI on 8/13. Fanned three while yielding one hit over 3.0 scoreless IP.
- ◆ Threw five scoreless appearances (9.1 IP) out of the bullpen before his first start, allowing five hits, walking four and striking out 13.
- ◆ Purchased from Memphis (AAA) on 8/9 when RHP Michael Wacha was placed on the disabled list.
- ◆ Is the 9th different Cardinal to make his MLB debut this season and the 8th different Cardinals pitcher to make a start behind the original starting five, Mike Mayers and Luke Weaver.
- ◆ Struck out 449 of 1423 (31.6%) of his batters faced in 69 starts over his four-year minor league career (2013-16).
