### THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY:

**June 29**

**2005 - Craig Biggio** is hit by a pitch for the 268th time to set a modern Major League record, surpassing **Don Baylor**... Biggio homers his next time up in what ends up as a 7-1 win vs. Colorado.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** The Astros will continue this 7-game homestand against the Yankees (2-2) and Royals (3g) with the 1st of this 3-game series tonight opposite Kansas City...the Astros will send rookie **RHP Lance McCullers** (3-2) to the mound opposite **RHP Joe Blanton** (2-0) and the Royals.

**K KING:** Over his first 46.1 career innings **RHP Lance McCullers** has 52 strikeouts, which is the 2nd-highest total for an Astros pitcher within their 1st 8 career games...that franchise record is 56, set by **RHP Tom Griffin** in 1969.

**BIG SERIES:** This series is a matchup of the top 2 teams in the AL in Kansas City (44-28, .611) and Houston (44-34, .564)...the last time Houston played in games that featured 2 teams that were both at least 10 games over .500:

- At a neutral site, **Sept. 15, 2008:** the Astros (80-68) hosted the Cubs (89-58) at Miller Park in a neutral site game moved by Hurricane Ike.
- In a game at Minute Maid Park, **Sept. 3, 2005:** the Astros (72-62) hosted the Cardinals (85-50) in a matchup of starters **RHP Roger Clemens** (11-6) and **RHP Chris Carpenter** (19-4).

**HOME WINS:** The Astros enter tonight with a 25-16 home record...they have gone 17-7 in their last 24 home games and 24-12 in their last 36 contests at Minute Maid Park.

**IN THE STANDINGS:** At 44-34, the Astros are in 1st place in the AL West, currently leading the division by 4.0 games over the 2nd-place Angels...the Astros have been in 1st place in the division for 75 days this season and have held the division lead since April 19.

**WINNING WAYS:** Houston has 12 series wins and 4 series splits in their 25 series in 2015...the Astros reached the 44-win mark in the 78th game of this season, compared to reaching that mark in the 108th game of last season (44-64) on July 30.

**YESTERDAY'S GAME:** **RHP Collin McHugh** (9-3) pitched the Astros to a 4-game series split with the Yankees yesterday by tossing 8.0 innings and allowing 1 run on 2 hits...in the 3-1 win, the Astros offense was powered by **SS Carlos Correa**, who doubled and scored twice.

**RACKING UP THE WINS:** Dating back to Aug. 1, 2014, **RHP Collin McHugh** has posted a 16-3 record in 26 starts...in that time frame, McHugh leads the Majors in wins, immediately ahead of **RHP Gerrit Cole** (15-4).

**ICE CREAM SUNDAES:** With yesterday's win, the Astros improved to 9-3 on Sundays this season, their best record on any single day of the week in 2015...Houston went 14-12 on Sunday's in 2014.

**BIG CROWDS OVER THE WEEKEND:** The Astros and Yankees drew a total of 110,842 fans to the ballpark from Friday thru Sunday...this included a 41,133 sell out on Saturday...this marked Minute Maid Park's largest 3-day weekend attendance since a series with the Rangers from May 18-20, 2008 (113,261)...prior to Saturday, the last time the Astros had a sell out in a game other than Opening Day was the Saturday of that Rangers series on May 19, 2012.

**ALTUVE IN ALL-STAR VOTING:** The Astros are strongly encouraging all fans to cast their vote for the starting lineups for the 2015 MLB All-Star Game by visiting [Astros.com/vote](http://Astros.com/vote)...as of last Monday, **2B Jose Altuve** (6,086,193) trailed only **2B Omar Infante** (6,521,733) of the Royals.

**#VOTE ALTUVE:** The Astros launched their Shop with an All-Star Sweepstakes last week, which offers fans who #VoteAltuve 35 times for the 2015 All-Star Game a chance to win a \$1,000 shopping spree with **2B Jose Altuve** at Academy Sports + Outdoors...in order to enter, fans must vote 35 times for Altuve and then post a screenshot of their ballot using #VoteAltuve on Twitter or Facebook.

**ELIAS SAYS:** **SS Carlos Correa** has 27 hits, 5 home runs and 15 RBI in his first 20 games in the Major Leagues...only 2 other active players had that many hits, homers and RBI over their first 20 Big League games: **Jeff Francoeur** (28 hits, 7 HR, 19 RBI) and **Albert Pujols** (27 hits, 7 HR, 22 RBI).

**QUICK LEARNER:** **SS Carlos Correa** is the 1st Major League shortstop to record 9 doubles within his 1st 20 career games (since 1914)...he's also the 1st player in Astros history, regardless of position, to hit 9 doubles within his first 20 games...Correa has joined **Rusty Staub** (19g in 1963), **George Springer** (2014) and **Jeff Bagwell** (1991) as the only players in club history to reach base safely in 18 of their first 20 games in the Major Leagues.

**WHAT-A-GATTIS:** Since April 26, **DH Evan Gattis** has hit .261 (57x218) with 10 doubles, 12 HR and 46 RBI in his 59 games...in that time frame, he ranks 1st in the AL in RBI and tied for 9th in HR.

**HOMER HAPPY:** The Astros have hit multiple home runs in 10 of their last 15 games, which included a franchise-record, 9-consecutive games with multiple homers...the Astros have hit multiple home runs in 32 games this season with Houston going 29-3 in those contests...their 32 multi-homer games are the most in the Majors.

**WILL THE THRILL:** **RHP Will Harris** has been one of the most effective relievers in the Majors in 2015, posting a 1.03 ERA (4ER/35IP) in 30 appearances...additionally, he has allowed just 13 hits in his 35.0 IP while tallying 37 strikeouts.

**HOOKS TO HOST ALL-STAR GAME:** The Corpus Christi Hooks are hosting the Texas League All-Star Game tomorrow at Whataburger Field at 7:30 p.m...the Hooks placed 6 players on the South roster in **RHP Travis Ballew**, **RHP Chris Devenski**, **IF Conrad Gregor**, **RHP Jandel Gustave**, **C Roberto Pena** and **IF Tyler White**.

**LAST START - 6/24 at LAA:** did not factor into the decision in Houston's 2-1 loss in Anaheim...tossed 6.0 innings, allowing 1 run on 4 hits and 3 walks with 6 strikeouts...was his 4th career quality start in 8 totals starts.

**ABOUT MCCULLERS:** 21-year-old right-hander will make his 9th Major League start tonight, and 1st against the Royals.

- is in his 4th professional season since being drafted by Houston in the supplemental 1st round (41st overall) in 2012...selected by the Astros to the Major League roster on May 18.

**K KING:** his 52 strikeouts mark the 2nd most ever recorded by an Astros pitcher through his first 8 career games...the record is currently held by **RHP Tom Griffin** (56 in 1969).

- since 2012, only 4 other pitchers recorded 52+ strikeouts within their first 8 career games: **Masahiro Tanaka**, **Yu Darvish**, **Danny Salazar** and **Matt Harvey**.

**QUITE A START:** has been one of the best pitchers in the American League since making his MLB debut on May 18...since making his debut, ranks 2nd in the AL in opponents' average (.189) and 6th in strikeouts and ERA.

**ROOKIE RANKS:** among AL rookies, ranks 4th in strikeouts, 6th in opponents' average, T-7th in wins, 6th in ERA and 8th in innings pitched (min. 25IP).

**PUTTING UP ZEROS:** on June 14 vs. SEA, tossed 5.0 hitless innings (walked 4 and threw 90 pitches, and the Astros were ahead 11-0 after 5.0 innings)...at 21 years, 255 days, became the youngest pitcher to toss 5.0+ hitless innings in a start since **RHP Phil Hughes** (20.311) on May 1, 2007 at TEX...since 1970, only 4 pitchers younger than McCullers have recorded a start of 5.0+ hitless innings: **Hughes**, **LHP Wilson Alvarez** (1991), **RHP Dennis Blair** (1975) and **LHP Vida Blue** (1970).

**YOUNG GUN:** in his 4th Major League start (June 3 vs. BAL), threw his first complete game as a professional in a 4-hit, 11-strikeout effort...allowed 1 run but did not walk a batter.

- per Elias, at age 21, became the 4th-youngest pitcher in the last 50 seasons with more than 10 strikeouts and no walks in a complete game...the 3 younger pitchers to do so over that span were **RHP Dwight Gooden** (2x, at age 19 for the 1984 Mets), **RHP Bert Blyleven** (at age 20 for the 1971 Twins) and **RHP Kerry Wood** (at age 20 for the 1998 Cubs, while tying a Major League record with 20 strikeouts in a 9.0-inning game).

- became the first Astros rookie to strike out 11 batters in a complete game since **RHP Roy Oswalt** fanned 12 on 9/9/01 vs. MIL...also became just the 2nd rookie in franchise history to strike out 11+ batters without a walk in a complete game, joining **RHP Shane Reynolds** (7/23/94 vs. PIT).

**MLB DEBUT:** became the 2nd-youngest pitcher in club history to make his debut in a start at Minute Maid Park, behind **LHP Carlos Hernandez** (21 years, 118 days) on Aug. 18, 2001 vs. DET.

- became the 6th starter in club history to allow 1 run or less in his MLB debut (last, **RHP Jarrod Cosart** on 7/12/13 at TB).

**UNTOUCHABLE:** prior to his promotion, spent the entire season at Double A Corpus Christi...was promoted to Triple A Fresno on 5/14 but did not pitch in a game with the club...allowed just 2 earned runs in his 29 innings (0.62 ERA), striking out 43.

- at the time of his promotion to Triple A, was leading all of Double A in opp. avg. (.146), while ranking 2nd in ERA and T-4th in K's.

**PROSPECT STATUS:** is currently ranked by MLB.com as Houston's No. 10 prospect...prior to the season, was ranked as a top 10 Astros prospect by multiple publications: Baseball Prospectus (#7), *Baseball America* (#9) and ESPN.com (#6).

<b>TOP OF THE CHARTS:</b> leads the Majors in groundball to flyball ratio (4.81) and innings pitched (116.1), and in opponents' batting average (.194)...ranks 2nd in the AL in ERA and 1st in wins above replacement (4.1, per Baseball Reference).												
<b>vs. KC:</b> will make his 3rd career start against the Royals...last faced KC on April 16, 2014, allowing 2 runs in 6.0 innings with 5 strikeouts in the Astros 4-6 loss.

- went 1x2 yesterday vs. NYY...has hit safely in all 7 games since returning to action on 6/22 (missed 4 games while nursing discomfort in his right hamstring)...is 9x27 (.333) with 3 doubles, 1 homer, 2 RBI, 4 stolen bases and a .935 OPS (.379 OBP/.556 SLG) during his 7-game hitting streak.
- tied the game at 6-6 with a solo homer off **Tanaka** on Saturday, following up **Correa's** 2-run homer...marked the 5th time this season the Astros hit back-to-back home runs (last, 6/2 vs. BAL, Gattis/Valbuena off Wright).
- on Thurs. became the first Major Leaguer this season to record 2 steals and 2 doubles in the same game...the last to do it was Baltimore's **Steve Pearce** on July 3, 2014 vs. TEX...Altuve's 2 career multi-double, multi-steal games are tied for the most in club history with **Cesar Cedeno** and **Derek Bell**.
- leads the AL in steals (21), ranks 3rd in infield hits (15), T-5th in intentional walks (7) and 11th in hits (82)...among AL 2nd basemen, ranks 3rd in hits and T-4th in RBI...ranks 2nd among AL 2nd basemen in fielding percentage (.994, 2E/335TC), 3rd in assists (215) and 4th in double plays (44).
- hitting .337 (31x92) with a .404 OBP vs. LHP this season...owns a career .345 (219x634) average vs. LHP, which is tops in MLB since 2011 (his debut season in the Majors).
