GOING RETRO—Today the Rays and Giants will turn back the clock by wearing 1970s-era retro jerseys...this is the fifth straight year the Rays have worn a hypothetical uniform from 1979 that celebrates the style of the era while keeping the Rays modern colors...the Rays have won 3 straight games and hold an overall record of 3-1 when wearing these uniforms, and are 8-5 all-time in Turn Back the Clock games held at Tropicana Field...the Giants will wear their 1978 road uniforms...concession prices will roll back for a day, including \$2 popcorn, peanuts and Pepsi fountain drinks...the first 10,000 fans will receive a Rays Retro Poster.

- Immediately following the game, the rock band **The Fray** will take the stage as the first postgame concert of the season...Rays Postgame Concerts are free with the purchase of that game's ticket...media seeking to write in peace may relocate to the Media Dining Room.

WE ARE ORLANDO—Last night the Rays dedicated their annual Pride Night to the victims of Sunday's mass shooting in Orlando...the Rays, partners, fans and Major League Baseball together raised more than \$300,000 to benefit the Pulse Victims Fund, including a \$100,000 donation from MLB...the club wore Orlando Rays caps that will be autographed and auctioned at raysbaseball.com/auction starting at noon on Monday, June 20 until 8 p.m. on Sunday, June 26—with 100 pct. of proceeds benefitting the Pulse Victims Fund.

- Last night's crowd of 40,135 was the largest at Tropicana Field in the regular season since April 10, 2006 vs. BAL (home opener, 40,199)...it was their largest non-Opening Day regular-season crowd since July 19, 2004 vs. NYY (41,755).
- OneBlood is holding a blood drive again at Gate 4 today, starting at 2 p.m. ...donors will receive a OneBlood T-shirt and a voucher for two tickets to any future 2016 regular season game, redeemable online

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost the last 2 games following a 9-2 stretch...last night they were one strike away from being shut out for the fourth time, broken up by Orlando native SS **Brad Miller's** solo homer (see "Elias Says")...the Rays have still won 9 of their last 13 games after losing 8 of their previous 9...they are 9-6 in the month of June...they need to win today and tomorrow to continue their streak of four consecutive series victories, their longest streak since July 11-30, 2014 (five straight).

- The Rays are 4-3 on the 9-game homestand vs. HOU (2-1), SEA (2-1) and SF (0-1) and need one more win to record their first winning homestand of the season.
- The Rays are 4-for-32 (.125) with RISP over the past 3 games, and have left 31 men on base over those 2 games.
- The Rays pitching staff has recorded double-digit strikeouts in 5 consecutive games, their longest streak since Aug 8-13, 2014 (6), and in 11 of their last 13 contests...they have 40 SO in the last 3 games.

ELIAS SAYS—Last night SS **Brad Miller** homered with 2 outs and a full count in the 9th, spoiling RH **Jeff Samardzija's** bid for a complete-game shutout...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it was the second time this season a batter ruined a CG SHO with 2 outs and 2 strikes in the 9th...on May 17 in Milwaukee, CHC **Jason Heyward** homered on an 0-2 pitch off RH **Chase Anderson**...it didn't happen at all in 2014 or 2015.

- Miller has 2 HR in his last 18 AB following an 83-AB homerless drought...last night's traveled 412 ft. to the opposite field, per MLB StatCast, and the average distance on his 7 HR is 418.9 ft.

RAYS vs. GIANTS/INTERLEAGUE—The Rays are 5-5 all-time against the Giants (4-3 here, 1-2 in San Francisco)...this is the Giants third visit to Tropicana Field, as the Rays took 2 of 3 games in 2013 and 2004...the Rays are 4-6 in interleague play (1-1 vs. LAD, 1-3 vs. MIA, 2-1 vs. ARI)...they have a 167-171 (.494) all-time interleague record, but they are 25-14 since June 25, 2014...since 2008, they are 93-67 (.581), 5th-best interleague record in the majors over that span...they haven't had a losing interleague record since 2010 when they went 7-11.

BIRTHDAY BOY—Today LH **Matt Moore** takes the hill on his 27th birthday, the ninth time in Rays history a pitcher has started on his birthday...RH **Chris Archer** had the last two occurrences, in 2015 and 2014 (Sep 26), losing both starts...four of them have earned the win: RH **Jeremy Hellickson** on April 8, 2012 vs. NYY (3-0), RH **Jason Hammel** on Sep 2, 2007 at NYY (8-2), RH **Jae Seo** on May 24, 2007 vs. SEA (13-12) and LH **Mark Hendrickson** on June 23, 2005 (9-4).

- The last pitcher to beat the Giants on his birthday was Hall of Famer **Randy Johnson**, on his 41st birthday (Sep 10, 2004) in Arizona.

FAMILIAR FACE—Moore's opponent today, RH **Albert Suarez**, was a teammate of his at Rookie-level Princeton Rays in 2008...Suarez spent the first eight years of his pro career in the Rays system after signing out of Venezuela in 2006...over the last 5 games including today, the Rays have faced four different pitchers who once pitched in the Rays organization: RH **Nathan Karns**, LH **Mike Montgomery** (twice) and RH **Joaquin Benoit** for the Mariners, and Suarez.

MUSCLE MEN—SS **Brad Miller's** 9th-inning solo shot last night snapped a streak of 31 innings without a homer...the Rays rank 4th in the majors with 94 home runs...through 65 games, this is 37 more than they had a year ago at this time (57, a 65 pct. increase) and 9 more than they've ever hit at this point (85 in 2009).

- According to Stats LLC, the homer has accounted for 51.7 pct. (140 of 271) of the Rays total runs, 3rd most in the majors to the Mets (53.0) and Orioles (51.9) and up from 37.0 in 2015...over a full season, the highest pct. in Rays history is 40.2 pct. in 2006...in contrast, the Giants have scored 30.4 pct. (92 of 303) of their runs via HR, 2nd-lowest rate to the Braves (19.8).
- The Rays have hit 57 HR in 32 road games, 2nd in the majors to Toronto (58 in 36 games)...they are on pace for 144 HR on the road—which would break the major league record held by the **Barry Bonds**-powered 2001 Giants (138)...Bonds hit 36 of his major-league-record 73 that year on the road.

TWO-OUT JUGGERNAUTS—The Rays have scored 47.6 pct. of their total runs with 2 outs, far and away the highest rate in the majors...the next highest teams are the Mariners (41.7) and White Sox (41.1), and the Giants have the 3rd-lowest mark at 32.7 pct. ...the major league average is 37.2.

STEVE PEARCE—Since May 16, leads the majors with a .407 avg. (35-for-86)...his .474 OBP over that span leads the AL and his .651 SLG ranks 8th in the AL...since the start of June he's been even better, batting .500/.525/.737 (19-for-38) with 4 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR and 5 RBI...he's hit safely in 10 of 11 games, including 5 multi-hit games and four 3-hit games.

EVAN ALMIGHTY—3B **Evan Longoria** has 7 HR in his last 12 games, 20 RBI in his last 17 games and is 10-for-his-last-18 (.556) with RISP...his 7 HR in June are already his most in any calendar month since August 2013 (7)...all of his 16 HR have come as a 3B, 3rd most in the majors behind COL **Nolan Arenado** (20) and CWS **Todd Frazier** (19)...the Giants are one of only four teams he's never homered against (also LAD, PHI, WAS).

A WORTHY ALL-STAR—RH **Alex Colome** is 19-for-19 in save opportunities...it ties for the 2nd-longest streak by a Ray at any point in the season and is the longest since **Fernando Rodney** set the club record with 22 straight from May 27-Aug 13, 2012...Colome hasn't allowed a run in those 19 chances (19.2-IP, 10-H, 0-R, 7-BB, 27-SO, .152 opp avg.), and his last 19 apps overall since May 4 have been scoreless...he's pitched in 23 of the Rays 30 wins, and they are 23-5 in games in which he appears.

- Colome's 0.90 ERA ranks 3rd among AL relievers...among all pitchers with at least 10 saves, only SD **Fernando Rodney** has a lower ERA (0.00).

UNDER-30 STREAK ROLLS ON—Today is the 302nd consecutive game the Rays have started a pitcher under the age of 30, the longest current streak in the majors...the Rays passed the D-backs for the longest active streak when 31-year-old **Zack Greinke** took the mound on Opening Day, ending Arizona's streak of 237 games started by under-30 pitchers...including today, the Rays have started a pitcher under 30 in 1,537 of their last 1,611 games (95 pct.) dating back to June 26, 2006, including a major-league-record streak of 764 games between 2007-11.

- The Rays have used only 27 different starting pitchers in the Rays era (since 2008)...the Giants have used the second fewest (30)...by contrast, the Dodgers have used the most (60).

RAYS LOCK UP LOWE, BOLDT—Yesterday the Rays signed their first two 2016 June Draft picks, 3B **Joshua Lowe** (1st, No. 13 overall) and CF **Ryan Boldt** (2nd, No. 53 overall)...they have now signed 22 of their 41 selections, including seven of their first 11...see separate Draft Rundown packet.

+ **LAST START**—On Sun vs. HOU, had a season-high-tying 10 SO (also April 17 vs. CWS)...was his first scoreless start since Sep 17, 2015 vs. BAL (7 IP) and only the second time in his career he's reached double-digit strikeouts in a scoreless start (also Sep 22, 2011 at NYY).

- + Only hits allowed were a pair of singles by **Jose Altuve**.
- + Threw 114 pitches (37 in the 2nd inning), his most since June 25, 2013 vs. TOR (120)...matched his season high with 7 IP.
- + Had 21 swings-and-misses, including 15 on the fastball...both were his highest totals since before Tommy John surgery.
- + His line: W, 7 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 10 SO, 1 HBP, 114 pit, 79 str.

+ **TURNING IT AROUND**—Had 4 perfect innings on Sun vs. HOU and 3 perfect innings in his start prior to that, giving him 7 perfect frames in his last 14 IP after none in his previous 31 innings...over his last two starts, the leadoff batter has reached in 4 of his 14 innings (28.6 percent) and he's pitched from the stretch to 17 of 52 BF (32.7 pct.).

- + To compare, leadoff batter reached in 16 of his prev. 31 inn. (51.6 percent); he pitched from to stretch to 76 of 146 BF (52.1 pct.).
- + Has gone 7 IP in consecutive starts for the third time in his career (last July 11-22, 2013 vs. MIN, at BOS).

+ **THE LONG BALL**—Has yielded 14 HR, T-7th in the AL...has a 1.48 HR/9 IP ratio since his return from Tommy John surgery on July 2, 2015, compared to 0.88 HR/9 IP before that...his last start snapped a streak of allowing homers in 5 straight starts, his longest since April 17-May 14, 2013 (6)...has allowed 8 HR over his last 6 starts.

+ **SHORT STARTS**—Since returning from Tommy John surgery, 14 of his 25 starts have been 5 IP or fewer (including 6 of 13 starts this season)...went 5 IP or fewer five times in a span of 6 starts from May 3-June 2...in his career, has gone 24-9 with a 2.58 ERA (286.1-IP, 82-ER) in 43 starts of 6 IP or more compared to 11-16 with a 6.06 ERA (196-IP, 132-ER) in 43 starts of less than 6 IP.

+ **LAST TEN**—Has gone 2-4 with a 5.71 ERA (58.1-IP, 37-ER) over his last 10 starts (since April 22) and opponents are hitting .293/.349/.491 (68-for-232)...his ERA, opp avg., opp OBP and opp SLG are among the AL's bottom ten over that span...in comparison, he was 1-0 with a 2.95 ERA (18.1-IP, 6-ER) in his 3 starts prior to this.

+ **INTERLEAGUE**—Is 2-3 with a 5.65 ERA (51-IP, 32-ER) in 9 career interleague apps (all starts)...won the first 2 IL starts of his career, but

hasn't won since May 15, 2012 vs. MIA...this season, he has gone 0-2 with an 9.37 ERA (16.1-IP, 17-ER) in 3 starts (vs. LAD, at MIA, at ARI).

+ **vs. LEFTIES**—Has held lefties to a .244 avg. (11-for-45) over his last 7 starts, compared to .346 (9-for-26) against him in his first 6 starts...overall, they have hit .282/.320/.423 (20-for-71) against him, compared to .240/.320/.365 (102-for-425) in his career entering this season...since his return from Tommy John surgery, has allowed 8 HR to left-handed batters in 139.2 IP, compared to 7 HR vs. LHB in 347 IP in his career before it.

+ **FAMILIAR TERRITORY**—Will be making his ninth home start of the season, which will tie BAL **Chris Tillman** and ARI **Zack Greinke** for most in the majors...dating back to the end of 2015, 12 of his last 18 starts have come at Tropicana Field...he has gone 4-3 with a 3.80 ERA (73.1-IP, 31-ER) in his 12 home starts over this span.

+ **STRAIGHT HEAT**—Has averaged 92.7 mph on his fastball, according to FanGraphs, 2nd among qualifying AL lefties and 5th in the majors...his average fastball velocity hasn't been this high since 2012 (94.4), when he ranked 3rd in the majors to TB **David Price** (95.5) and CHC **Jeff Samardzija** (95.0).

+ **A BRUSH WITH HISTORY**—On March 22, started for the Rays at Estadio Latinoamericano in Havana against the Cuban National Team...it was just the second game played in Cuba by a major league team in the last 57 years...he became the first major league left-handed pitcher to start a game in Cuba since LAD **Sandy Koufax** on March 21, 1959, pitching from the same mound...Moore earned the victory by throwing 6 scoreless innings (6-H, 1-BB, 3-SO, 79 pit, 53 str).

+ **GETTING WELL**—Is seeking his first fully healthy season since his rookie campaign of 2012...limited to a combined 14 starts over the 2014-15 seasons due to Tommy John surgery, which he underwent on April 22, 2014 by **Dr. James Andrews** in Birmingham, Ala. ...was one of 10 starting pitchers to return to the majors in 2015 after undergoing Tommy John surgery in either 2013 or 2014, including MIA **Jose Fernandez** and NYM **Matt Harvey**.

+ **LAST START**—On Tue vs. SEA, allowed a season-high-tying 5 runs (3rd time, last May 13 vs. OAK)...threw 116 pitches, 2nd-highest total of his career (120, June 3 at MIN)...finished with 9 SO, his most since his season debut on April 5 vs. TOR (10)...allowed a season-high-tying 4 BB (also May 18 at TOR), one in each of the 2nd, 4th, 5th and 6th innings...his leadoff batter reached in 4 of his 6 IP, and twice escaped 2-on, 0-out jams...ejected by home plate umpire **Jerry Meals** following his 6th-inning walk of **Leonys Martin**, first ejection of his career...his line: ND, 5.2 IP, 8 H, 5 R, 4 BB, 9 SO, 1 HR (**Kyle Seager**), 116/76.

+ **THE BIG INNING**—Four of his 5 runs allowed in his last start came in a 29-pitch 2nd inning...four times this season he has allowed at least 4 runs in an inning, T-3rd in the majors...only pitchers to do it more often are BAL **Ubaldo Jimenez** (6) and BOS **Clay Buchholz** (5)...other Rays have combined to do that 4 times and no one more than once (Archer, Moore, Ramirez, Smyly).

+ **THE EARLY-GOING**—Has allowed 33 ER, including 20 ER within his first 2 IP...has actually only allowed 1st-inning runs twice this season (5 runs in the frame on April 21 at BOS, 4 runs May 13 vs. OAK).

+ **INTERLEAGUE**—Is 6-3 with a 3.33 ERA (75.2-IP, 28-ER) in 13 career interleague starts...has a 2.43 ERA (66.2-IP, 18-ER) over his last 11 interleague starts dating back to June 10, 2014, having allowed 2 runs or fewer in 9 of his 11 IL starts over that span.

+ **vs. SAN FRANCISCO**—Has never faced the Giants.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Has been ejected 4 times as manager, once this year (April 29 vs. TOR).
- + Recorded 100 career wins faster than any manager in club history on May 20 at DET...was the youngest to do it since CLE **Eric Wedge** in 2004.
- + Marks his second season as Rays manager...38-year-old is the youngest active manager in MLB, ahead of SD **Andy Green** (5 months older).
- + Is the fifth manager in Rays history...is the sixth Tampa-born manager in ML history and second to manage the Rays...joins Hall of Famers **Al**

- Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.**
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, including parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10)...spent two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
