**FLEXING SOME MUSCLE:** The Chicago Cubs, winners of five-straight games and now sitting a season-high 26 games over .500, today play the final contest of a three-game set against the St. Louis Cardinals, having won the first two games of the series by scores of 8-3 and 5-4 ... yesterday, Jorge Soler and Kris Bryant hit back-to-back fifth-inning homers while Starlin Castro was 2-for-4 and added a RBI.

- © Elias reports that Soler and Bryant are the first pair of Cubs rookies to hit back-to-back home runs in over 60 years ... on April 23, 1954 at Crosley Field against the Reds, Cubs rookies Ernie Banks and Gene Baker hit consecutive homers.
- © The Cubs yesterday utilized a bullpen day, as Travis Wood (2.2 IP, 1 ER) got the start and was followed by Trevor Cahill (3.1 shutout innings), who earned the win ... Pedro Strop picked up his third save, as he pitched out of a jam to preserve the one-run victory in the ninth.

**A RECORD-TYING BLAST:** Kris Bryant's fifth-inning solo home run was his 25th of the season, tying him with Billy Williams in 1961 for the most homers by a Cubs rookie in a campaign ... additionally, the blast tied Bryant with the Dodgers Joc Pederson for most homers by any rookie this season ... in addition to his 94 RBI, Bryant leads major league rookies in OBP (.369), slugging (.499) and OPS (.868) among several other categories.

**FIRST THING IS FIRST:** Thanks to two runs in yesterday's opening frame, the Cubs have scored in the first inning in 10 of their last 13 contests (15 runs total).  
© Moreover, the Cubs have plated first-inning runs in five-straight games against the Cardinals, including two or more runs in each of the last four.

**JOE AT THE HELM:** The Cubs have won 87 games in Joe Maddon's first season as the team's skipper ... only three managers have recorded more victories in their first season at the helm of the Cubs: Johnny Evers (88 wins in 1913), Jim Frey (96 in 1984) and Dusty Baker (88 in 2003).

**THEY'RE (FIGURATIVELY) ON FIRE:** Starlin Castro is hitting .394 (28-for-71) with five homers and 15 RBI in his last 23 games since August 23 ... Tommy La Stella is hitting .467 (7-for-15) with four doubles and six RBI in his last eight games.

© Kris Bryant in his last 30 games since August 19 has hit .353 (41-for-116) with 10 doubles, a triple, nine home runs and 29 RBI.

**COMFORTS OF HOME:** Chicago has won five-straight home games, 11 of its last 13 and 18 of its last 22 games at Wrigley Field ... the Cubs are 45-28 at Wrigley Field this season ... the Cubs won 41 home games all of last year (41-40) ... the 45 home wins this season are the team's most since winning 46 in 2009.

© The Cubs have tied a franchise record by hitting at least one home run in 17-straight home games dating to August 12 ... the team last turned the trick in 17-consecutive home contests, July 9-August 17, 1961.

© This is the third of a 10-game homestand vs. St. Louis (2-0), Milwaukee (3 games starting tomorrow), Pittsburgh (3 games beginning Friday) and Kansas City (a make-up game on September 28).

**JAKE'S STREAK CONTINUES:** Jake Arrieta on Wednesday recorded his 17th-straight quality start dating to June 21 in Minnesota, tying a franchise mark since 1914 ... he's gone 13-1 with a 1.01 ERA (14 ER/125.0 IP) and 120 strikeouts in those 17 starts ... the only other instance in club history in which a Cubs pitcher recorded 17-straight quality starts was done by Lon Warneke in 1933.

© Arrieta leads the majors with 19 victories this season ... his 1.96 ERA and .195 opponent batting average rank second-lowest in the majors behind the Dodgers Zack Greinke (1.65 and .189) ... Arrieta has a 0.95 ERA since the All-Star Break, which would be the second-lowest ERA after the break in major league history.

© Arrieta aims to become Chicago's first 20-game winner since Jon Lieber went 20-6 in 2001 ... the last Cubs pitcher younger than 30 to win 20 games was Greg Maddux in 1992 (20 wins).

**CURRENT EVENTS:** The Cubs have 14 regular season games remaining ... including this five-game winning streak, the team has six winning streaks of at least five games this season, including four since the start of August ... following this 10-game homestand, Chicago closes out the regular season schedule with a six-game trip at Cincinnati (3 games starting Sept. 29) and Milwaukee (3 games starting October 2).

© The Cubs currently hold onto the second N.L. Wild Card spot, 1.0-game behind the Pirates, who hold the top Wild Card spot.

© Today is the 14th game (9-4) of a stretch in which 17 of the Cubs final 27 games this season will come on the road.

**THIS IS ON THE RECORD:** At 87-61 (.588), the Cubs are on pace for 95 victories and currently own the third-best record in the majors ... in the last 75 years, the Cubs have finished a season with a better winning percentage only three times (1945: 98-56, .636; 2008: 97-64, .602; 1984: 96-65, .596).

© The Cubs have gone 36-15 in their last 51 games starting July 27, the day after enduring a three-game sweep to the Phillies at Wrigley Field ... Chicago's 36 wins are the most in the majors in that span, one ahead of the Blue Jays.

© With 45 home victories and 42 road victories this season, Chicago joins St. Louis as the only teams in baseball to have at least 42 victories both at home and on the road (St. Louis is 50-24 at home, 42-32 on the road).

**REACHING 30:** Anthony Rizzo on Thursday hit his 30th homer of the year ... with 32 homers last year, Rizzo is just the second left-handed hitting Cub to record multiple 30-homer campaigns ... Billy Williams had five 30-plus homer seasons for Chicago between 1964-72 ... moreover, Rizzo has been hit by a pitch 29 times ... the only major league player to hit 30 homers and be hit by 30 pitches in a season is Boston's Don Baylor in 1986 (31 homers, 35 hit by pitches).

**ABOUT THE BATS:** Chicago has recorded an extra-base hit in 52-straight games since July 26, the day after they were no-hit by Cole Hamels and the Phillies ... this 52-game stretch is the team's longest since recording at least one extra-base knock in 52-consecutive games from July 3-August 30, 2011 ... the Cubs had a 53-game stretch, June 23-August 20, 2009.

**THESE ROOKIES CAN RAKE:** Chicago's rookies have combined to hit 63 home runs this season, the highest total all-time by a Cubs rookie class, and tied for the fifth-highest total by a rookie class in N.L. history, which also includes the 2006 Florida Marlins (112); 1958 San Francisco Giants (85); 1999 Florida Marlins (77); 2007 Arizona Diamondbacks (66); and 1972 San Francisco Giants (63) ... thanks to STATS, Inc. for its research assistance.

**THEY'RE MADE TO BE BROKEN:** Kris Bryant has upped his season total to 94 RBI, breaking the club's all-time rookie RBI record of 86 held by Billy Williams (in 1961) and Geovany Soto (in 2008) ... Kris has 24 more RBI than any other rookie in all of baseball.

### 2015 Season

Jon today makes his 30th start of the season and league-leading 19th at home ... has gone 6-4 with a 2.76 ERA (29 ER/94.2 IP) in his last 14 starts, including his 12th-career complete game, September 15 at Pittsburgh.

- Ⓞ His four double-digit strikeout games are a single-season franchise record for a left-handed pitcher ... the last Cub with more double-digit strikeout games in a season is Rich Harden, who recorded five such outings in 2008.
- Ⓞ Righties are batting .239 (127-for-531) off the southpaw, while lefties are hitting .259 (42-for-162) ... opponents have a .312 batting average on balls in play.
- Ⓞ Has posted a 2.64 ERA (25 ER/85.1 IP) in 13 day starts compared to a 4.01 ERA (44 ER/98.2 IP) in 16 night outings.
- Ⓞ Tossed 7.0-shutout innings as he collected his first win with the Cubs, May 1 vs. Milwaukee ... retired 15 of his final 16 Brewers hitters, including his final 10 batters ... also tossed 7.0-scoreless frames July 1 (@ NYM) and July 18 (@ ATL).
- Ⓞ Collected the win in four-consecutive starts from May 1-16, his longest streak since April 17-May 3, 2011 (four starts).
- Ⓞ Went a career-high 10-straight starts without a win from May 22 to July 11, despite posting a 3.50 ERA (24 ER/61.2 IP) during the span
- Ⓞ Finished June with a 0-3 record over five starts with a 5.74 ERA (17 ER/26.2 IP) after going 4-1 with a 1.76 ERA (8 ER/41.0 IP) in six May starts ... in the month of May, ranked tied for third in the N.L. in wins (4), seventh in ERA (1.76) and third in innings pitched (41.0).
- Ⓞ Took a no-hitter into the eighth inning at Atlanta, July 19, before surrendering a single to A.J. Pierzynski to lead off the frame ... allowed just two hits in 7.1 innings as he picked up his first win since May 16.
- Ⓞ Struck out a season-high 14 batters, July 29 vs. Colorado ... was the most strikeouts by a Cubs lefty since at least 1914 and the most by a Cubs pitcher since Mark Prior struck out 16 batters, September 30, 2004 vs. Cincinnati.
- Ⓞ Posted a 1.66 ERA (8 ER/43.1 IP) in July, going at least 7.0 innings in each of his six starts ... struck out 50 batters in a calendar month for the first time in his career ... first Cubs pitcher since at least 1914 with 50 or more strikeouts and five or five fewer walks in a calendar month ... led all pitchers in July with 50 strikeouts and 43.1 innings pitched ... ranked seventh in the N.L. in average against (.183) and ninth in ERA (1.66).
- Ⓞ Went at least 7.0 innings in seven-straight starts, July 1-August 7 ... was the longest streak by a Cubs pitcher since Carlos Zambrano went seven-straight starts from June 28-August 2, 2005.

### Last Time Out

Jon recorded his first complete game with the Cubs, and 12th overall, as the Cubs topped the Buccos, 2-1, in the nightcap of the doubleheader last Tuesday ... retired his final seven batters faced ... earned his 10th win of the season.

### Career Notes

Jon became the 22nd-active pitcher, and the sixth lefty, to reach 1,500 strikeouts when he fanned Pittsburgh's Sean Rodriguez in the third inning, May 16 ... signed a six-year major league contract with the Cubs in December of 2014.

- Ⓞ A three-time All-Star and two-time World Series Champion, he has twice finished fourth in A.L. Cy Young award voting, doing so in 2010 and 2014.
- Ⓞ Has surpassed the 200.0 inning mark in three-straight seasons and in six of the last seven.
- Ⓞ Became the first left-handed Opening Day starter for the Cubs since Terry Mulholland in 1997 ... Mulholland was also the last Cubs starter to make his Cubs debut on Opening Day.
- Ⓞ Ranks sixth among active left-handed pitchers with 1,642 strikeouts and fourth with 8.30 strikeouts per nine innings.
