**LEADING OFF:** Today LAA plays the second contest of a six-game divisional road trip (0-1) to **Oakland** (June 17-19; 0-1) and **Houston** (June 20-22)...Last night marked the ninth time losing in opponent's last at-bat in 2016...Angels went 3-3 on the six-game homestand vs. **Cleveland** (1-2) and **Minnesota** (2-1)...Halos have dropped eight of 11 and 14 of last 22 affairs but have won two of three...**LAA is 7-12-3 in 22 series in 2016**...Club is 5-10 in June (11-13 in April, 13-15 in May)...Angels haven't opened with three consecutive losing months since 2006 (does not include March).

**TIM TIME TODAY:** On May 20<sup>th</sup>, the Angels today signed two-time N.L. Cy Young Award winner **Tim Lincecum** to a 2016 contract. **Today he makes his first Major League start since June 27, 2015 vs. Colorado**. Lincecum, 32, has pitched nine MLB seasons (all with SF) with a 108-83 record, 10 complete games, seven shutouts and a 3.61 ERA (1643.2 IP – 660 ER). He is one of four pitchers all-time to have won back-to-back NL Cy Young Awards, doing so in 2008 and 2009 and has been named to the N.L. All-Star team four times (2008-11). "The Freak" has tossed two no-hitters: July 13, 2013 at San Diego and June 25, 2014 vs. San Diego.

**HELLO, MY NAME IS...**Angels have used 42 players (22 pitchers, 20 positional) this season (**Lincecum** is the 42nd)... Club record is 54 players in 2014.

**FAST FACTS:** Since 2012, **Mike Trout's** 11 HRs (39 G) in Oakland Coliseum are most by any visiting player...In the same span (2013-16), Trout has 25 RBI & 33 runs in Oakland...**Kole Calhoun** has seven hits in 17 at-bats (.412) vs. the A's to lead Angels this season...**Calhoun** ranks third in A.L. with a .358 (43/120) road clip.

**DRAFT UPDATE:** Angels have signed 28 of their 40 draft picks the latest being 4<sup>th</sup> round pick **RHP Christopher Rodriguez**... Halos have signed four of five first round picks (see below).

**THIS N' THAT:** Trout leads all A.L. outfielders with 1,812,731 All-Star votes...**Halos have hit into 62 double plays (67 G), second-most in MLB**...15 pickoffs by Angels' pitching this season leads Majors (no MLB team has more than 9 PO)...**Halo batters have fewest strikeouts in all of baseball (403)**...**Mike Trout** is just sixth player since 1901 to log 400 BB and score 500 runs prior to age-25 season: **Mel Ott, Mickey Mantle, Ted Williams, Jimmie Foxx and Arky Vaughan**... Angels' current active roster features five players from Venezuela (**J. Alvarez, J. Chacin, C. Perez, G. Petit and D. Guerra**).

**ASTROS ON DECK:** Clubs will meet 19 times in 2016...**Houston took two of three in first meeting, May 27-29 in Anaheim**... Astros claimed 2015 season series 10-9...**LAA is 15-7 in last 22 home games vs. Astros but 5-11 in last 16 at Minute Maid Park**...**Pujols' 52 HRs are most all-time vs. Astros**...Seven of last 19 hits for **Pujols** against Houston are home runs.

**@ OAKLAND:** Halos have won five of last six games at Coliseum...**LAA is 7-2 in last nine overall matchups with A's**... In April, LAA completed first three-game road sweep of Oakland since Sept. 3-5, 2012...Angels have won 11 of last 15 overall games...LAA claimed 2015 series 11-8 (5-4 on road)...**Halos have won 20 of last 28 matchups**...**Since 2002, Angels (6) or Athletics (5) have won 11 of 14 A.L. **HOT HALOS:** Six of last 13 hits for **Jefry Marte** are for extra-bases (4 HR, 2 2B)...Has three HRs & seven RBI his last eight starts...**Gregorio Petit** is batting .375 (15/40) with six runs, seven doubles, one HR and six RBI in 13 games this month...**Has multiple hits in five of last 10 games and seven doubles over his last 13 affairs**...**Johnny Giavotella** is 11 for 29 (.379) over his last seven games (4 2B, 2 HR)...He logged his first career four-hit game Monday night...**Kole Calhoun** has 28 runs his last 32 games...Has collected 13 RBI his last 15 games...Since being recalled from Triple A Salt Lake on May 11, **Matt Shoemaker** has pitched to a 2.70 ERA (53.1 IP - 16 ER) with 61 strikeouts and five walks.

**REHAB UPDATES:** RHP **Nick Tropeano** (right shoulder tightness) threw a bullpen session Monday...**Tyler Skaggs** has ceased throwing and will be evaluated daily at Tempe, AZ (shoulder tightness)...**Cliff Pennington** will rehab his strained hamstring in Tempe next week...**Geovany Soto** continues with baseball activities and could begin a rehab assignment next week.

**THE MANAGER:** **Mike Scioscia** is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (17<sup>th</sup> season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club...His 17 years with the Angels are tied with **Sparky Anderson** (Detroit, 1979-95) for second longest tenure with an A.L. team (trailing only **Connie Mack's** 50 seasons with Philadelphia)...**Scioscia's** 1,444 wins rank 24<sup>th</sup> on the MLB all-time list (23<sup>rd</sup> is **Earl Weaver**; 1,481).

June 18

(1986) Hall of Famer **Don Sutton** recorded his 300th career win, defeating Texas (5-1; 9 IP, 3 H, 1 ER, 1 HR, 3 SO), becoming the 19th pitcher in MLB history to reach the plateau; (2007) **Chone Figgins** became the first player in MLB to go 6-for-6 with a walk-off hit since **Jim Northrup** with Tigers Aug. 18, 1969 (2-run HR in 13th)...His six hits tied an A.L. record for a 9-inning game.

June 19

(1976) **Ron Jackson, Bob Jones** and **Mario Guerrero** each hit home runs in the fifth inning of the Angels' 5-3 win vs. Boston.

*Making Angels debut and first Major League start since June 27, 2015*

- Making first Major League start of the season and Angels debut.
- **BECOMING A HALO:** Signed a 2016 contract with Angels on May 20 following a 41 pitch showcase for Major League scouts and executives in Scottsdale, Ariz. on May 6.
- **ANGEL COUNT:** Becomes 42<sup>nd</sup> different player used by Angels this season and 44<sup>th</sup> different player to appear on the active roster this season (**Lucas Luetge** and **Chris Jones** both did not pitch while on Angels active roster)...10<sup>th</sup> different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...Franchise record is 54 players in 2014.
- **WITH THE BEES:** Cleared waivers and was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake on May 22...Made three starts for Bees and went 0-2 with a 2.65 ERA (17 IP – 5 ER)...Six of seven total runs allowed (two unearned) with Salt Lake, came during first inning.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Worked seven scoreless innings in last start for Salt Lake on June 12 at Fresno allowing just one hit and one walk with eight strikeouts...Carried no-hitter into sixth innings before single by Tyler Heineman leading off the 6<sup>th</sup> for the Grizzlies.
- **BACK IN THE BAY:** Angels debut today comes just 16 miles from AT&T Park where he played the first nine seasons of his Major League career for San Francisco...With the Giants, he was a member of three World Series Champion teams (2010, 2012 & 2014), was a four-time All-Star (2008-11) and won the National League Cy Young Award in 2008 & 2009...He also tossed two no-hitters and led the N.L. in strikeouts three times.
- **RETURNING TO THE SHOW:** Today marks first Major League appearance since June 27, 2015 for San Francisco vs. Colorado...He exited that start after taking a line drive off right elbow (hit by D.J. LeMahieu) and was placed on disabled list for first time in career....Underwent season ending surgery on left hip on Sept. 3.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In 10 career starts vs. Oakland, is 5-3 with a 2.70 ERA (66.2 IP – 20 ER)...Today marks first start against the A's since May 29, 2013...Won five consecutive starts vs. Oakland from June 28, 2008 – May 21, 2011, while pitching to a 0.64 ERA (42 IP – 3 ER) in that span, including three complete games and two shutouts...Five wins and 10 games against Athletics are his most against any American League opponent.
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** In four career starts at the Coliseum, is 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA (28 IP – 6 ER)...Today marks first appearance in Oakland since June 22, 2012...Is seeking first win at the Coliseum since June 23, 2009, when he earned a complete game victory with 12 strikeouts and one run allowed.
- **CAREER NOTES:** In 269 career regular season games (261 starts), is 108-83 with a 3.61 ERA (1643.2 IP – 660 ER) and 1,704 strikeouts.
