## SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (61-44) vs. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (48-59)

Tuesday, August 2, 2016 – Citizens Bank Park – 7:05 p.m. EDT – Game 108; Home 52

LHP Madison Bumgarner (10-6, 2.09) vs. RHP Zach Eflin (3-4, 4.23)

- SUNDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies lost to the Atlanta Braves, 2-1, at Turner Field ... Starter Jerad Eickhoff was cruising before a 24-minute rain delay ended his afternoon ... He was removed after completing 5.0 scoreless innings on only 51 pitches ... The clubs traded zeroes for the first six innings before Jeff Francoeur hit a 2-run home run in the 7<sup>th</sup> inning off Andrew Bailey ... Jimmy Paredes broke the shut out with a solo homer in the 8<sup>th</sup>, but that was the only offense the Phillies could muster on the afternoon ... Philadelphia went 0-for-4 with runners in scoring position.
- TRANACTIONS:** Prior to tonight's game, **RHP Andrew Bailey** was designated for assignment ... To fill his spot on the 25-man roster, **RHP Luis Garcia** was recalled from Lehigh Valley (AAA) ... Garcia was riding an 8.0 inning scoreless streak at the time of his promotion and was 6-for-6 in save opportunities over the streak (7/14-30).
- RISPY BUSINESS:** After going 0-for-4 with runners in scoring position in Sunday's 2-1 loss to Atlanta, the Phillies are now just 14 for their last 104 (.135 AVG) over their previous 14 games with RISP (7/18-current) ... Overall, the Phils are batting .221 with RISP this season which ranks 28<sup>th</sup> in the majors, in front of only the New York Yankees (.221) and New York Mets (.205).
- TOM TERRIFIC:** Phillies rookie first baseman **Tommy Joseph** just completed the best month of his young career ... Over 22 games in July, Joseph batted .328 (22-67) with a .408 on-base percentage and .657 slugging % ... Joseph's 1.065 OPS ranked sixth among all players with at least 75 plate appearances during the month, trailing only CIN's Joey Votto (1.176), WSH's Daniel Murphy (1.165), LAD's Yasmani Grandal (1.130), SD's Ryan Schimpf (1.130) and BOS' Mookie Betts (1.105) ... The 24-year-old has increased his patience at the plate of late, posting a 11.9% walk rate over his last 18 games (8 BB, 67 PA, 7/5-curr.) ... Joseph walked only three times over his first 145 plate appearances in the majors (2.1% BB rate, 5/13-7/4).
- IRON MAIK:** Third baseman **Maikel Franco** enters tonight with 19 home runs, needing only one long ball to become the first Phillies third baseman to hit 20 home runs in a season since **Scott Rolen** hit 25 in 2001 ... With 55 games left in the 2016 season, Franco could become just the third Phillies third baseman to ever reach the 30 home run plateau ... Hall-of-Famer **Mike Schmidt** reached 30 home runs 11 times (1974-77, 1979-84 & 1987) and Rolen did so once (1998).
- A GIANT PROBLEM:** The Phillies and Giants meet for their 12<sup>th</sup> ever series at Citizens Bank Park ... Philadelphia has lost each of the last five sets against the Giants at CBP (5-11, 7/26/11-current), with their last series win at home coming six years ago from August 17-19, 2010 (2-1) ... Overall, the Phillies have lost five of six, and 14 of their last 18 games to the Giants (7/31/13-current) ... Philadelphia has just one series win versus San Francisco since the beginning of the 2012 season (1-8 in 9 series; 9-19 record), which came from May 6-8, 2013 at AT&T Park.
- HONORING THE STARS:** On Thursday, August 4 at 8:00 p.m., Comcast SportsNet will air "*They Said We Couldn't Play: An Oral History of the Philadelphia Stars*," a special documentary on the history of the Philadelphia Stars Negro League Baseball Team ... The 90-minute program dives into their story of prejudice, comradeship, injustice, triumph and their pure love of the game ... Narrated by Phillies first baseman **Ryan Howard**, this documentary provides an eyewitness account to history by the men who lived it ... It also chronicles the efforts made by the Phillies and many others to keep their legacy alive ... "The legacy of the Philadelphia Stars Negro League Baseball Team is one that should be passed on from generation to generation," said Phillies Chairman **David Montgomery**. "This new documentary captures an important era in baseball history. The spirit and tenacity that is the Philadelphia Stars is indisputable, and we are honored to have the opportunity to share their story."
- WALK THIS WAY:** The Phillies have drawn 32 walks over their previous seven games (7/25-current), including a season-high eight walks on July 30 at Atlanta ... Philadelphia ranks fourth among all Major League teams in that stretch, behind only the Chicago Cubs (39) and Milwaukee Brewers (34) & Toronto Blue Jays (34) ... The Phils are averaging one walk per 8.41 plate appearances in that span which ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in the majors to only the Cubs (8.15 PA/BB).
- ON THIS DATE IN PHILLIES HISTORY:** August 2, 1970: **Tony Taylor** hits a walk-off grand slam vs the San Francisco Giants at Connie Mack Stadium ... It was the first Ultimate Grand Slam (GS to win the game in the last inning while down by 3 runs) in club history ... To this day, only 28 players in Major League history have accomplished the feat (last: DET's Rajai Davis, 6/30/14 vs OAK) ... Bo Diaz is the only other Phillie in history to have done so, April 13, 1983 versus the Mets.
