SUNDAY FUNDAY: The Padres will put the finishing touches on the first leg of their current 10-game, 11-day, three-city roadtrip this afternoon in St. Louis, as they will look to earn a series victory after winning each of the first two games of this four-game set, but dropping yesterday's game by a score of 2-1... following this afternoon's game, the Friars will head to the "Steel City" of Pittsburgh where they will play a three-game set (Monday-Wednesday) against the Pirates... finally, the Padres will head to Dallas next Wednesday night, where they will enjoy and off-day on Thursday before playing a three-game series against the Texas Rangers to conclude the first half.

- San Diego is coming off a five-game, six-day homestand, during which they won two of three games against the Arizona Diamondbacks (2-1) and lost both games against the Seattle Mariners (2-2).

LOOKING FOR A HAPPY FLIGHT: With a win this afternoon over the Cardinals, the Padres would secure their fourth road series win of the season and their first since taking two of three games from the Reds in Cincinnati from June 5-7.

- A series win for the Friars would be their first in St. Louis since taking two of three games against the Redbirds under the Gateway Arch from March 31 - April 3, 2011... the only other series the Padres have won at new Busch Stadium since it opened in 2006 was the first series the Padres ever played here: September 25-27, 2006.
- Home or road, the Padres earned their last series victory over St. Louis last season at Petco Park from July 29-31 (2-1).
- The Padres have only won four four-game series in franchise history against St. Louis: May 5-8, 2005 at STL (3-1), May 29 - June 1, 1998 vs. STL (3-1), June 21-24, 1991 at STL (3-1) and July 14-17, 1988 at STL (3-1).

PADRES VS. THE GAUNTLET: Through 83 games this season, the Padres have played 56 games (27-29) against opponents with a .500 record or better, the highest total in Major League Baseball, one ahead of the Milwaukee Brewers, who have played 55 such games.

- Each of the Padres remaining seven games of the first half are against opponents currently with a record of .500 or better as they will play the series finale this afternoon against the Cardinals (52-28), three against the Pirates (46-34) and three against the Rangers (41-41).

KEEP YOUR ENEMIES CLOSE: Despite yesterday afternoon's 2-1 loss to the Cardinals, the Padres are 22-17 (.564) this season in games decided by two or fewer runs, tied for the seventh-best record in Major League Baseball in this scenario and the fourth-best in the NL, trailing only Washington (21-13, .618), Chicago-NL (23-16, .590). and St. Louis (25-19, .568)

- In games decided by exactly two runs, the Padres own a 12-5 record (.706), the best mark in Major League Baseball.

THAT'S QUALITY: Through 82 games this season, the Padres starting pitching rotation has thrown 51 quality starts (6.0 IP, 3-or-fewer earned runs allowed), tied for the second-highest total in Major League Baseball, trailing only the St. Louis Cardinals, who have 54.

TURNING IT AROUND: Over his last six starts since June 2, Ian Kennedy has posted a 2-2 record with a 2.31 ERA (9 ER, 35.0 IP) and 33 strikeouts against just nine walks while limiting the opposition to a .242 batting average.

- Over his last eight starts, has gone 2-4 with a 3.63 ERA (18 ER, 44.2 IP)... removing his start on May 28 when he allowed seven runs on seven hits over 3.2 innings pitched, he's gone 2-1 with a 2.41 ERA (11 ER, 41.0 IP).
- Started the season 2-3 with a 6.75 ERA (22 ER, 29.1 IP) over his first six starts.

JUNE BOOM: Kennedy has allowed exactly one earned run in each of his last four starts, which were also his final four starts of June (since June 13)... during that time, has pitched to a 2-1 record with a 1.50 ERA (4 ER, 24.0 IP) and 19 strikeouts against seven walks while limiting the opposition to a .205 batting average... has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last six starts since the beginning of June (2.31 ERA - 9 ER, 35.0 IP).

- Kennedy's 2.31 ERA last month was the seventh-best mark in the NL.
- Having posted a 7.15 ERA (31 ER, 39.0 IP) in his first eight starts of the season in April and May, the 4.84 run difference between his pre-June ERA and his June ERA (2.31) was the largest in Major League Baseball, significantly better than SEA Taijuan Walker, who is second in this category at -4.10 (6.18 ERA pre-June, 2.01 in June).
- Kennedy limited left-handed hitters to a .167 batting average last month (12-for-72), tied for the third-best mark in the Majors and the NL (min 50 batters faced).

GYORK-STORE'S ST. LOUIS LOCATION: During this three game set in St. Louis, Jedd Gyorko has hit .462/.462/.769 (6-for-13) with a double, a home run and two RBI... in five games since being recalled from Triple-A on June 30, has hit .368/.368/.579 (7-for-19) with a double, a home run and two RBI.

- Gyorko owns a lifetime .361/.400/.656 (22-for-61) line with three doubles, five home runs and 16 RBI in 16 career games against the Redbirds, tied for his highest home run total against a single opponent (also Colorado) and his highest RBI total against any single opponent.

HOT AS THE SOL (ARTE): Over his last eight games since June 25, Yangervis Solarte has hit .357/.379/.786 (10-for-28) with seven extra-base hits (four doubles, one triple, two home run) and four RBI.

- Has logged an extra-base hit in five consecutive games since June 30 vs. Seattle, the longest such streak by a Padres player this season and the longest since Seth Smith also had a five game streak from May 8-13 of last season... the last Padres player to record an extra-base hit in six consecutive games was Adrian Gonzalez from August 11-16, 2009.
- Has seven extra-base hits in his last eight games since 6/25... the only game he did not record an XBH in that tie was on June 28 vs. Arizona.

MR. ALONS-ROAD: Yonder Alonso is hitting .363/.459/.441 (37-for-102) with five doubles, one home run and 13 RBI in 29 road games this season, the third-best batting average and on-base percentage of any Major Leaguer with at least 100 plate appearances away from their home ballpark.

- Has reached base safely in 13 consecutive starts on the road since June 8, hitting .292 (14-for-48) in that time... dating back to July 26 of last season, Alonso has reached base safely in 32 of his last 33 starts on the road, hitting .390 (46-for-118) in that time.
- Overall, regardless of location, Alonso has hit .307/.394/.396 (59-for-192) this season, the 12th-best batting average and fifth-best on-base percentage of any NL players with at least 175 PA.
- Since being activated from the 15-day disabled list on June 2, has hit .286/.364/.362 (30-for-105).

UPTON HERE, UPTON HERE: Justin Upton has reached base safely in each of his last 21 road games, tied for the 12th-longest such streak by a Padres player since the 2000 season and the longest since Chase Headley went 37 consecutive games from May 28 - August 11, 2012... his current streak is tied for the ninth-longest such streak by a Major Leaguer this season and the fourth-longest active streak.

- Is 16-for-16 in stolen bases this season, one of two Major League players with 10-or-more stolen bases and no caught stealings, with Washington's Denard Span having also done so (11-for-11).
- Upton also has 14 home runs on the season, making him the only player in Major League Baseball with his combination of home runs (14) and stolen bases (16).
- Upton is the third player in Padres franchise history to record 14+ home runs and 16+ stolen bases before the All-Star Break, joining Reggie Sanders in 1999 (15 HR, 20 SB) and Ryan Klesko in 2001 (17 HR, 17 SB).

TODAY'S STARTER

#22 IAN KENNEDY - RHP

FOR STARTERS: Ian Kennedy will take the mound for the Padres this afternoon against the Cardinals in what will be his 15th start of the season and his seventh on the road.

- Took the loss in his last outing on June 30 vs. Seattle at Petco Park after he allowed four runs, one earned, on four hits with five strikeouts against one walk.
- Over his last 12 starts since coming off the DL on April 25, has worked 6.0 innings or more with two earned or less seven times and gone less than 6.0 innings with five-or-more runs four times.
- Padres are 6-8 in his 14 starts overall.
- Had a stint on the 15-day DL from April 10-25 with a strained left hamstring.
- Recorded his 1,000th career strikeout in his outing on 5/28 vs. PIT.

TURNING IT AROUND: Over his last six starts since June 2, Kennedy has posted a 2-2 record with a 2.31 ERA (9 ER, 35.0 IP) and 33 strikeouts against just nine walks while limiting the opposition to a .242 batting average.

- Over his last eight starts, has gone 2-4 with a 3.63 ERA (18 ER, 44.2 IP)...removing his start on May 28 when he allowed seven runs on seven hits over 3.2 innings pitched, he's gone 2-1 with a 2.41 ERA (11 ER, 41.0 IP).

HE'S GOT SENIORITY, IN THE SENIOR CIRCUIT: After being drafted by the New York Yankees and traded to the Arizona Diamondbacks prior to the start of the 2010 season, Kennedy has spent his last six seasons in the National League for the D-backs and Padres, landing on the DL just once in the span earlier this season from April 10-25.

- Among all pitchers in the National League since 2010, his 176 games started are the most in the NL, one ahead of Clayton Kershaw.
- His 1,080.2 innings pitched in the NL since 2010 rank third-most, behind Kershaw (1213.2) and Hamels (1171.0).
- His 993 strikeouts since 2010 are the fifth-most by an NL pitcher, behind Kershaw, Hamels, Tim Lincecum and Madison Bumgarner.
- His 69 wins since 2010 rank sixth-most in the NL.

VS. ST. LOUIS: Kennedy will be making his seventh career start and appearance against the Cardinals this afternoon, having pitched to a 2-4 record with a 9.00 ERA (16 ER, 16.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts against 12 walks with the opposition hitting .314 against him.

- Made his last appearance against St. Louis on June 6, 2013 at Busch Stadium, allowing a career-high 10 runs on a career-high 13 hits, taking the loss.
- In three career outings in St. Louis, Kennedy owns a 1-2 record with a 9.00 ERA (16 ER, 16.0 IP) with six home runs, 12 strikeouts and seven walks.
- In 41 career starts and appearances against National League Central opponents, owns a lifetime 18-14 record with a 4.71 ERA (130 ER, 248.2 IP)...took the loss in his only app against a NL Central opponent this season (5/28 vs. PIT).
