**AT A GLANCE:** Tonight the Yankees play one game at Kansas City as the make-up of a rainout on 6/9...after tonight's game, will travel to Detroit for a three-game series from Tuesday-Thursday, followed by a three-game set in Toronto from Friday-Sunday...just completed a six-game homestand, going 4-2 (1-2 vs. Houston and 3-0 vs. Chicago-AL).

- ▶ Have won four straight games...are 12-8 over their last 20G since 8/2...are 20-14 since the All-Star break.
- ▶ Swept their three-game series vs. the White Sox from Friday-Sunday...was their sixth sweep of the season and fourth at home...was their fourth home season series sweep of Chicago-AL in the last nine seasons (also 2006, '09 and '13).
- ▶ Are 15-8 (.652) in home games since the All-Star break.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** On Sunday, the Yankees completed their three-game sweep of the White Sox, winning in "walk-off" fashion in a 7-4, 10-inning contest...was their fifth "walk-off" win of the season and second of the series (also a 4-3, nine-inning win on Friday)...**PH Brian McCann** (1-for-1) hit a pinch-hit, three-run "walk-off" HR in the 10th inning...**CF Ichiro Suzuki** (2-for-4) drove in two runs on a sixth-inning single, marking the first RBI by a left-handed batter off White Sox starter Chris Sale since Joe Mauer on 8/17/13 (credit: *Elias*)...**LHP Chris Capuano** started and did not record a decision, allowing 3ER in 6.0IP (6H, 0BB, 5K, 2HR, 1HP)...**RHP David Robertson** (1.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 1K, 1HR) allowed a solo HR to Avisail Garcia to lead off the ninth inning, snapping a stretch of 22 straight converted save chances (since 6/5).

**THEY SAY IT'S YOUR BIRTHDAY:** Today **RHP Adam Warren** turns 27 years old (DOB: 8/25/87).

**IN A PINCH:** Brian McCann entered Sunday's win as a 10th-inning pinch-hitter and hit a "walk-off" three-run HR...was his sixth career "walk-off" hit, second of the season (also a single on 7/20 vs. Cincinnati) and third career "walk-off" HR (also 8/29/10 vs. Florida and 5/17/11 vs. Houston, both with Atlanta as a catcher)...was his third career pinch-hit HR (also 8/11/10 at Houston and a game-tying HR on 5/17/11 vs. Houston, both with Atlanta)...was the first pinch-hit, "walk-off" HR by a Yankee since Jason Giambi accomplished the feat vs. Toronto on 6/5/08 (ninth inning off B.J. Ryan).

- ▶ According to *Elias*, was his eighth career extra-inning HR, including at least one in each season since 2009...over the last 20 years (1995-2014), the only other player with a streak of six-or-more straight seasons with extra-inning HRs is Albert Pujols (seven straight from 2003-09).

**SWEET 15: OF Carlos Beltran** hit his 15th HR of the season in Saturday's win vs. Chicago-AL, marking the fifth Major League club with which he has hit at least 15HR in a single season (also w/ Kansas City, Houston, New York-NL and St. Louis)...he is the only active Major Leaguer to have accomplished the feat and is the first since Troy Glaus hit 15HR with a fifth team in 2010, his final year in the Majors (Los Angeles-AL, Arizona, Toronto, St. Louis, and Atlanta, respectively)...the last player to retire having accomplished the feat was Matt Stairs, who last played in 2011 and hit at least 15HR with six teams (Oakland, Chicago-NL, Milwaukee, Pittsburgh, Kansas City and Toronto).

**PRADO OF THE YANKEES:** Over his last eight games, **INF/OF Martin Prado** is batting .406 (13-for-32) with 7R, 2HR, 9RBI and one "walk-off" hit (on Friday vs. Chicago-AL).

**SAVINGS PLAN:** Prior to allowing a game-tying solo HR to Avisail Garcia on Sunday vs. Chicago-AL...**RHP David Robertson** had converted each of his prior 22 save opportunities from 6/5-8/23...was one shy of the longest such streak in the Majors this season (Huston Street, 23 straight from 3/30-7/4)...is one of five pitchers in franchise history to convert 20-or-more save opportunities in a row, joining Mariano Rivera (eight times), John Wetteland (27 from 5/12-7/14/96), Dave Righetti (24 from 7/3-9/22/86) and Goose Gossage (25 from 6/13-9/22/80).

**COMEBACK KIDS:** The Yankees have come from behind in 14 of their last 18 victories (since 7/20)...have overcome deficits of three runs in six of their last 10 come from behind wins.

**THOSE BLANKETY-BLANKS:** Yankees pitchers have tossed nine shutouts in 2014, one shy of their total from 2013 (10)...have tossed at least 8SHO in each of the last seven seasons since 2008, marking their longest such stretch since accomplishing the feat in 17 consecutive seasons from 1971-87.

**IN CONTROL:** Entering tonight's game, Yankees pitchers own the third-highest strikeout-to-walk ratio in modern MLB history (since 1900), according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*...have recorded 1,087K and 322BB (3.38 ratio), trailing only the 2014 Nationals (3.46 entering today) and the 2012 Phillies (3.39).

- ▶ Recorded 10K and 0BB in Sunday's win vs. Chicago-AL...was the fifth time this season they have had at least 10K without walking a batter...only Rays pitchers have produced more such games this season (eight).

**STARTING LINES:** In their last 18G (since 8/4), Yankees starters are 6-4 with a 2.77 ERA (110.2IP, 34ER, 21BB, 106K, 6HR).

- ▶ Have a 3.83 starters ERA (757.0IP, 322ER) in 2014...have had a sub-4.00 starters ERA just twice in the 30 previous seasons from 1984-2013 (3.97 in 2002 and 3.85 in 1998).
- ▶ Yankees starters are 10-3 with a 2.65 ERA (139.1IP, 41ER) in 23 home games since the All-Star break.

**FOUR SCORE:** The Yankees are 32-51 (.386) when scoring four-or-fewer runs, trailing only Baltimore (.410, 32-46) for the second-best such record in the Majors...match the Orioles and Reds (32-59, .352) for the most such wins in the Majors in 2014.

**CLOSE CALLS:** At 42-27 (.609), the Yankees have the Majors' best record in games decided by two-or-fewer runs.

- ▶ Are 21-16 (.568) in one-run games, the second-best record in the AL and fourth-best in the Majors (Miami, 32-20, .615; Los Angeles-NL, .575, 23-17; Baltimore, .568, 25-19).

**MILESTONE K:** In Friday's win vs. Chicago-AL, **RHP David Robertson** notched his 500th career strikeout, accomplishing the feat within his first 376.2 career IP to surpass **David Cone** (500K in first 486.1IP w/ NYY) as the fastest pitcher to reach the plateau in franchise history according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*.

**SPREAD THE WEALTH:** 19 pitchers have earned at least one victory for the Yankees this season, tying Oakland and Texas for most in the Majors...is tied for the third-highest total in Yankees franchise history (2007-22, 1989-20 and 2008-19).

**HOMER HAPPY:** The Yankees have hit 34HR since the All-Star break, tied for third in the AL and tied for sixth in MLB.

- ▶ 19 different Yankees have hit at least 1HR in 2014, most in the AL and tied for third in the Majors (SD-21, ARI-21, WAS-19).

**ROLL CALL:** The Yankees have used 52 players this season (P-30, C-4, INF-11, OF-7), the second-highest total in franchise history (56 in 2013)...27 players made their debut with the team in 2014...eight of those made their MLB debuts (Anna, Greene, Mitchell, Ramirez, Solarte, Tanaka, Wheeler and Whitley).

**TURN STYLES:** Twelve pitchers have started at least one game for the Yankees in 2014, the club's highest single-season total since 2008 (13)...only Colorado (15), Miami (13), Texas (13) and Minnesota (12) — who are a collective 69G below .500 — have used as many or more starters in 2014.

- ▶ The Yankees have started a rookie pitcher 52 times, the highest total in MLB and the fourth-highest in franchise history since "rookie" rules were made in 1958 (1991-54x, 1986-54x, 2007-52x)—credit: *Elias*...the Yankees are 33-19 in games started by rookie pitchers in 2014, including 21-7 on the road.

**JUST TOSSING IT OUT THERE:** The Yankees have had 31 players pitch this season (including INF Dean Anna on 4/19 at Tampa Bay), setting the single-season franchise high (had 28 pitchers in 2011, 2007 and 2005)...it is the second-highest total in the Majors this season, trailing only Texas (36).

**NO ORDINARY JOE:** On Saturday, the Yankees retired uniform No. 6 and unveiled a Monument Park plaque for **Joe Torre**...including Torre's No. 6, the Yankees have 17 retired uniform numbers for 18 players and managers.

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 25, 2011:** The Yankees become the first team ever to hit three grand slams in a game (Cano, Martin and Granderson) en route to defeating the A's, 22-9. Jorge Posada makes his first career appearance at 2B, recording the game's final out on a groundout.

**Aug. 25, 1996:** The Yankees unveil a monument plaque in honor of Mickey Mantle at Yankee Stadium.

**Aug. 25, 1968:** Down 5-0 in Game 1 of a doubleheader vs. Detroit, the Yankees bring in OF Rocky Colavito to pitch and come back to win 6-5, with Colavito earning the victory.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 26, 1960:** The Yankees record a 7-6, "walk-off" victory vs. the Indians after hitting five home runs, including Yogi Berra's 11th-inning solo homer to win it.

**OVERALL FACTS:** The Yankees and Royals are playing the fourth of seven games between the clubs this season, a make-up for a 6/9 rainout in Kansas City...are 1-2 against the Royals this season, 22-15 since the start of the 2009 season and 36-21 since the start of 2007...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have recorded 14 straight non-losing season series vs. Kansas City since 2000, going 11-0-3 (ties in 2011, '08 and '05)...**IN POSTSEASON:** The Yankees have played four postseason series against the Royals, winning the first three (1976 ALCS, 3-2; 1977 ALCS, 3-2; 1978 ALCS, 3-1; and 1980 ALCS, 0-3)...**AT KAUFFMAN STADIUM:** The Yankees are 1-2 at Kauffman Stadium this season, 12-8 since the start of the 2009 season and 21-12 since the start of 2006...the Yankees' .531 winning pct. (110-97) at Kauffman Stadium is the highest all time by an AL opponent in AL games...are 5-1-2 in road season series at KC since 2006 and 13-3-4 since 1994.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MICHAEL PINEDA (2-2, 2.05 ERA)

**RHP Michael Pineda** is making his seventh start of the season tonight at Kansas City...last pitched on 8/20 vs. Houston, earning a no-decision in a 5-2 Yankees loss (6.0IP, 4H, 2R/2ER, 1BB, 3K)...left the game with the Yankees leading, 2-1.

- ✦ **Apr. 24:** Was suspended by MLB for 10 games for possessing a foreign substance during the Yankees' 4/23 game at Boston (was ejected in the second inning of that game).
- ✦ **May 6:** Was reinstated from MLB's suspended list and placed on the 15-day disabled list with a right shoulder muscle injury.
- ✦ **June 3:** Was transferred to the 60-day disabled list.
- ✦ **Aug. 3:** Made his first rehab appearance for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre vs. Syracuse (3.1IP, 3H, 1BB, 4K).
- ✦ **Aug. 8:** Made his second rehab appearance for Triple-A Scranton/WB vs. Columbus (4.1IP, 6H, 1ER, 7K).
- ✦ **Aug. 13:** Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list after missing 87 team games...earned a no-decision at Baltimore in a 5-3 Yankees loss (5.0IP, 2H, 1R/1ER, 0BB, 4K).

**THE UNTOUCHABLES:** Has held opponents to a .211 (156-for-739) batting average in his career, the fourth-lowest mark among active pitchers who have made at least 30 starts (see table on right).

**DAMAGE CONTROL:** Has allowed six-or-fewer hits in each of his last 14 starts, marking the longest active streak in the Majors.

- ✦ Has allowed eight-or-fewer hits in each of his 34 career Major League starts, tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the Majors among pitchers who have made at least one start this season.

**HEAD-TO-HEAD:** Faced the Royals twice in 2011 as a member of the Mariners, producing quality starts on 4/17/11 at Kansas City (6.0IP, W, 3H, 1R/1ER, 4BB, 5K) and 9/10/11 at Seattle (8.0IP, L, 5H, 3R/3ER, 1BB, 8K).

**SHOW SOME SUPPORT:** Has received a total of 12 runs of support in his last 10 Major League starts (0, 0, 2, 0, 0, 4, 2, 0, 2, 2)...is 2-5 with a 2.80 ERA (54.2IP, 17ER) in those 10 starts.

**THE RIGHT STUFF:** Has held *right-handed hitters* to a .189 (66-for-350) batting average in his career, the 11th-lowest mark among active MLB pitchers (min. 300AB vs. RHB).

- ✦ Held right-handed hitters to a .184 (56-for-304) batting average in 2011, the lowest mark in the Majors (min. 225 batters faced).

**ONE AND DONE:** Pineda became the first pitcher to allow one-or-fewer earned runs and pitch at least 6.0 innings in each of his first three games as a Yankee since Kevin Brown accomplished the feat in 2004 (3GS)...produced a 1.00 ERA (18.0IP, 2ER) in his first three starts of the season.

**GIVE ME FIVE:** Pitched at least 6.0 innings and allowed five-or-fewer hits in each of his first three games as a Yankee...became the first pitcher to accomplish the feat since Denny Neagle did so from 7/18-28/00 after being traded from the Reds.

**ALL-STAR BREAK:** According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Pineda became the second player in Major League history to be named an All-Star as a rookie (2011) and not play in the Majors in either of the next two seasons (2012-13)...the other player to do so was Willard Marshall, who was an All-Star rookie outfielder for the 1942 New York Giants before he missed the next three seasons while serving in World War II.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Spent his first six professional seasons in the Mariners organization (2006-11)...was named the Mariners' minor league "Pitcher of the Year" in 2008 and 2010.

- ✦ Made his MLB debut in 2011, earning an All-Star selection and finishing fifth in AL "Rookie of the Year" voting.
- ✦ Held hitters to a .211 (133-for-629) batting average in 2011...prior to Pineda, the last *rookies* to hold opponents to a .211 BA or lower while recording at least 170K and 170.0IP were Hideo Nomo (LAD, 1995), Dwight Gooden (NYM, 1984) and Fernando Valenzuela (LAD, 1981).
- ✦ Was acquired by the Yankees along with RHP Jose Campos in exchange for C/DH Jesus Montero and RHP Hector Noesi on 1/23/12...contract extends through the 2014 season.

**HEAD-TO-HEAD:** Is 3-0 with a 0.46 ERA (19.2IP, 1ER) in his last three starts vs. the Tigers, after failing to win any of his first seven starts against them (0-3).
