VS. ST. LOUIS: The Braves and Cardinals play the finale of a three-game series, as Atlanta seeks to avoid a series sweep...This marks St. Louis' final regular-season game at Turner Field...Atlanta has gone 43-26 in the regular season against the Redbirds at Turner Field.

A The last time the Cards swept the Braves in Atlanta was August 29-31, 1988...St. Louis has never posted a sweep of three-or-more games at Turner Field.

A The Braves won the final four games against St. Louis last season, including a season-ending three-game sweep at Turner Field...The Braves held the Cardinals to seven total runs in their six games last season...The final three games were by shutout (4-0, 6-0, 2-0).

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves today optioned RHP John Gant to Triple-A Gwinnett and recalled RHP Chris Withrow from Gwinnett...Withrow appeared in three games for the Braves in spring training and allowed one run on four hits in 2.1 IP (3.86 ERA), with three walks and two strikeouts.

BONI IS BACK: The Braves have agreed to terms on a minor-league contract with INF/OF Emilio Bonifacio...Bonifacio was with the Braves in spring training and was designated for assignment on April 2...He has been assigned to Triple-A Gwinnett and is expected to join the team in Durham on Monday.

SEEKING FIRST WIN: The Braves have started the season 0-4 and a loss today would mark their first 0-5 start since the 1988 campaign, when they opened the year 0-10...Atlanta also opened at 0-4 in 2012.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Braves have gone 6-for-19 (.316) with runners in scoring position during their first four games...Last season, the Braves hit .263 in these situations, fifth best in the National League and 11th best in the Majors.

ERRORS ADDING UP: The Braves committed three errors last night and have six in their first four games...In the six-season span from 2010-2015, the Braves tied for the third fewest errors in the NL, with just 555.

A The Braves are tied with Oakland and Pittsburgh for the second-most errors in the majors (behind STL, 9).

WELCOME ABOARD!: The Braves have added a new member to the Media Relations staff, with the addition of **Franco Garcia**...Garcia is in his fourth season with the Braves and opens a new chapter in his career as he transitions into the role of Spanish Interpreter, Media Relations...He joined the Braves as a Promotions Trainee in January 2013 and has worked as a Guest Services Coordinator since January 2014...While he will perform a variety of duties, his primary task will be to assist members of media in their interview efforts with the Spanish-speaking players.

STRIKEOUTS: Braves batters have struck out 35 times in the first four games, including seven times last night...Last season, the Braves were the hardest National League team to fan, striking out once every 5.45 plate appearances.

A With the bases loaded last season, Atlanta ranked fifth in the NL with a 5.84 plate appearances per strikeout ratio.

OD ROSTER: The Braves Opening Day roster included four rookies, including RHPs **John Gant**, **Jose Ramirez** and **Dan Winkler**, and OF **Hector Olivera**...Nine players are donning a Braves uniform for the first time in their career this season.

NUMBER SWITCHES: Three Braves switched their uniform numbers from their spring training ones, including players OF **Drew Stubbs** (now No. 2) and RHP **John Gant** (now No. 52)...Bench coach **Carlos Tosca** switched to 32.

DAN WINKLER: Struck out the side in a perfect seventh inning on Monday...The right-hander needed only 11 pitches, throwing 10 for strikes in his outing...Winkler struck out 17 and walked none in 11.0 spring innings this season.

TURNER FIELD: The Braves own an all-time record of 920-621-1 (.597) at Turner Field after moving into the park in 1997.

A Atlanta finished the 2015 home schedule 42-39...The club has not finished below .500 at home since 2009 and they have never won fewer than 40 games in a season at Turner Field.

HALL OF FAME: The Braves announced the team will induct Vice Chairman **John Schuerholz** and OF **Andrew Jones** into the Braves Hall of Fame this summer...The duo will be inducted during a luncheon on August 19 and honored that evening in a pregame ceremony before the Braves play the Washington Nationals.

THE SKIPPER: Manager Fredi Gonzalez begins his sixth season at the helm of the Braves and his 10th season as a Major League manager...He owns a career record of 701-668 (.512) and a record of 425-389 (.522) in five-plus seasons with the Braves.

COUNTDOWN: This season, the Braves will count down to the final Braves game ever at Turner Field, October 2 at 3:10 against the Detroit Tigers...Each of the home games will be counted off the outfield wall.

A Former Braves 1B/OF Ryan Klesko, will remove number 77 today. Klesko wore a Braves uniform from 1992-99.

- Set to make his season debut today...Today will be his 24th career appearance and 21st start.
- Has never faced St. Louis.
- Went 4-3 with a 5.06 ERA in 10 starts at Turner Field last season.

2016 Recap

- Went 0-0 with a 3.27 ERA in five spring games, two starts...Struck out nine over 11.0 innings.

2015 Recap

- Split last season between Triple-A Gwinnett and Atlanta, making his MLB debut and going 7-6 with one save and a 4.78 ERA in 23 games, 20 starts for the Braves...Also landed on the 15-day disabled list from 6/27-7/31, and missed 28 games with a left foot contusion.
- Ranked sixth among NL rookies in wins (7) and innings pitched (116.2). Was one of four NL rookies to toss a complete game, with San Francisco's Chris Heston the only one to throw two...His 20 starts ranked seventh among NL rookies and he became one of 10 Braves pitchers since 1990 to make at least 20 starts in his rookie season.
- Opened the season with the G-Braves before being recalled on 5/6 and making his MLB debut two days later at WSH...Allowed four runs, earned, in relief while getting one out and a no-decision in a 9-2 loss.
- Made his first career start 5/20 vs. TB...Received a no-decision in a 2-1 win despite allowing one run, earned, over 5.0 innings with seven strikeouts. Went 7-6 with a 4.61 ERA (58 ER/113.1 IP) in 20 starts and 0-0 with a save and a 10.80 ERA (4 ER/3.1 IP) in three games out of the bullpen.
- Earned his first career win with 7.0 shutout innings in an 8-0 victory, 5/30 at San Francisco.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.14 ERA (10 ER/42.0 IP) in his first seven starts before going to the DL...In his first seven starts after returning, 7/31-9/2, went 0-6 with a 9.50 ERA (38 ER/36.0 IP)...Over his final five starts of the season, 9/7-9/30, went 3-0 with a 2.35 ERA (8 ER/30.2 IP).
- Tossed a scoreless 11th inning to earn his first save in a 5-3 win, 6/13 at NYM. Became the first Braves pitcher to make at least one start and earn a save in the same season since Kris Medlen in 2012.
- Tossed a complete game on 8/11 at TB, going 8.0 innings and allowing two runs, earned, to become the first Braves rookie to go the distance since 2008, when Jorge Campillo did it on 6/15 at LAA. Became the first Brave with a complete game in one of his first 14 career games since 1990, when Paul Marak tossed a four-hitter to beat Houston on 9/23. Needed 92 pitches to finish the game, the fewest by a Braves pitcher in a complete game since 2000, when Greg Maddux used 89 to beat Florida, 4-0.

- Signed by the Braves as a non-drafted free agent on January 12, 2009.
- Tabbed by the organization as the Mississippi Pitcher of the Year in 2014 after pitching to a 2.91 ERA (43 ER/133.0 IP) over 25 starts and logging a team-leading 94 strikeouts

Jason Grilli • RHP • 6-5 • 235 • 39 yrs • #39

Saves/Opp: 0/1 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/retired:** 2/0 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Failed to convert his first save opportunity of the season on 4/4 vs. WAS, allowing the tying run to score in the ninth...Allowed a run, two hits and a walk...Has walked four over two appearances.
- Went 0-0 with a 6.75 ERA (3 ER/4.0 IP) in four games this spring...Made his 10th Opening Day roster.
- Spent his 14th Major League season with the Atlanta Braves in the closer's role last season and converted 24-of-26 save opportunities while posting a 2.94 ERA over 36 appearances.
- Suffered a season-ending injury on 7/11/15 at COL as he ruptured his left Achilles in the ninth inning while running to cover first base.
- Underwent season-ending surgery to repair his ruptured left Achilles tendon on 7/16/15...The procedure was performed by Dr. James Sferra in Pittsburgh, Pa.
- In '15, became the sixth Braves pitcher to collect 20 saves prior to the All-Star break and is one of three (John Smoltz and Craig Kimbrel) to record at least 24 first-half saves....Ranked fifth in the National League and tied for sixth in the Majors with 24 saves prior to landing on the disabled list.

Jim Johnson • RHP • 6-6 • 250 • 32 yrs • #53

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/retired:** 2/2 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 1/0

- Made his eighth appearance on an Opening Day roster this season.
- Compiled a 0-1 record and a 5.00 ERA in nine games this spring.
- Returns to the Atlanta organization after spending the first four months of the 2015 campaign as a Brave.
- The Braves are his fifth Major League team...He spent the first eight seasons of his career pitching for the Baltimore Orioles before pitching for two teams - Oakland and Detroit - during the 2014 season. In 2015, spent the last two months of the season with the Los Angeles Dodgers.
- Led the American League in saves in back-to-back seasons, collecting 51 saves in 2012 and 50 rescues during the 2013 season. Became just the second pitcher in Major League history to record back-to-back 50-save seasons, joining LAD's Eric Gagne (2002-03).

Eric O'Flaherty • LHP • 6-2 • 220 • 31 yrs • #34

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/retired:** 2/1 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- This season marks his eighth year on an Opening Day roster...Spent 2009-2013 with the Braves.
- Acquired on March 27 from the Pittsburgh Pirates in exchange for cash considerations.
- Went 0-1 with a 2.61 ERA (3 ER/10.1 IP) in 11 games this spring with the Pirates and Braves.
- From 2011-2014, compiled a 1.54 ERA in 182 appearances...That mark was second-lowest among relievers with 150.0 or more innings behind Craig Kimbrel (1.51 ERA).
- Did not get a loss in three seasons from 2012-14 (104 appearances)...Has lost twice this year.
- Has not made an error in his entire MLB career.**
- Led all major league relievers with a 0.98 ERA in 2011.

Alexi Ogando • RHP • 6-4 • 200 • 32 yrs • #40

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/retired:** 2/1 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Made his sixth Opening Day roster...Made his Braves debut, 4/6 vs. WAS...Tossed a scoreless inning.
- Went 0-2 with a 3.52 ERA (3 ER/7.2 IP) in eight games this spring.
- Appeared in a career-high 64 games in his first season with the Red Sox last year...Did not spend time on the major league DL for the first time since 2011.
- In '15, led Boston's staff with 65.1 relief innings, 0.2 shy of his career high set in 2012 with TEX (66.0)...Tied for the staff lead in relief wins with three (also Matt Barnes) and relief appearances (with Tommy Layne).
- Posted a season-best 14.2-inning scoreless streak over a span of 12 games, 6/10-7/2/15...That stretch lowered his ERA from 4.37 on 6/6 to 2.72.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by Oakland in 2002 as a position player. Spent the first four years (2002-05) of his pro career as an outfielder in the Athletics minor league system.

Jose Ramirez • RHP • 6-1 • 215 • 26 yrs • #36

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/retired:** 1/0 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Made his first Opening Day roster...Made his season debut on 4/9 vs. StL and allowed two hits, a walk and one run in 1.0 inning.
- Went 0-2 with a 4.09 ERA (5 ER/11.0 IP) in 11 games this spring.
- Acquired by the Braves from the Seattle Mariners in exchange for a player to be named later (Ryne Harper) on December 4, 2015.
- Split last season between the Seattle Mariners and New York Yankees, also spending time with both organizations' Triple-A clubs...Dealt to the Mariners on 6/30.
- Went 1-0 with a 12.91 ERA (11 ER/7.2 IP) in a combined eight MLB games out of the bullpen in '15.
- Earned his first Major League win on 9/4/15 at OAK, tossing 1.2 perfect innings in an 11-8 victory.
- Began last season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, and recalled for the first time on 5/15...Returned to Triple-A the next day before being recalled again on 6/13.

Arodys Vizcaino • RHP • 6-0 • 230 • 25 yrs • #38

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/retired:** 2/1 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 3/2

- Made his first Opening Day roster...Tossed a scoreless inning on Opening Day with two strikeouts.
- Owns a 11.0-inning scoreless streak (12 games), dating to 9/15/15...**Since the start of last season, 34 of his 38 appearances have been scoreless.
- Went 0-0 and did not allow a run in 7.0 innings over seven games this spring...**Struck out 11.**
- Appeared in a career-high 36 games with Atlanta last season...First recalled from the G-Braves on 7/6...Spent the remainder of the season on the active roster.
- Collected his first career save, 8/6/15 vs. MIA with a scoreless ninth...Earned his second one night later with another scoreless ninth vs. MIA...Finished 9-for-10 in save opportunities after taking over the closer role following Jim Johnson's trade to LAD on 7/30.
- Compiled a career-best 16.2-inning scoreless streak over 16 games from 7/20-9/2/15...His streak ended with a run when he was one out shy of a two-inning save on 9/4 at WAS.
