RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers extended their winning streak to three games as they defeated the Cardinals 4-3 in 10 innings on Saturday at Busch Stadium. With the game tied at three in the 10th inning, Jose Iglesias hit a two-out RBI single, scoring J.D. Martinez with the game-winning run. Miguel Cabrera hit the 400th home run of his career in the win, while Yoenis Cespedes and Ian Kinsler each had three hits and a RBI. Blaine Hardy picked up the win in relief, throwing a scoreless inning with a walk and two strikeouts. Joakim Soria tossed a scoreless 10th inning to notch his 12th save of the season. The Tigers and Cardinals conclude their three-game series tonight. Following tonight's game, Detroit returns home for a seven-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Milwaukee and four games vs. Houston.

CABRERA JOINS 400 HOME RUN CLUB: Miguel Cabrera became the first Venezuelan-born player and the 53rd player in MLB history to hit 400 career home runs with his first inning solo blast off Tyler Lyons on Saturday. At 32 years, 28 days, Cabrera is the third youngest active player to reach the 400 home run milestone, trailing only Alex Rodriguez (29 years, 316 days) and Albert Pujols (30 years, 222 days). Cabrera is also the eighth youngest player all-time to reach 400 career home runs. Cabrera is the second player to hit his 400th home run in a Tigers uniform, joining Darrell Evans, who did so on September 20, 1988 vs. Cleveland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Cabrera is the fourth player to hit milestone home run No. 400 or higher in St. Louis, joining Babe Ruth (No. 600 in 1931 at Sportsman's Park), Willie Stargell (No. 400 in 1977 at Busch Stadium II) and Ken Griffey, Jr. (No. 500 in 2004 at Busch Stadium II).

IGLESIAS COMES THROUGH IN THE CLUTCH: Jose Iglesias delivered the go-ahead hit for the Tigers in the 10th inning of yesterday's game with a two-out, two-strike single off Matt Belisle. For Iglesias, it was his first career go-ahead hit in extra innings. The shortstop has been a clutch performer in late innings this season, hitting .472 (17x36) in the seventh inning-or-later.

KINSLER PILING UP THE MULTI-HIT GAMES: Ian Kinsler was 3x5 with a run scored, a double and a RBI on Saturday to record his 17th multi-hit game of the season. Kinsler's 17 multi-hit games are the most in the American League and are tied for third-most in the majors, trailing only St. Louis' Matt Carpenter and Miami's Dee Gordon, who each have 18 multi-hit games.

SORIA SLAMS THE DOOR: Joakim Soria threw a scoreless 10th inning yesterday vs. the Cardinals to pick up his 12th save of the season. Soria extended his scoreless streak to eight straight outings, a stretch that spans 8.1 innings. In addition, Soria has not allowed a run in 14 of his last 15 appearances. In 18 outings this season, Soria has a 2-0 record with 12 saves and a 1.06 ERA (17.0IP/2ER) with eight hits allowed, three walks and 15 strikeouts. Soria currently ranks second in the American League with 16 games finished, while he is tied for third with 12 saves.

STREAKING: Jose Iglesias and J.D. Martinez each enter tonight's game with a seven-game hitting streak, while Nick Castellanos brings a five-game hitting streak into tonight's contest. Iglesias is batting .346 (9x26) with a run scored and three RBI during his hitting streak, while Martinez is hitting .417 (10x24) with five runs scored, a double, two home runs and two RBI over his last seven games. Castellanos is hitting .421 (8x19) with two runs scored, a double, a home run and two RBI during his five-game hitting streak.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 2-0 on their current three-game road trip. Detroit has a 12-6 road record this season. The Tigers .667 road winning percentage ranks second in the American League, while their 12 road wins ranks tied for second.

INTERLEAGUE HAPPENINGS: The Tigers are 4-1 in Interleague play this season after winning two of three games at Pittsburgh earlier this season and winning the first two games of the series vs. the Cardinals. Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the Tigers have compiled a 180-148 record.

AMONG THE BEST IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY SINCE 2006: The Tigers have posted a 109-62 record, a .637 winning percentage, during Interleague play since the start of the 2006 season. The .637 winning percentage during Interleague action is second-best among major league clubs during that stretch. The Boston Red Sox have compiled a 111-61 record, a .645 winning percentage, during Interleague play over that stretch.

REPLAY RUNDOWN: The Tigers have been involved in 15 instant replay challenges so far this season. Detroit has challenged six plays with three calls being overturned and three plays standing as called. Opponents have made eight challenges with five plays standing as called and three calls being overturned. There has been one crew chief initiated review with that play being overturned.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Brad Ausmus is in his second season at the helm for the Tigers after being named the 37th manager in Tigers history on November 3, 2013.

-Led the Tigers to a 90-72 record and a postseason berth in his first year as manager, joining Hughie Jennings (1907), Mickey Cochrane (1934) and Jim Leyland (2006) in accomplishing the feat.

-Became the 14th manager in Tigers history to have also played at the major league level for Detroit, joining Alan Trammell, Dick Tracewski, Billy Martin, Bob Swift, Billy Hitchcock, Fred Hutchinson, Mickey Cochrane, Del Baker, Bucky Harris, George Moriarty, Ty Cobb, Hughie Jennings and Bobby Lowe.

-Managed Team Israel in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.

-Spent 18 seasons as a catcher at the major league level with the Padres (1993-96), Tigers (1996, 1999-2000), Astros (1997-98, 2001-07) and Dodgers (2009-10) ... made eight postseason appearances as a player, including two trips to the National League Championship Series and one to the World Series.

-Ranks second all-time among catchers with 12,839 putouts, while he is ninth with 1,766 games started and 15,082.2 innings played.

**TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - ALFREDO SIMON**

ABOUT ALFREDO: In his first season with the Tigers, Simon will make his eighth start of the 2015 season tonight at the Cardinals.

LAST TIME OUT: Simon pitched into the eighth inning in his last start on Tuesday vs. Minnesota, but received a no decision. Simon worked 7.2 innings, allowing only one run on six hits with one walk and six strikeouts.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: Tonight's start marks

Simon's second Interleague start of the season. In his first on April 15 at Pittsburgh, Simon threw 8.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed and two strikeouts. Simon has made 28 appearances, including four starts, in his career in Interleague play. He has posted a 3-3 record with four saves and a 2.36 ERA (61.0IP/16ER) in Interleague action.

FACING A FAMILIAR FOE: Simon is making his 18th career appearance against the Cardinals tonight. Simon's 17 appearances vs. St. Louis are the second most for him against any one team. The only team that Simon has faced more in his career than the Cardinals are the Pirates, who Simon has faced 19 times.

ON THE ROAD: Simon is making his fifth road start of the season tonight at St. Louis. In his first four road starts of 2015, Simon has compiled a 2-1 record with a 4.76 ERA (22.2IP/12ER). In his career, Simon has pitched in 96 games, including 29 starts, on the road and has a 14-16 record with eight saves and a 3.79 ERA (268.2IP/113ER).

RECORD AT BUSCH STADIUM: Simon has made seven career appearances, two starts, at Busch Stadium. In those seven outings, Simon has posted a 1-0 record with a 4.91 ERA (18.1IP/10ER).

MASTERFUL IN MAY: Simon has had success in his career in the month of May. In 33 career May outings, including seven starts, Simon has compiled a 6-4 record with five saves and a 2.90 ERA (80.2IP/26ER) and 64 strikeouts. In two May starts this season, Simon has a 0-0 record with a 2.84 ERA (12.2IP/4ER).

LOOKING AT THE AMERICAN LEAGUE LEADER BOARDS: Simon enters tonight's start ranked tied for fifth in the American League with four wins.

SIMON STARTS TIGERS CAREER 4-0: With his win on April 25 vs. Cleveland, Simon began his Tigers career with four straight wins. He became the first pitcher to win his first four starts in a Tigers uniform since Kip Young won his first four in 1978.

ROUGH ON RIGHTIES: Simon has been tough on righthanded batters through his first six starts in 2015. Righties are hitting .132 (7x53) vs. Simon this season, while lefties are batting .313 (35x112). For his career, righthanded hitters have batted .250 (267x1068) against Simon and lefthanded hitters have hit .265 (295x1115).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Simon was selected to the 2014 National League All-Star team by NL manager Mike Matheny. It marked the first All-Star Game selection of Simon's career.

ESTABLISHING CAREER HIGHS: Simon established career highs with 15 wins, 32 games started, 22 quality starts, 196.1 innings pitched and 127 strikeouts in 2014.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Simon was acquired by the Tigers from Cincinnati in exchange for Eugenio Suarez and Jonathon Crawford on December 11, 2014. He was originally signed by the Phillies as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 1999. Simon was acquired by San Francisco for a player to be named later (Felix Rodriguez) on July 30, 2004. He was acquired by the Orioles from San Francisco in exchange for Adam Donachie and cash considerations on December 7, 2006. Simon was claimed off waivers by the Reds from the Orioles on April 3, 2012.
