SWEET HOME, SAN DIEGO: After 11 days and 10 games on the road, the Padres have returned home to "America's Finest City" where they will set up shop at Petco Park for a 10-game, 11-day homestand...the Milwaukee Brewers will be the first of three squads to make the trip to Southern California this week as they will be in town to take on the Friars from Monday-Wednesday...following an off day on Thursday, the Padres will welcome their division-rival Los Angeles to town for a three-game, weekend set (Friday-Sunday) followed immediately by a four-game set with the Arizona Diamondbacks.

- The Padres return home after going 3-7 on their roadtrip to St. Louis (1-3), Los Angeles (1-2) and Arizona (1-2).
- Following the 10-game homestand, the Padres will once again embark upon a 10-game, 11-day roadtrip as they will do a tour of most the National League West as they will make the trek to Colorado (September 5-7), Los Angeles (September 8-10) and Arizona (September 12-14).

TREVOR HOFFMAN INDUCTION: This coming Saturday, August 30, Trevor Hoffman will be inducted into the Padres Hall of Fame prior to the club's 5:40 p.m. game against the Los Angeles Dodgers at Petco Park.

- Hoffman will be the ninth person to be inducted into the Padres Hall of Fame, joining Buzze Bavasi, Nate Colbert, Jerry Coleman, Tony Gwynn, Randy Jones, Ray Kroc, Dick Williams and Dave Winfield.
- Hoffman, who now serves as the Padres' upper-level pitching coordinator, retired as Major League Baseball's all-time saves leader with 601 in 677 opportunities, a 61-75 record, 2.87 ERA (347 ER/1089.1 IP), .211 opponent batting average and 1,133 strikeouts in 1,035 relief appearances...the seven-time All-Star (1998, 99, 2000, 02, 06, 07, 09) also finished in the Top 10 in Cy Young voting (1996, 98, 99, 2006) and in the Top 25 in Most Valuable Player voting (1996, 98, 2005, 06) on four occasions each.
- Over his 16 seasons with San Diego, Hoffman compiled a 54-64 record with 552 saves in 618 opportunities (.893 save percentage), a 2.76 ERA (292 ER/952.1 IP), .211 opponent batting average and 1,029 strikeouts in 902 relief appearances.

BUDDY GETS WIN #600: With the win yesterday at Arizona, Buddy Black secured his 600th career win as a manager, all as the skipper of the Padres...Black ranks second on the Padres all-time managerial wins list, trailing only Bruce Bochy, who won 951 games as manager of the Friars from 1995-2006.

- He is the 112th manager in Major League history to reach the 600-win plateau and the 14th active manager to do so, joining SF Bruce Bochy, LAA Mike Scioscia, BAL Buck Showalter, CLE Terry Francona, MIN Ron Gardenhire, PIT Clint Hurdle, KC Ned Yost, OAK Bob Melvin, TB Joe Maddon, NYM Terry Collins, NYY Joe Girardi, TEX Ron Washington and ATL Fredi Gonzalez....Black is the 56th different manager all-time to get 600+ wins with a single team.
- **Black also had 121 wins as a pitcher in 15 Major League seasons, making him one of two managers in Major League history to win 100+ games as a player and 600+ games as a manager, joining Hall of Famer Clark Griffith (1,491 wins as a manager, 236 as a pitcher).**

KEEP THE BREW LOCAL: Since Petco Park opened in 2004, the Padres have had success when facing the Brewers in downtown San Diego, posting a 19-11 (.633) record against the Brew-Crew in the East Village...the Friars' .633 winning percentage against Milwaukee is their second-best record against any opponent at Petco Park, trailing only the 24-13 (.649) mark the Padres hold over the New York Mets.

- Since Petco Park opened in 2004, the Padres are 7-2-1 in 10 home series against the Brewers.

IN THE SECOND HALF: Since the second half of the season began on July 18, the Padres own an 19-15 record (.559), tied for the fourth-best record in the National League with the Brewers, behind Washington (24-12, .667), Los Angeles (20-15, .571) and Miami (20-15, .571).

- In the second half the Padres have scored a total of 149 runs in 34 games, the fourth-highest total in the National League behind Washington (167), Pittsburgh (162) and Colorado (152).
- The Padres are averaging 4.38 runs per game during the second half of the season, the sixth-highest total in Major League Baseball, behind only Minnesota (4.67), Washington (4.64), Pittsburgh (4.63), Oakland (4.50) and Colorado (4.47).

MR. AUGUST: In four starts during the month of August, Eric Stults, tonight's starting pitcher for the Padres, owns a 3-0 record with a 1.46 ERA (4 ER, 24.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts against six walks while limiting the opposition to a .195 batting average.

- Stults is 0.1 innings pitched away from qualifying this month, but among pitchers with as many or more innings pitched in August (24.2), his ERA is the third-lowest in the National League and sixth-lowest in Major League Baseball...his .195 opponents average is the sixth-lowest in the National League and ninth-lowest in the Majors.
- Owns a career 3.11 ERA and .238 batting average during the month of August, his lowest numbers of any month of the season.
- Since joining the Padres in 2012, Stults owns a 7-2 record and a 2.89 ERA (29 ER, 90.1 IP) and has limited the opposition to a .244 average, his highest win total and lowest ERA and opponents average of any month.

POWER IN A PINCH: With Will Venable's pinch-hit home run in the 8th inning of yesterday's game at Arizona, the Padres now have nine pinch-hit home runs this season, the highest total in Major League Baseball (Arizona and Pittsburgh are tied for second with six)...the Friars have also driven in 29 runs in the pinch, the third-highest total in baseball, trailing only Pittsburgh (35) and Colorado (30).

- Nine pinch hit home runs this season is tied with the 2009 and 2010 seasons for the second-highest total in franchise history, trailing only the 10 pinch-hit homers hit during the 1995 season.
- The last Major League teams with nine or more pinch-hit home runs in a single season was the 2012 Colorado Rockies (10) and New York Mets (10).

HOT AS THE "SOL"-ARTE: Yangelvis Solarte has belted 25 extra-base hits (15 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs) and has driven in 46 runs (31 with NYY and 15 with SD), making him one of four Major League rookies this season to log 25+ XBH and 45+ RBI, joining CWS Jose Abreu (63 XBH, 94 RBI), DET Nick Castellanos (39 XBH, 54 RBI) and HOU George Springer (29 XBH, 51 RBI).

BASEBALL'S VERSION OF DAYLIGHT SAVINGS: Of the Padres remaining 20 games at Petco Park this season, four of the games have a scheduled first pitch time of 6:10 p.m. PT...the 6:10 p.m. starts come at the end of the current series against the Brewers (August 27), D-Backs (September 4), Phillies (September 18) and Rockies (September 24).

TODAY'S STARTER

LHP - Eric Stults #53

FOR STARTERS: The 34-year-old will make his 26th start of the season tomorrow when he takes the mound against the Brewers at Petco Park .

- Has allowed three or fewer earned runs in 10 of his last 11 starts since June 17 at Seattle and in 11 of his last 15 starts since May 27 at Arizona.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in his last outing August 20 at Los Angeles-NL after he threw 5.0 innings of one-run baseball, allowing just four hits with five strikeouts against one walk.

- Has now earned wins in three consecutive decisions for the first time this season and for the first time since winning his final three starts of the 2013 season from September 17-28...the last and only time Stults has earned the win in four or more consecutive decisions was August 6 - September 10, 2012 when he earned the win in five consecutive decisions.

VS. THE BREWERS: Will be making his third career appearance and first career start against the Brewers tonight...the Brewers are the only team in the National League that Stults has never made a start against.

- Has not factored into either decision in his two appearances against Milwaukee but has pitched to a 9.00 ERA (4 ER, 4.0 IP) with one strikeout against one walk.
- Last appeared against Milwaukee on July 14, 2011 as a member of the Rockies...allowed one run on one hit in 1.0 IP that day at Coors Field.

TAKIN' CARE OF BUSINESS: Has pitched to a 4-5 with a 3.18 ERA (23 ER, 65.0 IP) with 50 strikeouts against 20 walks while limiting the opposition to a .223 batting average over his last 11 starts since June 17 at Seattle

- Among left-handed pitchers during this two-plus month span, his ERA ranks ninth in Major League Baseball and fourth in the National League while his opponents batting average ranks sixth in the Majors and second in the National League, behind only Clayton Kershaw (.166).

HOME COOKIN': Has not allowed an earned run over his last two games and 13.1 IP at Petco Park since July 4...in that time, has pitched to a 2-0 record with nine strikeouts against six walks while limiting the opposition to a .130 batting average.

MR. AUGUST: In four starts during the month of August, Stults owns a 3-0 record with a 1.46 ERA (4 ER, 24.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts against six walks while limiting the opposition to a .195 batting average.

- Stults is 0.1 innings pitched away from qualifying this month, but among pitchers with as many or more innings pitched in August (24.2), his ERA is the third-lowest in the National League and sixth-lowest in Major League Baseball...his .195 opponents average is the sixth-lowest in the National League and ninth-lowest in the Majors.
- Owns a career 3.11 ERA and .238 batting average during the month of August, his lowest numbers of any month of the season.
- Since joining the Padres in 2012, Stults owns a 7-2 record and a 2.89 ERA (29 ER, 90.1 IP) and has limited the opposition to a .244 average, his highest win total and lowest ERA and opponents average of any month.

LITTLE HELP HERE?: The Padres have scored a total of 46 runs in Stults' 25 games (135.0 IP) on the mound this season, the eighth-fewest in the Major Leagues among starters with 100.0 or more innings pitched.

- His run support average of 3.07 runs per game is the lowest in the Majors among qualified starters.

STYMIEING SOUTHPAWS: Since the start of the 2012 season, Stults has limited left-handed hitters to a .211 batting average with a .240 on-base percentage, the 10th-lowest batting average among National League starters and the fourth-lowest opponent OBP.

MR. STULTS DOESN'T ISSUE PASSES: Stults has issued two walks or less in 28 of his last 33 games dating back to August 18 of last season...had a streak of 18 games of allowing two walks or less snapped on May 27 at Arizona after he walked four D-Backs hitters.

- Has issued just 34 walks in 135.0 innings pitched this season, **tied for the ninth-fewest in the National League** among pitchers with as many or more innings pitched.

SLOW MOTION FOR YA: According to FanGraphs.com, his change-up has an average velocity of 79.5 mph, tied for the fourth-slowest average velocity among qualifying starters in the National League behind only MIL Marco Estrada (77.9), ARI Josh Collmenter (78.7) and MIL Kyle Lohse (79.3), and tied for the 10th-slowest in baseball.

- Additionally, the southpaw owns the second-slowest average velocity curve ball in the Majors, throwing the deuce just 68.1 mph (MIA Henderson Alvarez, 62.7)

TOMORROW'S STARTER

RHP - Tyson Ross #38

FOR STARTERS: The 27-year-old will make his 28th start of the season tomorrow and his 14th start of the year at home when he takes the mound against the Brewers at Petco Park.

- Has worked 6.0-or-more innings in 21 of his last 25 starts, including 7.0 or more in 13 of those outings, pitching to a 11-10 record with a 2.57 ERA (47 ER, 164.1 IP) with 161 strikeouts against 53 walks in that time.
- The Padres have won five of his last seven starts...prior to this stretch, lost in nine of his last 11 starts after they opened the season winning in six of his first seven starts.

NOW THAT'S QUALITY: With his performance in his last start on August 21 at LAD, Ross now has thrown 12 consecutive quality starts since June 21, the longest quality start streak in Padres franchise history...the streak surpasses the 11 game streaks put together by Andrew Cashner from August 14, 2013-April 16, 2014, Ed Whitson from July 25 - September 18, 1990, Dennis Rasmussen from August 6, 1988 - April 7, 1989, Gaylord Perry from September 4, 1978 - April 27, 1979, Joe McIntosh from September 15, 1974 - May 21, 1975 and Dave Roberts from July 3 - August 21, 1971.

- During the streak, Ross has pitched to a 5-6 record with a 2.00 ERA (18 ER, 81.0 IP) with 80 strikeouts against 22 walks while limiting the opposition to a .208 average.
