## NEW YORK YANKEES (49-47) vs. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (57-39)

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their three-game series with San Francisco today after taking the opener on Friday...are 5-3 thus far on their 10-game homestand to start their post-All-Star break schedule (went 1-2 vs. Boston and 3-1 vs. Baltimore)...marks their second of three, season-long 10-game homestands (also 5/6-15 and 9/5-14)...on Monday, depart on an eight-game, nine-day road trip that includes 3G at Houston (Mon.-Wed.), 3G at Tampa Bay (7/29-31) and 2G at the Mets (8/1-2).

- ▶ Are 5-1 in their last 6G...marks the first time they have won five of six since 6/6-11 (also 5-1)...are 7-3 in their last 10G...are 23-17 since 6/6, 33-25 since 5/18 and 40-30 since 5/6.
- ▶ Are 2G above .500 for the third time this season (were 2G over at the close of play on 4/12 and 7/20)...with a win today, would set their season high-water mark.
- ▶ Are 6.5G behind Baltimore for the AL East division lead.
- ▶ Are 4.5G behind Toronto for the second Wild Card spot.
- ▶ Have won five of their last six home games and are 28-21 at home this season...are 25-15 in their last 40 home games after starting the season 3-6 at Yankee Stadium...will play 13 of their next 24 games at home (through 8/17).
- ▶ Are 25-14 in their last 39G against non-AL East opponents (since 5/18)...included is an 11-game winning streak outside the division (5/18-6/10), their longest winning streak in non-divisional play since 6/3-18/12 (won 11 straight)...are 35-27 outside the division this season.
- ▶ Their remaining 66G include: 42G vs. AL East, 9G vs. AL West, 6G vs. AL Central, 5G vs. NL West, and 4G vs. NL East.
- ▶ Will play 50 of their remaining 66G against teams above .500...23 of their first 26 post-All-Star break games are against teams who are currently above .500...are 26-30 this season vs. teams with records at .500-or-better.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees defeated San Francisco, 3-2, in the opener of their three-game set at Yankee Stadium...scored the winning run in the bottom of the eighth on a throwing error by shortstop Brandon Crawford (the last of four Giants errors in the game)...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** started and tossed 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 2BB, 4K, 83 pit./55 str.)...did not allow any extra-base hits in a no-decision...**2B Starlin Castro** (3-for-4) had an RBI double in the first and went 3-for-4 off Madison Bumgarner to up his career batting average against him to .519 (14-for-27)...**RF Carlos Beltran** (2-for-2, 1RBI, 2BB) reached base safely four times (fourth time this season) and had a run-scoring single in the second...**RHP Dellin Betances** (1.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 1BB, 2K, 1WP) allowed a run in the seventh, snapping the **Yankees bullpen's** scoreless streak at 31.0IP...**LHP Andrew Miller** (1.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 2K) allowed the tying run in the eighth but was credited with the win to improve to 6-1 this season...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1H, 1K) notched his 20th save in 21 opportunities.

**CHAP OFF THE OLD BLOCK:** In converting his 20th save in 21 opportunities this season in Friday's win vs. San Francisco, **LHP Aroldis Chapman** became the 11th player in Yankees franchise history to record at least 20 saves in a season and the fifth different Yankees to accomplish the feat in the last five seasons (also Andrew Miller-36 in 2015; David Robertson-39 in 2014; Mariano Rivera-44 in 2013; and Rafael Soriano-42 in 2012).

- ▶ Joins the Dodgers' Kenley Jansen as the only Major Leaguers to record at least 20 saves in each of the last five seasons (2012-16).
- ▶ Has 165 saves since becoming a closer in the 2012 season, the third-highest total in the Majors over that stretch (Craig Kimbrel-195, Fernando Rodney-166).

**HIRO WORSHIP:** RHP Masahiro Tanaka is 2-0 with a 1.48 ERA in 4GS in July (24.1IP, 23H, 8R/4ER, 6BB, 22K, 2HR)...is undefeated in his last seven overall starts, going 4-0 with a 2.84 ERA (44.1IP, 45H, 18R/14ER, 9BB, 41K, 3HR).

- ▶ The Yankees are 15-5 in his starts this season.
- ▶ Including Friday's 6.0-inning scoreless no-decision vs. San Francisco, is 5-3 with a 1.88 ERA (62.1IP, 49H, 14R/13ER, 6BB, 59K, 5HR) in his nine career Interleague starts.
- ▶ Is 5-0 with a 1.79 ERA (45.1IP, 42H, 13R/9ER, 10BB, 38K, 2HR) in 7GS this season with Austin Romine starting at catcher.

**CONSTANT GARDNER:** LF Brett Gardner is batting .346/.379/.538 (9-for-26) with 4R, 1 triple, 1HR, 2RBI and 2BB during his current seven-game hitting streak.

**STAR TURN:** 2B Starlin Castro is hitting .429 (9-for-21) with 3R, 4 doubles, 1HR and 7RBI in his last 6G...his 7RBI in that stretch match the total from his previous 33G (6/7-7/16).

- ▶ Is batting .362/.383/.534 (21-for-58) with 9R, 7 doubles, 1HR, 7RBI and 2BB in his last 15G (since 7/4).
- ▶ Has 30XBH in 94G this season (18 doubles, 1 triple, 11HR)...did not tally his 30th XBH of 2015 until his 140th game on 9/21...has matched his HR total from all of 2015 (11HR in 151G).

**TALL TASK:** The Yankees are scheduled to face two of the top-four Major League wins leaders in a span of four games (Thurs.-Sun.), having lost to Baltimore's Chris Tillman (now 14-2) on Thursday, with San Francisco's Johnny Cueto (13-2) slated to pitch Sunday...both pitchers are tied for their respective league leads in wins.

- ▶ The four starting pitchers facing the Yankees in the final four games of their homestand (Tillman, Madison Bumgarner, Jeff Samardzija, Cueto) have combined for a 46-14 record this season.

**20/20:** RF Carlos Beltran reached base safely in all four of his plate appearances in Friday's win vs. San Francisco...is one of seven Major League hitters with at least a .300 BA, 20 doubles and 20HR this season (Betts, Cano, Donaldson, C. Gonzalez, Machado, Ortiz)...marks his highest single-season HR total since 2013 w/ St. Louis (24HR).

- ▶ Is batting .373/.427/.493 (25-for-67) with 6R, 5 doubles, 1HR, 8RBI and 7BB in his last 20G (since 6/27).
- ▶ Has 412 career HR, tied with Alfonso Soriano for 52nd place on Baseball's all-time HR list...is 2HR away from 51st-place Darrell Evans (414)...has 1,495 career runs scored.
- ▶ Is one of three players in Yankees history to hit at least 20HR in his age-39 season (or later), joining Alex Rodriguez (33HR at 39 in 2015) and Babe Ruth (22HR at 39 in 1934)...is the second switch-hitter in Major League history with a 20HR season at age-39 (or later), joining Eddie Murray (21HR at 39 w/ Cleveland in 1995; 22HR at 40 w/ Cleveland/Baltimore in 1996).
- ▶ Marks his 12th season with at least 20HR (1999, 2001-04, '06-08, '11-13, '16), tied with Mark Teixeira for fourth-most among active players (A. Rodriguez-16, Ortiz-15, Pujols-14).

**STRONG-ARMED:** Yankees pitchers have a 1.50 ERA (54.0IP, 35H, 9ER, 16BB, 44K, 2HR) in the last 6G, lowering their team ERA from 4.45 to 4.26...allowed 1R-or-fewer in four consecutive games from 7/17-20, their longest such streak since 9/18-21/03 (4G).

- ▶ Have not allowed a HR in their last 4G (all at home)...since May 2003, have held opponents without a HR in more than four consecutive home games in a single season just one time: 7/18-23/08 (3G vs. Oakland, 3G vs. Minnesota).
- ▶ Their 2.25 ERA (72.0IP, 53H, 19R/18ER, 24BB, 58K, 6HR) in 8G since the All-Star break leads the AL and is second in MLB (Cubs-1.71)...have allowed runs in just 13-of-72 frames.
- ▶ Held Baltimore, which leads the Majors with 142HR, to 1HR in the 4G series...was their fewest HR allowed in a 4G series at Yankee Stadium since 6/10-13/11 vs. Cleveland (1HR).

**NO RUNS DMC:** The trio of RHP Dellin Betances, LHP Andrew Miller and LHP Aroldis Chapman has combined to post a 2.11 ERA (119.2IP, 28ER) with 197K and 27BB this season.

- ▶ The Yankees are 19-1 when all three pitch in the same game this season...in those 20G, they have combined for a 1.44 ERA (62.1IP, 33H, 11R/10ER, 17BB, 95K, 2HR) and 13.72 K/9.0IP ratio...have allowed a .152 BA (33-for-217) in those games.

**BULL MARKET:** Yankees relievers had their scoreless streak snapped at 31.0IP in Friday's win vs. San Francisco (from the eighth inn. on 7/9 at Cleveland through 7/21 vs. Baltimore)...was their longest scoreless streak since a 37.1-inning streak from 7/20(G2)-8/9/98 (credit: STATS, Inc.)...also had their 26.2-inning home scoreless streak snapped (from the ninth inn. on 6/29 vs. Texas through 7/21 vs. Baltimore).

- ▶ Have allowed runs in just 3-of-14 games since 7/5 while posting a 1.17 ERA (46.0IP, 23H, 6ER, 19BB, 45K, 1HR)...in that span, have lowered their season ERA from 3.91 to 3.48, fifth-lowest among AL bullpens, eighth in MLB.
- ▶ Lead the AL with a .217 opponents' BA (232-for-1,070) this season, fourth-lowest in the Majors behind the Dodgers (.199), Cubs (.212) and Cardinals (.216)...lead the AL with a 77.8% save conversion rate (28-for-36) and trail only Boston (7) for the fewest blown saves in the AL.

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**July 23, 1957:** Mickey Mantle hits for the cycle in a 10-6 win vs. the White Sox, becoming the eighth Yankee to accomplish the feat. Mantle goes 4-for-5 with 4RBI and 2R in the game.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**July 24, 1983:** The Yankees and Royals play the infamous "Pine Tar" game at the original Yankee Stadium. The Yankees' 4-3 win is only temporary, as the game ends in protest and is resumed on Aug. 18, when the Royals complete a 5-4 win.

**July 24, 1978:** Billy Martin resigns as the Yankees' manager. At 52-42, the club would go 48-21 the rest of the regular season en route to winning the World Series.

### MONDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**July 25, 2015:** At 39 years, 363 days, Alex Rodriguez becomes the oldest player in Yankees history, and second-oldest in AL history, to hit three home runs in a game, capping off the feat with a game-tying solo homer in the ninth inning of an 8-5 win at Minnesota's Target Field.

**July 25, 1998:** The Yankees dedicate a plaque in honor of Mel Allen, the "Voice of the Yankees" from 1939-64.

# YANKEES vs. SAN FRANCISCO

**OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS:** The Yankees are 1-0 in their current three-game series vs. the Giants in the Bronx...the Yankees are 6-4 in 10 regular-season games against the Giants all-time (the only team they have faced fewer times in the regular season is St. Louis -- NYY is 6-3 against the Cardinals all time)...the two teams shared the Polo Grounds for 10 seasons from 1913-22...**IN 2013:** Went 2-1 vs. San Francisco in the Giants' first ever visit to the current Yankee Stadium...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 5-2 against San Francisco in the Bronx, including winning 2-of-3 in the Giants' first visit to the current Yankee Stadium in 2013...also went 2-1 in 2002 in the Giants' only trip to the original Yankee Stadium...**AT AT&T PARK:** Went 1-2 in their first trip to AT&T Park in 2007, in what is their only regular-season series at San Francisco...since their last trip to San Francisco, have played regular season games in every Major League ballpark except Philadelphia's Citizens Bank Park (last visited in 2006)...**IN POSTSEASON:** Have met in the World Series seven times, with the Yankees winning five championships (1962, '51, '37, '36, '23) and losing twice (1922, '21)...the only more-frequently played WS matchup is Yankees-Dodgers (11 times)...squared off in six Subway Series before the Giants left the Polo Grounds for California prior to the 1958 season.

**YANKEES IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY**

**WINNING FORMULA:** The Yankees are 4-7 through 11 of 20 Interleague games this year...lead the Majors in all-time Interleague wins and winning percentage (206-146, .586)...are 25-19 in their last 44 Interleague games dating back to 5/14/14.

- ✦ Produced a winning record in 13 consecutive seasons from 2000-12, going 143-90 over that span...have posted a winning Interleague record in 16-of-19 seasons (16-2-1) since Interleague play was established in 1997 (through 2015).
- ✦ Have compiled a *non-losing* Interleague record in 17-of-19 seasons (5-10 in 1997; 9-11 in 2013), including a stretch of 15 consecutive non-losing records from 1998-2012.
- ✦ All-time, are better than .500 against all but two NL teams (13-14 vs. the Phillies, 5-5 vs. the Dodgers).
- ✦ Lost five of their first six Interleague games of a season for the first time.

**THE SCHEDULE:** In addition to the annual Subway Series vs. the Mets (4G – 2G at Citi Field from 8/1-2 and 2G at Yankee Stadium from 8/3-4), the Yankees will face the five teams from the National League West for a total of 20 Interleague games (10 at home, 10 on the road)...went 1-2 in 3G at Arizona in May, 1-3 vs. Colorado in June (0-2 at Coors Field and 1-1 at Yankee Stadium) and 1-2 at San Diego earlier this month...are 1-0 in their current three-game series vs. their former New York neighbors in the Giants first visit to the Bronx since 2013...the Dodgers will come through in September (9/12-14).

**NO PLACE LIKE HOME:** The Yankees are 114-61 (.651) all-time in Interleague play at home, including 42-27 (.609) at the current Yankee Stadium...have won 13 of their last 19 Interleague home games (since 5/17/14)...went 72-34 (.679) against NL teams at the old Yankee Stadium.

- ✦ Are 24-8 (.750) in 32 home games vs. NL West opponents...went 15-3 at the original Yankee Stadium and are 9-5 at the current Stadium...are 18-22 in 40 road games at NL West teams.

**AT THE PLATE:** In the history of Interleague play (since 1997), the Yankees rank first in walks (1,395) and stolen bases (270), second in OBP (.343), third in runs scored (1,750) and sixth in home runs (409)...since 6/24/15, have scored at least 9R in six of their last 18G...have averaged 6.6 runs per game over their last 21 Interleague games (139R/21G).

- ✦ In Interleague play in 2015, led all clubs in runs scored (125) and OBP (.355)...ranked second in OPS (.822), slugging (.467), walks (79) and extra-base hits (77)...scored at least 6R in seven of their final 10G and 11-of-20 overall...their **MLB-high 6.25 runs per game** in 2015 was the highest in the Majors since the Angels (6.56R/G) and Rays (6.28R/G) in 2009.

**PITCHERS AS HITERS:** Yankees pitchers are 1-for-their-last-50 in Interleague play since 5/20/14...the only hit in that span was by reliever Branden Pinder, who snapped a team 0-for-28 with an RBI double on 8/30 at Atlanta...marked the first hit by a pitcher since Chase Whitley on 5/14/14 at the Mets, first extra-base hit since Andy Pettitte's double on 6/19/09 at Florida and first RBI since CC Sabathia's RBI groundout on 8/2/13 at San Diego...Pinder was the second Yankees relief pitcher in the DH era (since 1973) to record a hit (also Mike Stanton on 6/6/00 at Montreal)...have batted a combined .087 (35-for-404) with 9 doubles, 13RBI and 45 sacrifice hits in Interleague play.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP IVAN NOVA (7-5, 4.92 ERA)

**RHP Ivan Nova** is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season today vs. San Francisco...the 29-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...is 6-4 with a 4.88 ERA (72.0IP, 39ER) in 13 starts this season after making his first six appearances out of the Yankees bullpen (1-1, 1SV, 5.14 ERA, 14.0IP, 8ER)...has allowed 1R in two of his last three starts after permitting at least 3R in seven straight starts...has permitted just 1R in 5-of-13 starts overall...has allowed at least 1HR in 12-of-13 starts...completed at least 6.0IP in five straight starts from 5/19-6/9, his longest such streak since doing so in a career-high 11 straight starts from 6/23-8/31/13...in 2015, went 6-11 with a 5.07 ERA (94.0IP, 53ER) in 17 starts after returning from the disabled list in June, setting a career high in losses...returned to the Yankees' rotation in June 2015 after missing the final five months of 2014 and first 71 games of the 2015 season on the D.L. while recovering from "Tommy John" surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow...the surgery was performed on 4/29/14 by Dr. James Andrews in Pensacola, Fla.... finished fourth in 2011 AL Rookie of the Year voting after going 16-4 with a 3.70 ERA (165.1IP, 68ER) in 28 games (27 starts), the most wins by a Yankees rookie since Stan Bahnsen (17-12) in 1968...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 7/15/04.

**LAST START:** Started and earned his seventh win on Mon. vs. Baltimore (6.0IP, 4H, 1ER, 3BB, 4K, 1HR, 1HP)...allowed only a solo HR to Schoop in the second... was his second start this season with at least 6.0IP and 1R-or-fewer (5/19 at Oakland – 6.0IP, 1ER)...was his longest start since 6/9 vs. Los Angeles-AL (6.1IP, 3ER)...his 4H allowed matched a season low in a start (fourth time)...tied a season high with 3BB (also 6/27 vs. Texas)...retired his final seven batters.

**VS. SAN FRANCISCO:** Threw a six-hit shutout (1BB, 7K) in his only career start against San Francisco on 9/21/13 at Yankee Stadium...was his second career complete game shutout (also 8/31/13 vs. Baltimore)...is one of six pitchers since 1900 who have thrown at least 9.0IP vs. the Giants without allowing a run.

**INTERLEAGUE:** Is 8-3 with a 2.82 ERA (99.0IP, 99H, 33R/31ER, 25BB, 86K, 9HR) in 16 games (15 starts) in his career in Interleague play...his ERA is ninth-lowest among active pitchers with at least 90.0IP in Interleague play...is one of 11 pitchers ever to record three consecutive scoreless Interleague starts (8/3/13-6/24/15)...is 6-2 with a 2.27 ERA (67.1IP, 17ER) in his last 11 Interleague games (10 starts) since 6/11/12.

- ✦ Has made three Interleague starts this season, going 0-2 with a 6.91 ERA (14.1IP, 11ER)...allowed 1ER in 5.1IP (4H, 1BB, 7K) in a no-decision on 7/2 at San Diego...took the loss in both starts vs. Colorado in June (10.00 ERA, 9.0IP, 10ER)...in his two Interleague starts this season after taking only one loss in his first 13 Interleague starts...had his snapped 24.2-inning Interleague scoreless streak snapped on 6/15 at Colorado.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 6-4 with a 4.88 ERA (72.0IP, 79H, 40R/39ER, 19BB, 58K, 15HR) in 13 starts this season...has allowed 1R in two of his last three starts after permitting at least 3R in seven straight starts...has permitted just 1R in 5-of-13 starts overall...opponents are hitting .206 (13-for-63) with RISP in his starts...has won back-to-back starts three times this season (7/7-current, 6/4-9, 5/14-19).

- ✦ Completed 6.0IP in his last start, ending a streak of five straight starts under 6.0IP...completed at least 6.0IP in five straight starts from 5/19-6/9, his longest such streak since doing so in a career-high 11 straight starts from 6/23-8/31/13...has gone at least 6.0IP in 6-of-13 starts this season.
- ✦ His 1.88 HR/9.0IP ratio as a starter is sixth-highest in the Majors this season (min. 60.0IP as starter)...has permitted at least 1HR in 12 of his 13 starts...allowed at least 1HR in each of his first 10 starts this season and a career-high 12 straight starts from 9/28/15-6/27/16, tied for the longest streak by a Yankees starter since 2000 (Phil Hughes, 12, 4/8-6/9/12).

**2016:** Right-handed batters are hitting .122 (5-for-41) over his last four starts...opponents are hitting .215 (17-for-79) with RISP, seventh-lowest in the AL (min. 75AB w/ RISP)...per FanGraphs PITCHf/x, opponents are hitting .221 (17-for-77) with 35K in at bats ending with a curveball...has walked just 4-of-91 batters leading off innings...has limited opponents to a .221 (23-for-104) BA with two outs; they are hitting .301 (72-for-239) with less than two outs...his 16HR allowed are the second-highest total of his career (allowed 28HR in 2012)...13-of-16 HRs allowed are solo HRs (the other three are two-run HRs).

**HOME COOKING:** Is 4-2 with one save and a 3.74 ERA (45.2IP, 19ER) in 10 appearances (seven starts) at Yankee Stadium this season.

- ✦ Is 27-19 with a 4.40 ERA (374.0IP, 183ER) in 66 games (61 starts) in his career at Yankee Stadium...in 61 starts, is 26-19 with a 4.54 ERA (360.2IP, 182ER)...in the history of the current Yankee Stadium (since 2009), ranks second in innings pitched, is tied for second in starts, ranks third in wins and fourth in strikeouts (273)...is tied for second in complete games (three) and shutouts (two).
- ✦ Allowed 1HR-or-fewer in a Yankee Stadium-record 27 consecutive starts from 7/31/12-9/12/15, matching the longest streak of home starts by a Yankee without allowing multiple HRs since 1984 (allowed just 14HR in 157.0IP during that stretch)...has permitted 8HR in 45.2IP at home this season.

**BULLPEN DUTIES:** Went 1-1 with his first career save and a 5.14 ERA (14.0IP, 8ER) in six relief appearances before moving into the rotation on 5/9...on 4/22 vs. Tampa Bay, tossed 2.1 scoreless innings (2K) to earn his second career win as a reliever (also 5/25/13 at Tampa Bay).
