ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (65-57) vs. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (58-66)

Sunday, August 21, 2016 – Citizens Bank Park – 1:35 p.m. EDT – Game 125; Home 63

RHP Mike Leake (8-9, 4.78) vs. RHP Vince Velasquez (8-5, 4.14)

- YESTERDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the St. Louis Cardinals, 4-2, at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Jeremy Hellickson threw another quality start ... He allowed only 2 ER on 7 hits in 7.0 innings with 1 walk and 8 strikeouts ... In the bottom of the 1st inning, Cesar Hernandez ripped a leadoff home run off Luke Weaver before Cameron Rupp added an RBI single to make it 2-0 Phillies ... Jeremy Hazelbaker hit a game-tying 2-run homer off Hellickson in the 3rd inning ... Philadelphia retook the lead in the 5th inning on a 2-out RBI single by Maikel Franco ... Aaron Altherr slugged a solo HR in the 6th off Jonathan Broxton to make it 4-2 Phillies ... Hector Neris and Jeanmar Gomez (SV, 33) each threw 1.0 scoreless inning in relief.
- DEEP IMPACT:** Including two more long balls last night, the Phillies have now hit at least one home run in each of their last 14 games (8/5-current, 21 total HR), which is their longest HR streak since May 27 to June 9, 2013 (also 14 straight) ... The last time Philadelphia homered in 15 or more consecutive games was September 3-22, 2008 (18 straight) ... During their current streak, the Phillies are T-3rd among all National League teams in home runs and T-8th in MLB ... Additionally, the Phillies have homered in eight consecutive home games, 14 of their last 15, and 19 of their last 22 ... Since July 3rd, the Phillies lead all National League teams in home runs at home (35) and rank T-4th in the majors ... Philadelphia has averaged 1.59 home runs per game at Citizens Bank Park over that span (35 HR/22 G), which is the 3rd-best home HR rate in MLB, trailing only the Baltimore Orioles (2.06 HR/G) and Boston Red Sox (1.68 HR/G) ... The Phillies recent power surge is a far cry from their first three months of the season, as they ranked 26th in the majors in both home runs (72) and home runs per game (0.90) from Opening Day through June 30th (80 G).
- SAINT VINCENT:** In his 10 starts at Citizens Bank Park this season, right-hander **Vince Velasquez** is averaging 11.96 strikeouts per 9.0 innings pitched (70 SO, 52.2 IP) ... No pitcher in Phillies history has finished a season with a higher SO/9.0 average at home (*min. 10 GS*) ... Curt Schilling holds the franchise's modern day single season record as he averaged 11.57 SO/9.0 IP at Veterans Stadium in 1997 ... Overall this season, Velasquez is averaging 10.35 SO/9.0 IP (130 SO, 113.0 IP) ... Since 1900, the Phillies have had only one starting pitcher make at least 20 starts and finish the season at or above 10.00 SO/9.0 IP -- Schilling in 1997 (11.29 SO/9.0 IP, 319 SO, 254.1 IP).
- BASE-KETBALL:** Phillies second baseman **Cesar Hernandez** went 3-for-4 last night and has now reached base safely in each of his last 24 starts ... Since July 23rd, Hernandez is batting .365 (35-96) in those 24 starts with a .474 OBP, 4 2B, 3 3B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, 20 R and 6 SB ... He is T-4th among all Major League players in times on base over that stretch (55; 35 H, 20 BB), trailing only CIN's Joey Votto (60 TOB), COL's D.J. LeMahieu (59), and ARI's Paul Goldschmidt (58).
- IT'S A SETUP!** Right-hander **Hector Neris** continued his recent run of dominance last night, striking out the side in a scoreless 8th inning against the Cardinals ... It marked the 5th time this season that Neris has struck out the side in a 1.0-inning appearance ... Neris currently ranks 4th among all Major League pitchers with 26 holds, the most in a single season by a Phillies reliever since Antonio Bastardo in 2012 (also 26) ... The last Phillie with 27 or more holds in a season was Ryan Madson in 2005 (32) ... Over his last 29 games (6/17-current), Neris has posted a 1.20 ERA (4 ER, 30.0 IP) and 0.80 WHIP (3 BB, 21 H) with 40 strikeouts to just three walks (13.33 SO/BB ratio) ... He is currently tied with STL's Zach Duke for the Major League lead in appearances (63) this season and ranks T-4th in innings (64.1), 5th in strikeouts (82) and 22nd in ERA (2.24).
- ARCH ENEMY:** The Phillies are looking for their first series win against the Cardinals since August 22-24, 2014 at Citizens Bank Park (2-1) ... In their previous three series versus St. Louis (all losses), the Phillies went 4-9 in 13 games and were outscored 75-43 (-32, -2.46 RPG) ... They have fared better at home recently, collecting double-digit hit totals against the Cardinals in four of their last five games at Citizens Bank Park ... During that period (since 6/19/15), the Phillies are batting .291 (52-179) at home versus St. Louis with seven home runs (at least one HR in all 5 G) ... Over the last 10 years (2006-current), the Cardinals and Phillies have the 1st and 3rd best winning percentages, respectively, among all National League clubs (STL .548; PHI .519).
- SOUTH CENTRAL:** The Phillies are 10-18 (.333) in 28 games against NL Central opponents this year, going 2-5-1 in eight series ... Since the beginning of the 2015 season, the Phillies are 20 games under .500 against the Central (21-41) with the lowest winning % of any National League team against the division during that span (.339) ... In 18 series versus the NL Central over the last two seasons, the Phillies are 4-11-3, with their only wins coming vs CIN (6/2-4/15), at CHI (3-0, 7/24-26/15), at MIL (2-1, 4/22-24/16) and vs CIN (2-1, 5/13-15/16).
- ON THIS DATE IN PHILLIES HISTORY:** August 21, 1990 – The Phillies overcome an eight-run deficit, scoring nine runs in the top of the 9th inning to beat the Los Angeles Dodgers, 12-11 ... John Kruk's pinch-hit three-run homer ties the game, and two batters later, Carmelo Martinez's double plates Rod Booker with the eventual winning run at Chavez Ravine.

Cameron Rupp gave the Phillies an early 1-0 lead in the 2nd inning with a solo HR off Kenta Maeda ... Velasquez cruised through the first 4.0 innings, allowing only 2 singles while striking out 7 strikeouts, but he ran into trouble in the 5th ... Howie Kendrick blasted a 2-run homer to center in the frame before Chase Utley, in his first game back at Citizens Bank Park as a member of the Dodgers, hit a 2-out solo HR to make it 3-1 Los Angeles ... Yasmani Grandal added an opposite field, 2-run homer in the 6th inning to push the lead to four ... Cesar Hernandez slugged a solo HR in the bottom of the 6th ... But the Dodgers broke the game wide open in the 7th inning, scoring 8 runs on 4 hits, including a 2-out grand slam by Utley.

However, over his last two starts, both against LAD (8/9-16), went 0-2, 12.19 ERA with 6 HR allowed in only 10.1 IP (5.23 HR/9.0 IP) ... The last two starts raised his 2016 ERA almost a full run from 3.33, to 4.14

- Was on the 15-day DL, 6/10-27 with a right biceps strain... Made 1 rehab start for Reading (AA) on 6/22 vs Akron: W, 5.0 IP, 2 H, R, ER, BB, 3 SO
- His streak of 15.0 consecutive scoreless innings to begin his PHI career was the longest by a Phillies SP since Marty Bystrom, 19.0-innings in 1980... The franchise record is 25.0-innings, RHP George McQuillan in 1907
- His 25 strikeouts through his first 2 career starts with PHI were the most by any PHI SP in the modern era (previous: Bunning, 20 SO, 4/15-24/64)
- The 9 SO in his Phillies debut were the most by a pitcher making his PHI debut (not ML debut) since Roy Halladay also had 9 SO in his 1st start for PHI, 4/5/10 at WSH – *courtesy Elias Sports Bureau*
