OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-21) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (28-14)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 16, 2018 — FENWAY PARK — 7:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won the first two games of this series after losing five of the previous six games...have swept two series this year (April 16-18 vs. Chicago-AL and May 4-6 vs. Baltimore)...are now 16-11 (.593) over the last 27 games dating back to April 15, which is the second best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...started the year 5-10 (.333)...are 21-21 for the season, which marks the eight time this year the A's have been exactly .500...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 21st consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 37 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 8-3 (.727) against American League East teams, which is the best record in the AL against the East...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East and Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...are batting .248 (96-for-387) against the East and are averaging 4.45 runs per game (49 runs in 11 games), but have a 2.98 ERA (34 in 102.2 ip)...have a 12-4 (.750) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West...have the second worst intradivision record in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the second consecutive game today...have won seven of the last 10 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher and are 8-8 against lefties for the season...the 16 games are tied for third most in the American League (Kansas City and Toronto, 17).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-0) and Toronto (four games)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...are 10-12 (.455) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...the A's have compiled a 4.87 ERA (102 er in 188.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...have allowed a Major League leading 36 home runs on the road...the offense has hit 38 home runs on the road, which is second most in the majors (Atlanta, 39)...have 14 at home, which is tied with Minnesota for second fewest (New York-NL, 13)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .264 (48-for-182) with 29 runs scored over the first five games of the road trip (5.8 runs per game) after hitting .200 with 15 runs scored in six games on the last homestand (2.5 runs per game)...are averaging 4.95 runs per game on the road (109 runs in 22 games), 4.10 at home (82 runs in 20 games)...are batting .197 (25-for-127) with runners in scoring position over the last 18 games after hitting .288 with RISP over the first 24 contests...rank fourth in the American League in walks (139) but have the third most strikeouts (380).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last eight games, which have led to nine earned runs...have 23 unearned runs for the second, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 24)...are tied for fourth in most errors (27)...have turned 29 double plays, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL...A's outfielders have just two assists (both by Chad Pinder), which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Washington, 1).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.08 ERA (41 er in 72.2 ip) and .301 (91-for-302) opponents batting average over the last eight games...however, have a 3.90 ERA (107 er in 246.2 ip) over the last 27 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...have allowed at least one home run in each of the last nine games (16 home runs total) and 15 of the last 16 (25 home runs)...have surrendered 56 home runs for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...are averaging 2.61 walks per nine innings, which is third lowest in the AL...have a Major League leading 32 wild pitches...set an Athletics franchise record with 84 wild pitches last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-8 with a 4.92 ERA (47 er in 86.0 ip) over the last 16 games after going 6-2 with a 2.93 ERA over an 11-game stretch from April 15-27...have issued two free passes or fewer in 37 of the 42 games this year and are second in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.22) to Cleveland (2.13).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 1-for-6 (16.7%) in stolen base attempts over the last 16 games...are 7-for-14 (50.0%) for the season and the stolen base per-

centage is the lowest in the majors...also rank last in the majors in stolen bases and stolen base attempts...opponents have stolen 33 bases, which is second most in the majors (New York-NL, 35)...however, they have been caught stealing 13 times, which is tied for fourth most.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-2 (.778) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...however, the nine games are tied for fourth fewest...are 3-1 in extra inning games and are tied for third in the American League in extra inning wins...had their first last at bat loss of the season Saturday at New York (AL)...have six last at bat wins, which is third most in the AL...have three walk-off wins.

LATE INNINGS: The A's have compiled a 3.41 ERA (48 er in 126.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the American League...have a 4.75 ERA (133 er in 252.0 ip) over innings one through six...are batting .262 (129-for-492) in the seventh inning or later compared to .243 (232-for-956) in innings 1-6...have scored 21 runs in the ninth inning, which are tied with Atlanta and New York (AL) for the most in the majors.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's are in a 19-game stretch from May 7 to 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona...those six teams are currently a combined 153-98 (.610) and the A's are 3-5 during that stretch...played six consecutive games against teams with at least a share of first place in its division from May 8 to 14 and went 2-4 over that stretch.

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Trevor Cahill from the disabled list today, the A's now have five players remaining on the DL (Blackburn, Buchter, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL 10 times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: today against Boston and next Tuesday against Seattle...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's have won the season series as they lead 4-1 entering the final game today...won the season series last year 4-3 and have won back-to-back season series against the Red Sox for the first time since 1987-88 (8-4 and 9-3)...with a win tonight, the A's would finish with their second best record against Boston in Oakland history (8-1 in 2012) and third best in Athletics history (18-3 in 1928)...won two of three in Oakland and have won the first two games in Boston...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's have swept five series at Fenway Park...have done it just once over the last 45 years and that was a three-game series from Sept. 3-5, 1990...have now won nine of their last 13 games against the Red Sox after losing nine straight...have won six of the last eight games in the Coliseum but have lost eight of the last 11 at Fenway...are 244-295 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 147-122 in Oakland, 96-172 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 886-1076 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League third baseman with 154 total chances, which is 33 more than any other third baseman...**Khris Davis** leads the majors in go-ahead home runs (8) and is tied for the American League lead in go-ahead RBI (11)...is also tied for second in the AL in RBI (36) and tied for fifth in home runs (12)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the AL lead in hits (55) and go-ahead RBI (11) and tied for second in RBI (36) and multiple hit games (17)...**Blake Treinen** ranks ninth among AL relievers with a 1.33 ERA and **Lou Trivino** is second (0.64).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1975 Vida Blue becomes the second Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he fires a seven-hitter at Yankee Stadium in the A's 4-2 win...in 1986 Tony Phillips hits for the cycle in the A's 8-4 win at Baltimore...he has five hits, scores two runs and drives in four...it is the first cycle in Oakland history...in 1990 Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Ron Hassey hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Cleveland.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Trevor Cahill (1-1, 2.25 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list today and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts before he was placed on the DL May 9 retroactive to May 6 with a right shoulder impingement...did not make a rehab appearance.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA (6 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts on the road compared to 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (13.0 ip) in two starts at home...last year, he combined for a 4-0 record, a 1.83 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in seven games in his home ballparks...was 0-3 with a 7.07 ERA and .320 opponents batting average in 14 games on the road...now has a seven-game home winning streak and a five-game road losing streak...has not lost at home since July 6, 2016 against Cincinnati and has not won on the road since Aug. 20 2016 at Colorado.

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out a career-high 12 batters in 6.0 innings in his last start May 5 against Baltimore...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts, his first since June 14, 2013 at San Diego...became the third A's pitcher since at least 1908 to strikeout 12 or more batters in six innings or fewer, the first since Steve Karsay on April 26, 1997 vs. Kansas City (12 so in 6.0 ip)...the other is Vida Blue on April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City (13 so in 6.0 ip)...now has 31 strikeouts in 24.0 innings for the season, and his average of 11.63 strikeouts per nine innings is 10th best among American League pitchers with 20 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 3-for-20 (.150) with runners in scoring position and they are batting .226 (38-for-168) with RISP over the last three years...they 0-for-10 with RISP and two outs this year...has allowed a .132 (5-for-38) average against left-handed hitters compared to .261 (12-for-46) with both of his home runs against right-handers...has a .094 (3-for-32) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .333 (11-for-33) the second time and .158 (3-for-19) after that...opponents are 3-for-47 (.064) with two strikes.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Opponents have been successful in 6-of-8 (75.0%) stolen bases attempts with him on the mound, and the six stolen bases are tied for fourth most in the American League...last year, opponents were successful in 17-of-19 (89.5%) stolen base attempts...they are 34-for-39 (87.1%) over the last three years...has four wild pitches, which is tied for eighth most in the American League...now has 20 wild pitches over the last two years, which are the most in the majors, despite just 25 games and 107.0 innings over that stretch.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over Chicago (AL) April 17 in Oakland...it was his first start as an Athletic since Sept. 27, 2011 at Seattle when he combined with Craig Breslow and Jerry Blevins on a four-hit shutout (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed five hits and two walks...retired the side in order just once and that came in his final inning...was relieved by Dull to start the eighth inning with the A's leading 8-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-4 win at Texas on April 23...Oakland scored twice in the third but he gave one of those runs back in the bottom of the third when Kiner-Falefa scored on a wild pitch...the A's added another run in the fourth but he allowed a two-run home run to Chirinos in the bottom of the fourth...left after four inning with the score tied 3-3...Oakland scored six times in the ninth for the win.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Houston April 29...Oakland scored a run in the third but he allowed two in the bottom of the third on a Springer RBI single and an Altuve sacrifice bunt...surrendered a solo home run to Springer in the fifth but the A's came back to tie the game, 3-3...walked Bregman to start the seventh and was relieved by Petit, who allowed that run to score plus two of his own.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0, 12-inning win over Baltimore May 5 in Oakland...struck out a career-high 12 batters in just 6.0 innings...fanned each of the first four batters and retired each of the first eight before Peterson singled with two outs in the third...allowed only one base runner past first base...Gausman shut out the A's on two hits over the first nine innings and Khris Davis hit a walk-off two-run home run in the 12th for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (3-1, 5.31 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...went 1-0 with a 2.87 ERA over his first three starts but is 2-1 despite a 6.94 ERA in five starts since then...has allowed six runs twice over that stretch but ended up with no decisions each time as both of those games went extra innings...has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his eight starts and six hits or fewer in all eight starts...held opponents to a .216 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .118 with RISP and two outs...is 2-1 with a 3.42 ERA in five starts at night compared to 1-0 with a 9.24 ERA in three starts in day games...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's loss at New York in 11 innings last Saturday (4.1 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 6 so)...has faced the Blue Jays once in his career and it came in relief on July 17, 2016 in Oakland in a 5-3 loss (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 so)...relieved Rich Hill in the first after five pitches and left after one inning with a right shin contusion.

CAHILL vs. BOSTON: Is 1-2 with a 6.35 ERA (28.1 ip, 33 h, 20 r, 20 er, 10 bb, 21 so, 6 hr) in five career starts...is 0-2 with a 8.44 ERA (20 er in 21.1 ip) in four starts at Fenway Park and 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in the Coliseum...last faced the Red Sox last year on July 29 at Boston

2017 RECAP: Was used exclusively as a starter with San Diego but then pitched primarily in relief for Kansas City following a July 24 trade...went 4-3 with a 3.69 ERA in 11 starts with the Padres and 0-0 with an 8.22 ERA in 10 games, three starts, with the Royals...combined for a 4-3 record and a 4.93 ERA in a career-low 21 appearances overall...missed 12 weeks of the season due to three stints on the disabled list...surrendered 16 home runs in 84.1 innings, including 10 in 23.0 innings with the Royals...his average of 1.71 home runs per nine innings was the highest mark of his career...also had career highs in walks per nine innings (4.82), strikeouts per nine innings (9.32), opponents slugging percentage (.483) and opponents OPS (.850)...had a Major League leading 16 wild pitches, including 14 with San Diego...tied for the National League in wild pitches (Arrieta, CHC) despite making just 11 starts...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .241 (35-for-145) by left-handed hitters compared to .301 (56-for-186) by right-handers...went 4-3 with a 4.38 ERA in his 14 starting assignments...compiled an 8.25 ERA in seven relief appearances.
