FISH BITES

The Marlins and the Cardinals play the rubber match of their three-game series in St. Louis, the third game of a seven-game trip for Miami to open the second half. Starting for Miami tonight is southpaw Adam Conley (6-5, 3.62), who is making his first career starts vs. the Cardinals. Starting for St. Louis is right-hander Michael Wacha (5-7, 4.36), who is facing the Marlins for the first time in his career. Miami wrapped up the first half of the season with a three-game sweep of the Cincinnati Reds, its fourth series sweep of the season. After today's game, the Marlins will head to Philadelphia for four games (July 18-21), the first of three consecutive series against NL East opponents. The Fish will return home for a 10-game homestand taking on the Mets (July 22-24) and Phillies (July 25-27), before facing these Cardinals again (July 28-31).

LAST NIGHT AT ST. LOUIS

The Marlins fell to the Cardinals 5-0, snapping their four-game winning streak. After two scoreless innings, St. Louis scored four times in the third inning off Tom Koehler (6-8), who worked 4.0 innings, and added a run in the fifth. The Marlins were held hitless until Adeiny Hechavarria led off the 6th inning with a double. Miami finished with just three hits, two by Hechavarria, who singled in the eighth, and one by Christian Yelich who doubled in the seventh. It was the Marlins first time being shut out since June 12, their fourth of the season.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS

Last night, the Marlins signed free agent infielder Cole Figueroa and optioned him to New Orleans. To make room on the 40-man roster, RHP Asher Wojciechowski was designated for assignment.

UP NEXT

Following today's game, the Marlins travel to Philadelphia for a four-game series, their second visit to the City of Brotherly Love this season. The Marlins are 2-4 vs. the Phillies this season, 1-2 in Philadelphia. All-time, the Fish have gone 172-212 against the Phils, 73-119 in Philly (47-68 at Citizens Bank Park). Miami has not had a winning season in Philadelphia since 2009 (7-2), going 20-39 since.

SERIES-LY

A win today would give the Marlins just their second series win in St. Louis in the past seven seasons and just their third series win ever at the current Busch Stadium (2-1 in 2009; 2-1 in 2014). The Marlins are looking for their second consecutive series win on the season, which would give them back-to-back series wins for the first time since June 13-20 (2-1 in SD; 3-1 vs. Col.).

BREAK POINT

The Marlins entered the All-Star break with a record of 47-41, marking the first time since 2009 they are over .500 entering the second half. It was the second time in Club history they were six-or-more games over .500 at the break, behind a Franchise-best 50-36 in 1997. Miami has not dipped below .500 after April 28, a stretch of 69 games. The Fish finished the first half with a National League-best .273 team batting average, the highest by any team in Club history at the break.

CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE

Miami is now 14-5 (.737) against teams in the National League Central this season, leading the NL in winning percentage. The Marlins six-game winning streak vs. the NL Central was snapped last night, but have won 10 of their last 12 games against the division. It is part of a larger trend for the Fish, however. According to STATS LLC, Miami has an MLB-best .718 winning percentage (28-11) vs. other divisions within its league this season; that would rank as the third-best mark since division play began in 1969, behind only the 2015 Pirates (.773/51-15) and the 2001 Mariners (.744/64-22). The Marlins have not had a winning record against the NL Central since 2006, when they were 22-17.

ROAD WARRIORS

As a team, Miami leads the Majors with a .287 road average and 490 hits, while second to the Cubs (.349) with a .344 on-base percentage. Historically, the Marlins best single-season road average was in 2005, when they ranked second in the Majors with a .276 average, behind Boston (.281). According to STATS LLC, the Marlins road average this season is the third-highest by an NL team since 1969, trailing only the 1970 Dodgers (.293) and 1999 Mets (.291). This year's marauding is being led by Marín Prado, who has an NL-best .391 batting average on the road, while J.T. Realmuto ranks second in the NL at .371. Giancarlo Stanton is tied for third in the NL with 12 road home runs.

GETTING STRONGER

On the season, Miami's relievers have combined to go 17-16 with 34 saves and a 3.74 ERA, ranking first in the NL in saves, third in wins, and seventh in ERA. The 'pen has been led by A.J. Ramos, who owns a 2.19 ERA (37.0 IP, 9 ER), ninth among NL relievers, and 28 saves (29 SVO), second in MLB. The newest member of the Marlins 'pen, Fernando Rodney, ranks second among NL relievers in ERA (1.01) and tied for first in opponents' batting average (.143) this season. Rodney is 17-for-17 in save chances, 10th-most in the NL.

CATCH THIS

J.T. Realmuto is having an impressive season when stacked up against other MLB catchers. He ranks second in hits (88) as a catcher, behind Wilson Ramos (89), and is third in average (.310), behind Ramos (.333) and Jonathan Lucroy (.323). Realmuto also leads MLB catchers this season in stolen bases, with eight, and with 17 for his career he already holds the Club record for a backstop, ahead of Benito Santiago (11). His eight career triples are tied with Santiago for the most by a catcher in Club history, and his batting average would set a new Club record, surpassing Ivan Rodríguez, who hit .300 in 2003.

CLIMBING THE LADDER

Ichiro has a total of 2,991 hits over his MLB career. On June 15 at San Diego, Ichiro unofficially passed Pete Rose's Major League hit record of 4,256 when combining Ichiro's 1,278 hits with the Orix Blue Wave of Nippon Professional Baseball in Japan. Ichiro is batting .339 (56x165) this season and is nine hits away from becoming the 30th player in Major League history to record 3,000 hits and tying Roberto Clemente for 29th on MLB's all-time hit list - Elias

SERIES NOTES

- This is the first meeting of the season between the two teams. The Marlins have struggled against the Cards, winning just two out of their last eight match-ups. The Fish have fared slightly better on the road vs. St. Louis, winning four out of their last seven games in the Gateway City. Overall, Miami is 38-51 at St. Louis, and 70-104 all-time vs. the Cardinals.
- In 10 career games against the Cardinals, Christian Yelich owns a .390 batting average (16x41) with six multi-hit efforts. Also having success against the Cards is Cole Gillespie, who in 10 career games has a .333 average (8x24). Giancarlo Stanton is batting .287 (35x122) vs. St. Louis (34 G), with a .566 slugging percentage (8 hr, 18 rbi).

THIS DAY IN MARLINS HISTORY

JULY 17

Kurt Abbott had six RBI in the 1996 contest against the Astros in which the Marlins won by a score of 11-2. The six RBI is the second highest total in a game in Club history (Adeiny Hechavarria, Greg Colbrunn, Gary Sheffield and Cody Ross each had seven RBI in a game). Abbott went 3x5 and was a double away from hitting for the cycle. No player in Marlins history has hit for a cycle.

Adam Conley is making his 19th start of the season, his 11th away from Marlins Park. He is 3-2, 3.93 (52.2 ip/23 er) in 10 starts on the road, and 3-3, 3.28 (46.2/17) in eight starts in South Florida.

Is making first career start against St. Louis. It will be his fifth start of the year against an NL Central opponent. He has gone 2-1, 2.31 (23.1/6) in those outings, his best ERA against any division and the third lowest among all left-handed pitchers with at least two starts vs. the NL Central this year.

He is 3-1, 3.47 (36.1/14) in his career vs. the NL Central, his best marks against a division aside from the NL East (6-3, 3.23).

Has walked one batter or fewer in three of his last four starts and 16 of his first 29 career starts. That is the second-most such games by a Marlins starting pitcher through 29 career starts, behind Brian Meadows (18). Conley's 10 starts with one-or-fewer walks this season are tied with Wei-Yin Chen for most on the Club. Conley is 5-2, 2.56 (59.2/17) in those starts this year.

Struck out 37 batters across six starts in June, setting a new career high for strikeouts in a month, surpassing 30 in September 2015.

Won his second straight start on July 9 vs. Cincinnati, holding the Reds to two runs on four hits (one home run) with a walk and seven strikeouts. He extended his career-best streak of allowing five hits or fewer to five starts (previous best, three starts, Sept. 16-29, 2015). He is 3-1, 2.43 (29.2/8) during this stretch.

Pitched 6.0 scoreless innings on July 3 against Atlanta at Fort Bragg, N.C., to earn his career-high fifth win, surpassing his total of four wins a year ago, his rookie season. Conley allowed four hits and a walk with two strikeouts.

He tied a career high (third time) with nine strikeouts in 4.1 innings on June 28 at Detroit. He struck out eight batters over his first 4.0 innings before surrendering five runs in the fifth to take the eventual 7-5 loss.

In start on June 12 at Arizona, surrendered career-high 11 hits in 6-0 loss. Allowed all six runs (five earned) with a walk and two strikeouts over 5.0 innings. He had not allowed more than nine hits in any of his previous 23 starts.

After four straight starts with at least seven hits allowed, he returned to early season form on June 1 vs. Pittsburgh, holding Buccos scoreless on two hits and three walks over 6.0 innings, with nine strikeouts. The nine K's tied a career high.

In start on May 22 vs. Washington, suffered third loss after allowing season-high six runs and career-high seven walks (three intentional), the most by a Marlins starting pitcher since Jarred Cosart issued eight on September 26, 2014.

Earned second win of season on May 5 vs. Arizona. Allowed two hits and a walk with six strikeouts in 5.1 innings. Did not allow a hit until the fourth, running hitless innings streak to 11.1. Marked longest such streak by starter in Majors this season, and longest by a starter in Club history. It ranks as second-longest overall, behind Armando Benitez's 14.0 hitless innings from May 4-June 4, 2004.

In addition, he tied the Marlins record for fewest hits allowed (2) in a two-start stretch, equaling accomplishment of Al Leiter in May of 1996.
