FISH BITES

The Marlins conclude a 10-game homestand with the finale of this four-game set against the St. Louis Cardinals today at 1:10 p.m. Miami is starting newly-acquired RHP **Andrew Cashner**, who in 10 career appearances (four starts) against the Red Birds has gone 2-1 with a 1.74 ERA. St. Louis is countering with RHP Carlos Martinez, who in two career starts against the Fish has gone 1-1 with a 5.25 ERA. Today's national anthem will be performed by Michelle Rousseau, and ceremonial first pitches will be thrown by Jim Ball and Todd Wodraska. The first 15,000 fans will receive a Marlins 2016 All-Star Poster courtesy of Franklin Dodd Communications. It is Dental Hygiene Awareness Day at Marlins Park, and the specially priced ticket includes a donation to local dental hygiene organizations. A portion of the proceeds will also support All Star Smiles and other local dental hygiene organizations in South Florida. The Fish have gone 4-5 over their homestand, dropping two of three against the Mets and going 2-1 against Philadelphia. Miami is 9-7 thus far on a 20-game stretch without an off-day to begin the second half.

LAST NIGHT VS. ST. LOUIS

The Marlins tallied 11 runs for the second time in their last four games, downing the St. Louis Cardinals, 11-0. Miami earned its largest shutout win since beating the New York Mets, 13-0, at Citi Field on August 8, 2012. The Fish started strong, tallying four runs in the first, highlighted by **Marcell Ozuna's** two-run home run to left field, his 19th of the season. The Marlins added four more in the fourth, with runs coming home on RBI doubles by **Adeiny Hechavarria** and **Marlín Prado**, as well as an RBI single by **Christian Yelich**. Miami finished its scoring in the sixth when **Chris Johnson** was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded, and **Jeff Mathis** scored two with a single to left. Yelich and Mathis led Miami with three-hit games, while **Dee Gordon** scored three runs from the leadoff spot. **Colin Rea** made his first start for Miami and tossed 3.1 innings before leaving with right elbow soreness; he gave up just one hit and struck out four. **David Phelps** (5-5) entered in relief and earned the win after working 2.2 innings.

TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS

The Marlins today placed RHP **Colin Rea** on the 15-day disabled list (right elbow sprain) and recalled RHP **Nefi Ogando** from Triple-A New Orleans.

UP NEXT

Following this afternoon's tilt, Miami will travel to the Windy City to take on the Chicago Cubs in a three-game set beginning tomorrow night at 8:05 p.m. EDT. This is the second meeting between the clubs this season, as the Fish took three of four from the Cubs in South Florida from June 23-26. The Marlins are 46-47 at the Friendly Confines, and own a slight edge in the all-time series, 92-90.

ELIAS SAYS...

Colin Rea, in his Marlins debut, had to leave after 3.1 innings last night due to elbow soreness, but Miami still managed to rout St. Louis, 11-0. Two other teams in the last 65 years have won games by a shutout margin of more than 10 runs despite getting fewer than 12 outs from their starting pitcher: the Pirates (11-0 vs. Phillies) in 1992 and the Rockies (12-0 at Philadelphia) in 2007. The Marlins matched their largest-ever margin of victory in a home shutout, having also won by 11-0 scores against the Rockies in 1996 and the Devil Rays in 2001. Their largest road shutout was by a margin of 17 runs at Coors Field in 1995.

RETURN OF THE MAC

In his first stint with Miami this season, **Dustin McGowan** went 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (5.1 ip/2 er) and .286 average against (6x21) over six games. Since returning to the Major League Club on May 11, he has posted a 1-1 record and 2.75 ERA (36.0/11) with a .142 average against (17x120). On the season, McGowan ranks seventh among National League relievers in opponents average (.163), behind Boone Logan (.147), Pedro Strop (.147), **Fernando Rodney** (.149), Kenley Jansen (.153), Pedro Baez (.161) and Seung Hwan Oh (.162).

HEATING UP THE HOT CORNER

Over his last 14 games at Marlins Park, **Marlín Prado** has been on fire, batting .490 (24x49) with nine doubles, two home runs and 17 RBI. He has collected at least one hit in 13 of those games, including eight multi-hit affairs. Over that span he has raised his home average from .217 to .286. On the season, Prado leads all qualifying Major League third basemen in average with a .327 mark, ahead of Yunel Escobar (.319).

PRADO'S PROWESS

Marlín Prado ranks fifth in the Majors in batting average, behind Jose Altuve (.358), Daniel Murphy (.351), Wilson Ramos (.331) and Xander Bogaerts (.330). Prado's 36 multi-hit games this season are tied for 14th in the Majors and tied for fifth in the NL, behind Daniel Murphy (41), Jean Segura (38), Carlos Gonzalez (37) and Starling Marte (37). He leads the NL in games with three or more hits (14) and is tied with five others, including teammate **J.T. Realmuto**, for the NL lead in 4+ hit games (3).

BIG FISH SWINGIN' A BIG STICK

Over his last 36 games, **Giancarlo Stanton** has turned his season around, batting .314 (44x140) with 10 home runs, 31 RBI, a .377 on-base percentage and .600 slugging percentage. That is in stark contrast from the previous 29 games that saw him hit .118 with two home runs, five RBI, a .211 OBP and .216 SLG. - Stats LLC

SWEET SWINGIN' LEFTY

Christian Yelich has been putting together his finest season since coming to the Majors, batting .320 with 10 home runs, 57 RBI, a .396 on-base percentage and .490 slugging percentage. His average, HR, RBI, OBP and SLG are all career-bests. He needs two doubles to have 30 in each of the last three seasons and become the sixth Marlins player in Franchise history to have three-or-more consecutive seasons of 30+ doubles. Dating back to June 27, 2015, Yelich has the second-highest average among all Major League hitters at .335, behind Jose Altuve (.345).

HIT SQUAD

Miami leads the National League and ranks second in the Majors with 982 hits, trailing only Boston (1037). The Fish are averaging 9.4 hits a game in 2016, the highest mark in Club history, ahead of the 2007 team that averaged 9.3. The Marlins .272 average as a team again ranks second in MLB to the Red Sox (.288), and would equal 2005 (.272) for the highest single-season team average in Club history.

CLIMBING THE LADDER

Ichiro Suzuki now has a total of 2,998 hits over his MLB career. On June 15 at San Diego, Ichiro unofficially passed Pete Rose's Major League hit record of 4,256 when combining his 1,278 hits with the Orix Blue Wave of Nippon Professional Baseball in Japan. Ichiro is batting .328 (63x192) this season and is two hits away from becoming the 30th player in Major League history to record 3,000 hits and tying Roberto Clemente for 29th on MLB's all-time hit list (Elias). In research provided by Stats LLC, he will become just the second player ever to reach 3,000 hits through his first 16 Major League seasons, following Pete Rose, who recorded 3,164.

Andrew Cashner is making his Miami debut today in the finale of this four-game set against the Cardinals, which wraps up a 10-game homestand for the Fish.

Cashner has faced the Cardinals twice this season, posting a win on April 22 in San Diego (6.0 ip, 3 h, r, er, bb, 4 so, hr) and a no-decision on July 21 in St. Louis (5.2 ip, 3 h, r, er, 8 so).

Of his 10 career appearances against the Cardinals, only the last four have been starts. Went 0-1, 3.68 (7.1 ip/3 er) over six relief appearances from 2010-2012. Did not face Redbirds again until last season, and has gone 2-0, 1.14 (23.2/3) in four starts since then, with .160 average against and 23 strikeouts.

Has pitched to a 21-23 record and 2.92 ERA in 91 career home games (47 starts), compared to a 9-26 record and 4.55 ERA in 99 road games (51 starts).

Has made two career appearances at Marlins Park, both starts, going 0-1, 3.00 (12.0/4). Did not factor in decision on June 30, 2013 (6-2 L, 6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, bb, 3 so), and took a loss on April 5, 2014 (5-0, 6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

In three starts since the All-Star break, he has gone 1-0 with a 2.55 ERA (17.2/5). Has at least six strikeouts in each start (23 total), including a season-high nine on July 15 vs. San Francisco. He followed that performance with eight strikeouts on July 21 against these Cardinals in St. Louis.

Since 2010, his 2.92 home ERA ranks 12th among all pitchers (min. 47 starts).

Has an 8-11 record and 3.31 ERA in 51 career appearances (19 starts) against NL Central competition. As a starter, he is 5-7, 3.17, and in relief, he is 3-4, 3.78.

Overall ERA represents his best against any NL division, ahead of a 3.79 vs. the NL East (41 G/20 GS) and 4.06 vs. NL West (78/46).

Is receiving 4.65 runs of support per 9.0 innings this year, which ranks 40th among 61 qualified NL starters.
