GONE TOO SOON: The Cubs join the rest of Major League Baseball in mourning the loss of Marlins pitcher José Fernández ... we send our deepest condolences to his family and friends, and to the entire Miami Marlins organization.

CUBS PLAY REGULAR SEASON HOME FINALE: The Chicago Cubs, 2016 N.L. Central Division champions, tonight close out their regular season Wrigley Field schedule with the rubber match of a three-game set against the St. Louis Cardinals.

© The Cubs have won a franchise-record tying 56 games at Wrigley Field, done just two other times since the team moved here in 1916 ... Chicago also won 56 games at the Friendly Confines in both 1933 and 1935.

© The last time Chicago won more than 56 games at its home park was in 1910, when the club was 58-19 at the West Side Grounds, the team's home from 1893-1915.

© At 56-24 (.700), the Cubs have the best home record in the majors (Texas is second at .667).

© Following tonight's game, the Cubs close out the regular season with a seven-game trip to Pittsburgh (4 games starting tomorrow) and Cincinnati (3 games beginning Friday).

CURRENT EVENTS: Chicago has clinched at least a tie for the best record in the N.L. for the 20th time in franchise history, but for just the fourth time in the last 70 years (also 1984, 1989 and 2008) ... the Cubs will have home field advantage throughout the N.L. portion of the playoffs.

© At 98-56, the Cubs are 42 games over .500 ... the team reached 43 games over .500 (98-55) for the first time in 81 years since the final day of the 1935 campaign when the team finished 100-54 (46 over).

© Chicago's 98 victories are its most in 71 years since winning 98 games in 1945 ... this is the ninth time in franchise history Chicago has reached at least 98 wins.

© The Cubs aim to reach 99 wins in a season for the first time since winning 100 contests in 1935.

© Chicago has recorded at least 97 wins in consecutive campaigns for the first time since a five-season run over 100 years ago from 1906-10.

ON THE SEASON: At 98-56, the Cubs own the best record in MLB, 6.5 games better than the next closest club (Texas, 92-63).

© The Cubs have gone 46-21 (.687) in their last 67 games starting July 10, also the best record in all of baseball in that span.

FIRST THING FIRST: Including two runs yesterday, the Cubs have plated 107 runs in the first inning this season, third-most in the majors behind just Washington (116) and Boston (112).

ONE-TWO PUNCH: Kyle Hendricks leads the majors with a 2.06 ERA while tonight's starter, Jon Lester, is second with a 2.36 ERA ... the Mets Noah Syndergaard is third at 2.63 ... the last time pitchers from the same team finished with the top two ERAs in the majors was in 2005, when the Astros Roger Clemens (1.87) and Andy Pettitte (2.39) turned the trick.

© Hendricks has allowed three or fewer earned runs in each of his last 21 starts dating to May 22 (1.65 ERA), the longest streak by any big league pitcher this season ... he is the fourth Cubs starting pitcher in the last 30 years to allow three earned runs or fewer in 21-straight starts, joining Jake Arrieta (29, 2015-16), Mike Morgan (27, 1992) and Frank Castillo (23, 1994-95).

© Lester's 18 wins are tied for the N.L. lead with Jake Arrieta and Max Scherzer ... are the most wins by a Cubs lefty in a single season in 53 years since Dick Ellsworth had 22 victories in 1963.

© Lester has allowed two or fewer runs and two or fewer walks in each of his last 10 starts ... according to Elias, just two other Cubs pitchers since 1893 – the year the pitching mound was set to 60'6" – had such a streak ... Mordecai "Three Finger" Brown had an 11-game streak in 1906 and Jake Arrieta had a 10-game streak spanning 2015-16.

40 x 30: Anthony Rizzo this season has a career-high 42 doubles and 31 homers, one shy of his season his set in 2014 ... he's the first left-handed hitter in Cubs history to record 40 doubles and 30 homers in a season, and just the fourth overall ... he joins Rogers Hornsby in 1929, Derrek Lee in 2005 and Alfonso Soriano in 2007.

© Rizzo is just the second left-handed hitter to record multiple 30-homer, 100-RBI seasons in franchise history ... Rizzo, who last season had 31 homers and 101 RBI, joins Billy Williams, who turned the trick three times (1965, 1970 & 1972).

© Rizzo enters tonight's contest tied for sixth in the N.L. with 31 home runs (one shy of his career-high 32 in 2014) while his career-high 105 RBI are second in the Senior Circuit.

WHAT'S IN AN AGE?: With 21 homers and 93 RBI on the season, Addison Russell is just the second Cub to reach the 20-homer mark in his age 22 season or younger – joining Ron Santo (23 homers in age 21 campaign in 1961).

© Russell's 93 RBI are tied with Houston's Carlos Correa for the most by any shortstop this season ... Russell and Correa are the first shortstops to reach 93 RBI in their age 22 or younger season since Troy Tulowitzki did so at age 22 in 2007 with Colorado (99 RBI).

© Russell is the first Cubs shortstop to reach 93 RBI since Ernie Banks logged 117 RBI in 1960 (156 games at shortstop that season).

N.L. CENTRAL CHAMPIONS: Chicago, which appeared in the 2015 postseason as the N.L. Wild Card, will advance to consecutive postseasons for just the fifth time in franchise history ... the club first turned the trick way back in both 1880-82 and 1885-86, and did so again from both 1906-08 and 2007-08.

© The Cubs clinched the division in 146 games, the fewest number of games Chicago has clinched its division in the divisional era (since 1969), as well as the earliest the Cubs have clinched a playoff spot all-time (thanks STATS, Inc.).

CROSSING THE PLATE AT A RAPID RATE: Kris Bryant's 119 runs scored are tied for second-most in the majors, trailing the Angels Mike Trout by one run (120) ... that's seven ahead of the next-closest N.L. player, Colorado's Nolan Arenado (112) ... Bryant's 119 runs scored are the most for any Cub since Derrek Lee scored 120 runs in the 2005 campaign.

© Bryant leads the N.L. and is second in the majors with an 8.2 WAR (Mike Trout leads with a 9.0 mark).

© Bryant's 38 homers this season are tied for second-most in the N.L. and are tied for the most by a Cub since Aramis Ramirez hit 38 in 2006 ... the last Cub with at least 39 homers in a season is Derrek Lee, who belted 46 in 2005.

CLOSE IT OUT: Since joining the Cubs on July 26, Aroldis Chapman's 15 saves are tied for fifth-most in the majors, three behind the Dodgers Kenley Jansen (18) ... the Cubs now have two pitchers with at least 15 saves apiece (Hector Rondon, 18) for the first time since 2009 when Kevin Gregg had 23 saves and Carlos Marmol recorded 15.

2016 Season

Jon tonight makes his 31st start this season ... went 9-2 with a 1.86 ERA (20 ER/96.2 IP) in 14 home starts, all quality efforts ... has a 2.86 ERA (30 ER/94.1 IP) in 16 road starts ... the 1.86 home ERA ranks third in the majors, yet second on the Cubs behind Kyle Hendricks (1.32).

- Ⓞ Has allowed one or zero runs in a career-high seven-straight starts ... he leads the majors with a 1.05 ERA (8 ER/68.2 IP) since July 29 ... has gone 9-0 with a 1.46 ERA (13 ER/80.1 IP) in 12 starts since the All-Star Break.
- Ⓞ His 18 wins are tied for the N.L. lead with teammate Jake Arrieta and Max Scherzer ... is one win shy of tying his career-high of 19 set in 2010.
- Ⓞ Ranks among N.L. leaders in ERA (2.36, 2nd), quality starts (25, 1st), opponents average (.211, 5th), opponents OBP (.266, 4th) and opponents OPS (.599, 4th).
- Ⓞ The Cubs have won 11 of his last 12 starts, including seven-straight from July 18-August 22 ... the seven-straight team wins tied a career-high for Jon.
- Ⓞ Went 3-0 with a 1.71 ERA (6 ER/31.2 IP) in five August starts ... was following a July in which he went 2-1 with a 7.36 ERA (18 ER/22.0 IP) in five outings.
- Ⓞ Finished June with a 4-0 record and a 1.41 ERA (7 ER/44.2 IP) in six starts, his best-career ERA in the month of June ... was named N.L. Pitcher of the Month.
- Ⓞ Limiting righties to a .214 average (113-for-527) and lefties to a .199 mark (32-for-161) ... overall, opponents are hitting just .211 against the lefty.
- Ⓞ Leads the majors with 20 starts with one or fewer earned runs allowed ... no other pitcher has more than 16 such starts.
- Ⓞ Jon leads the majors with a left on base percentage of 85.9 percent according to Fangraphs ... the Royals' Ian Kennedy is second at 84.2 percent.
- Ⓞ Took a no-hitter into the seventh inning against Pittsburgh on May 15 and again against San Francisco on September 2.
- Ⓞ Has tossed two complete games, giving him 14 in his career and three with the Cubs ... allowed four hits and one run June 1 vs. the Dodgers ... allowed three hits and one run September 6 vs. the Giants.

Jon tossed 8.0-scoreless innings September 14 at Busch Stadium ... has quality starts in six of his last seven outings vs. the Cardinals ... is winless in four starts against the Cardinals at Wrigley Field, posting a 3.47 ERA (9 ER/23.1 IP).

Career Notes

- Ⓞ Jon tonight makes his 63rd start with the Cubs ... owns a 145-83 record with a 3.44 ERA (761 ER/1,992.0 IP) in 315 games, all but one as a starter, with Boston (2006-14), Oakland (2014) and the Cubs (2015-16) ... signed a six-year deal with Chicago in December of 2014.
- Ⓞ Joins James Shields and Cole Hamels as the only pitchers to reach 30 starts in each of the last nine seasons.
- Ⓞ Has gone 29-16 with three complete games and a 2.86 ERA (126 ER/396.0 IP) in 62 starts with the Cubs ... has struck out 391 and walked just 95 ... his 4.12 SO/BB ratio ranks third-best all-time in Cubs history and tops among Chicago southpaws (min. 350.0 IP).
- Ⓞ A four-time All-Star (including 2016) and two-time World Series Champion, he has twice finished fourth in A.L. Cy Young Award voting, doing so in 2010 and 2014.
- Ⓞ Has surpassed the 200.0 inning mark four-straight seasons and in seven of the last eight ... has reached 31 starts in a season eight times.
- Ⓞ Fanned 207 batters last season, setting a Cubs single-season franchise record for most strikeouts by a left-handed pitcher.
- Ⓞ He ranks second among active left-handed pitchers with 145 wins, fourth with 1,848 strikeouts and fifth with 8.35 strikeouts per nine innings ... also ranks second with 0.82 home runs per nine innings.
- Ⓞ Was named National League Player of the Week for June 6-12, 2016 after going 2-0 without yielding a run in 15.0 innings pitched.
