**OPENING DAY:** The Mets are set to open their 54th season today...In the history of Major League Baseball, the Mets (34-19, .642) have the best winning percentage on Opening Day...Below is a list of the top records on Opening Day, courtesy of the Elias Sports Bureau.

**OPENING DAY:** After losing their first eight Opening Day contests, the Mets have won 34 of their last 46 Opening Day games...New York took nine straight openers from 1975-1983 to tie a major league record...The Mets have won seven of their last nine openers and are 10-5 in their last 15.

**ON THE ROAD:** The Mets are 14-11 when starting the season on the road...Dating back to 2001, New York has won five of its last seven games when opening the year on the road.

**VS. WASHINGTON:** This is the third time the Mets and Nationals have started the season against each other and the first time in Washington, D.C...New York lost to the Nationals, 9-7, in 10 innings last year at Citi Field on March 31...The Mets beat Washington 3-2 on April 3, 2006 at Shea Stadium...New York faced the Montreal Expos five times on Opening Day, going 4-1...The Mets won in 1971, 1976, 1978 and 1988 and lost in 1969.

**BARTOLO COLON:** Will be making his seventh career Opening Day start after starting on Opening Day with the Indians from 2000-2002 and the Angels from 2004-2006... He will become the oldest (41, 317 days) Mets pitcher to start on Opening Day...Tom Glavine (41, 7 days) held the previous mark when he started in 2007 at St. Louis...The last major league Opening Day starters older than Colon was in 2006 when Jamie Moyer (43, 136 days) started for Seattle on April 3, 2006 at Los Angeles-AL (against Colon) and Randy Johnson (42, 205 days) started for the Yankees on the same day at Oakland...Colon will be the 24th different pitcher to start on Opening Day for the Mets.

**WRIGHT ON:** David Wright is hitting .361 (16-41) with four home runs and 11 RBI on Opening Day...**Wright will make his 11th Opening Day start today, tied for the most in team history with Tom Seaver and Bud Harrelson.**

**EXTRA, EXTRA OPENING DAY:** The Mets have played seven extra-inning games on Opening Day...They are 5-2 in those contests...The last extra-inning affair was last year, a 9-7 loss to the Nationals...The last Mets Opening Day win in extras was a 6-4, 10-inning victory on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta.

**METS-NATIONALS NOTES:** The Mets lost 15 games to the Nationals last year, tied for the most in team history in a single season vs. Montreal/Washington (1979, 3-15)...Over the last three years, the Mets are 15-41 (.366) vs. the Nats.

**LEADOFF HOME RUN:** Kazuo Matsui is the only Met to hit a leadoff home run on Opening Day when he took Atlanta's Russ Ortiz deep on April 6, 2004 at Turner Field.

**GRAND SLAM:** Collin Cowgill and Todd Hundley are the only two Mets to hit a grand slam on Opening Day...Cowgill went deep on April 1, 2013 off San Diego's Brad Brach...Hundley's slam came on April 26, 1995 at Colorado off Billy Swift.

**OPENING O:** The Mets scored a franchise-best 12 runs on Opening Day on April 4, 1994 at Chicago-NL.

**TWO HOME RUNS:** Robin Ventura, Bobby Bonilla, Cleon Jones, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds are the only five players in club history to hit two home runs in an Opening Day tilt...Ventura was the last to accomplish the feat on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta...Bonilla cracked two home runs in his first game as a Met on April 6, 1992 at St. Louis, Jones belted two home runs on April 6, 1975 vs. Philadelphia and Strawberry and McReynolds each hit two home runs on April 4, 1988 at Montreal in a 10-6 triumph.

**OPENING DAY ZEROS:** The Mets have recorded seven shutouts on Opening Day...The last time New York held an opponent scoreless on Opening Day was in 2012 when the Mets blanked the Braves, 1-0...Meanwhile, the Mets have been shut out only once (7-0, April 9, 1963 vs. St. Louis) on Opening Day.

**FOR THE FIRST TIME:** Four Mets are taking part in their first career Opening Day...The list includes: Jacob deGrom, Sean Gilmartin, Rafael Montero and Wilmer Flores...Gilmartin's first appearance will also be his major league debut.

**FINAL SPRING NOTES:** New York's 19 spring wins were the most in the National League and tied for the third-most in team history...The Mets led all ML teams with a .350 on-base percentage and were second with a .463 slugging percentage this spring...New York's .281 batting average was the third-highest in the NL.

**MEANWHILE BACK AT CITI FIELD:** The Mets will open Citi Field for the Mets Opening Day Watch Party today...This first of its kind free event allows Mets fans to watch today's action on SNY on CitiVision's new scoreboard.
